The Community Challenge Award was granted to the City of Flint with a commitment to receive \$1,369,904 in matching funds. Local stakeholders have committed to matching the grant funds with \$686,624 of in-kind support and \$683,280 in cash resources; and

On March 27, 2012, the City of Flint submitted a two year grant request in the amount of \$499,477 to the Charles Stewart Mott Foundation to support the development of the Master Plan; and

On May 17, 2012, the City received notification of a \$263,804 grant award for the first year of the Community Challenge Planning Grant with the understanding that a renewal grant proposal in the amount of \$235,673 would be submitted in the second year including adding \$30,000 to pay for engineering and architectural plans of potential improvements to South Saginaw Street; and

The City has expended \$263,804 over the first year for the development of the Master Plan; and

The City of Flint plans to apply to the foundation during the current funding cycle requesting general support in the second year based on our original grant proposal for support of the planning process; and

IT IS RESOLVED that the appropriate City of Flint officials are hereby authorized to do all things necessary to submit an amended grant application to the Charles Stewart Mott Foundation in the amount of \$265,673 for general support of the comprehensive Master Plan, Capital Improvement Plan, and Zoning Code including \$30,000 for an engineering and architectural plans of potential improvements to South Saginaw Street.
