Attorney Robbins reported that Judge Farah issued his decision regarding participation of Mary Bland and Denise Bingaman in the hearings. For the Sheila Burns lawsuit, Judge Farah ordered that Denise Bingaman and Mary Bland cannot participate as decision makers in the hearing; however, Doug Bingaman can participate. In the William O. Kelly lawsuit, the Judge ordered that Denise Bingaman cannot participate as a decision maker. Based on Attorney Robbins' conversations with Attorney Gibbs, the hearings will likely be scheduled in the fall. Discussion followed

22. PROFESSIONAL SERVICES COMMITTEE

Robert Erlenbeck reported that the Committee met and discussed the following:

♦ Cost Saving Measures

- Pension Advice Mailing 505 retirees have signed up to discontinue receiving advice statements (532 statements no longer being mailed). Another mailing will be sent in early fall.
- O Debit Cards, Direct Deposit, etc. (copy of flyer from US Bank regarding Pay Cards for City employees in agenda packets) Denise Bingaman reported that, currently, less than 200 retirees receive checks; all of them are of social security age, which means they are already receiving a direct deposit payment, as opposed to a check, from the Social Security Administration. The City is requiring all active employees to sign up for either direct deposit or bank cards and access their pay statements online only, effective July 14. Some retirees have asked to have the pay cards available to them also. Discussion followed.

A motion was made by Mark Stratman, supported by Robert Erlenbeck, that new retirees as of January 1, 2012, must sign up for Direct Deposit or Pay Cards. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Mary Bland, supported by Robert Erlenbeck, to offer the pay cards to all retirees as a payment option. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Mark Stratman, supported by Michael Townsend, that as of January 1, 2012 all new retirees will not receive advice statements in the mail (available online). Motion carried unanimously.

Voluntary pension payroll deductions & costs to administer
 Employee Club, AFLAC, Fire Fund, POL Benefit, URGE, Hurley, City

The Professional Services Committee is recommending that a charge for each voluntary deduction be billed to the organization to whom the deduction is being paid, since this is a service being provided by the Retirement System to those organizations and the retirees. It would be each organization's decision how they deal with that fee, whether absorbing it or passing the charge along to the retirees. The Committee recommends a \$.20 charge per voluntary deduction per month be made in order to offset the administrative costs to the System of providing this service. Discussion.

A motion was made by Bryan Bond, supported by Michael Townsend, to charge a \$.20 voluntary deduction transaction fee to all organizations for whom deductions are made - Employee Club, AFLAC, Fire Fund, Police Benefit Fund, City of Flint, Hurley Medical Center, URGE, etc. - to become effective January 1, 2012. During discussion, it was noted that 2309 deductions are currently being processed each month.

 disabled and should be denied a non-duty disability retirement pension. The
