ORDER No. 31

WATER AND SEWER RATE INCREASES

BY THE POWER AND AUTHORITY VESTED IN THE EMERGENCY MANAGER ("EMERGENCY MANAGER) FOR THE CITY OF FLINT, MICHIGAN ("CITY") PURSUANT TO MICHIGAN'S PUBLIC ACT 4 OF 2011, THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND SCHOOL DISTRICT FISCAL ACCOUNTABILITY ACT, ("PA 4"); MICHAEL BROWN, THE EMERGENCY MANAGER, ISSUES THE FOLLOWING ORDER:

On March 16, 2011, the Local Government and School District Fiscal Accountability Act, Public Act 4 of 2011, ("Public Act 4") was enacted to safeguard and assure the fiscal accountability of units of local government; to preserve the capacity of units of local government to provide or cause to be provided necessary services essential to the public health, safety and welfare of citizens; and

Governor Rick Snyder appointed Michael Brown as the Emergency Manager for the City of Flint on November 28, 2011, and his contract was approved by the State Treasurer on November 29, 2011; and

Pursuant to Public Act 4, the Emergency Manager has broad powers in receivership to rectify the financial emergency and to assure the fiscal accountability of the City of Flint and its capacity to provide or cause to be provided necessary services essential to the public health, safety and welfare; and

Pursuant to Public Act 4, the Emergency Manager acts in place of local officials, specifically the Mayor and City Council, unless the Emergency Manager delegates specific authority; and

Pursuant to Public Act 4, the Emergency Manager may take any action or exercise any power or authority of any officer, employee, department, board, commission, other similar entity of local government, whether elected or appointed, relating to the operation of local government.

Under state law the City has an obligation to set water and sewer rates that are sufficient to cover the costs of operating the water and sewer systems. See MCL 141.121.

The City of Flint determined that it was necessary to raise water and sewer rates, effective September 16, 2011, to adequately cover the system costs and comply with state law. And because the September 16, 2011 rate increases are insufficient to cover the costs of operating the water and sewer systems and pay outstanding bonded indebtedness on the water system, it is necessary to raise rates again, effective July 1, 2012.

Both the September 16, 2011 rates increases and the July 1, 2012 rate increases are necessary to comply with state law. Without the rate increases, the City would run a deficit in both the water and sewer funds.

It is hereby ordered:

The September 16, 2011 rate increases are expressly ratified and confirmed as of September 16, 2011

Water and sewer rates are revised, effective July 1, 2012, as shown on the attached rate schedules.

Any local ordinance or regulation that is inconsistent with or limits the City's ability to comply with its obligation under state law to charge water and sewer rates that cover the costs of operating the systems and pay bonded debt are invalid, effective September 16, 2011.

This Order shall have immediate effect and is for immediate publication.

This Order may be amended, modified, repealed or terminated by any subsequent order issued by the Emergency Manager.
