Background/Summary of Proposed Action:

On September 24, 2014, the Emergency Manager adopted resolution no. EME5202014 authorizing the City of Flint to enter into an agreement with the Genesee County Land Bank in an amount not to exceed \$363,000 for the demolition of commercial and residential structures.

The program is designed to help create suitable living environments for nearby residents as well as support the sustainability of these neighborhoods by removing blight and hazards. Removal of blight will increase property values, lessen vandalism, decrease arson, gang and drug activity, and instances of other criminal activity such as vagrancy, prostitution and squatting.

The Planning and Development Department – Demolition Division has requested an extension of the contract term until October 31, 2015. The extension will be necessary for all remaining grant funds to be used and the projects goals to be achieved.

This funding will be made available through Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) FCDBGPRIOR and FHUD14CDBG.
