Background/Summary of Proposed Action:

On August 12, 2012 at 10:00 a.m. the Department of Purchases and Supplies held a prebid meeting in regard to the Third Avenue Pumping Station modifications. All potential bidders were invited to the pre-bid meeting, which included a detailed review of the scope of services, question and answer session, as well as a walk through of the affected work area. Three bids were received, but only two meet the specifications.

The Enviro-Care bid did not meet the specifications for the following reasons. Their compactor did not have a grinder and could not meet the required solids volume reduction. Their barscreen has no removable teeth on the buckets as required and they did not provide detailed information on how to tension the chains as requested. This equipment would not perform adequately for the intended purpose.

The Barscreen and compactor equipment is needed at the Third Ave pumping station to allow WPC to automate the station. The equipment is necessary to enable WPC to reliably monitor and control the barscreen from its Beecher Road location. Current equipment is old, obsolete, and does not perform adequately without manned operation. Cost savings will result by not having personnel on second and third shift.
