The City provided ESG administration funds in the amount of \$6,706.65 and project delivery funds in the amount of \$4,293.35 to Metro Community Development; and

The City later learned that, for ESG, project delivery cannot be used in the same way it is used in CDBG. It is appropriate to change the source of funds for Metro Community Development's administration from ESG project delivery to CDBG administration; and

CDBG funds are available for reprogramming in CDBG administration revenue and expense 274-748.100-801.000 and 274-748.100-502.748 (FHUD14CDBG); and

The project delivery portion of Metro Community Development's ESG administrative grant (\$4,293.35) will be moved to the Uncommitted account, 274-750.102-502.750 and 274-750.102-700.100 (FESGPRIOR).

Background/Summary of Proposed Action:

Resolution EME0242013 authorized the City of Flint to enter into a contract (13-151) in the amount of \$11,000.00 with Metro Community Development to administer Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) activities on behalf of the City of Flint. The City provided ESG administration funds in the amount of \$6,706.65 and project delivery funds in the amount of \$4,293.35 to Metro Community Development.

The City later learned that, for ESG, project delivery cannot be used in the same way it is used in CDBG. However, the City does have available CDBG administration funds, and in consultation with our technical assistance providers have determined that it would be appropriate to change the source of funds for Metro Community Development's administration from ESG project delivery to CDBG administration. This resolution authorizes changing the portion of the source of funds from project delivery (\$4,293.35) to CDBG admin, and moving the program funds to the ESG Uncommitted account to make them available for reprogramming.
