Background/Summary of Proposed Action:

WPC relies on the final clarifier units to collect the activated sludge in each of its eight (8) final clarifiers. The clarifiers are essential to the secondary treatment process as they collect settled sludge and convey it to a well to be returned to the process or wasted to the sludge storage tanks.

The current units are old, obsolete and subject to catastrophic mechanical failure. WPC must have reliable clarifier units to ensure that the secondary treatment process continues to operate. Without replacement drives WPC would no longer be able to provide adequate sewage treatment, resulting in possible fines and penalties for permit violations, and increased operational and maintenance costs.
