 Approval/Obsolete Property Rehabilitation District/Lapeer Road and Averill Avenue

Resolution resolving that the legally described parcels of land situated within the City of Flint, Genesee County, and State of Michigan, be and are hereby established as an Obsolete Property Rehabilitation District (3501 Lapeer Road Area District) pursuant to the provision of the Public Act 146 of 2000, as amended. [NOTE: The district encompasses properties located at 3501 Lapeer Road, 3711 Lapeer Road and 1620 Averill Avenue.]

150863 SAW Grant Agreement/City of Flint/Michigan Finance Authority (MFA)/Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ)/Strategic Water Quality Initiatives Grant Program

> Resolution resolving that the City Administrator, a position currently held by Natasha L. Henderson, is designated as the Authorized Representative for purposes of the SAW Grant Agreement, AND, the proposed form of the SAW Grant Agreement between the City of Flint, the MFA and the DEQ is hereby approved and the Authorized Representative is authorized and directed to execute the SAW Grant Agreement with such revisions as are permitted by law and agreed to by the Authorized Representative, AND, the City of Flint shall repay the Grant, within ninety (90) days of being informed to do so, with interest at a rate NOT-TO-EXCEED eight (8) percent per year, to the Authority, if the City of Flint is unable to, or decides not to, proceed with contructing the project or implementing the asset management program for which the funding is provided within three (3) years of the Grant award, AND, the Grant, if repayable, shall be a first budget obligation for the City of Flint and the City of Flint is required, if necessary, to levy ad valorem taxes on all taxable property in the City for the payment thereof, subject to applicable constitutional. statutory and local tax rate limitations, AND, the City of Flint shall not invest, reinvest or accumulate any moneys deemed to be Grant funds, nor shall it use Grant funds for the general local government administration activities or activities performed by municipal employees that are unrelated to the project. AND, the Authorized Representative is hereby jointly or severally authorized to take any actions necessary to comply with the requirements of the MFA and the DEQ in connection with the issuance of the Grant. The Authorized Representative is hereby jointly or severally authorized to execute and deliver such other contracts, certificates, documents, instruments, applications and other papers as may be required by the MFA or the DEQ or as may be otherwise necessary to effect the approval and delivery of the Grant, AND, the City of Flint acknowledges that the SAW Grant Agreement is a contract between the City, the MFA and the DEQ, AND, all resolutions and parts of resolutions insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this resolution are rescinded. [NOTE: Part 52 of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, as amended, provides that the MFA, in consultation with the DEQ, shall establish a strategic water quality initiatives grant program to provide grants to municipalities for sewage collection and treatment systems or storm water or non-point source pollution control. The City of Flint is requesting \$2,000,000.00 to establish an asset management plan.] [NOTE: Agreement is not attached.]

150864 Contract/City of Flint/County of Genesee/Flint Holding Facility Operation

Resolution resolving that the City Administrator authorizes the appropriate city officials to do all things necessary to enter into the attached agreement with Genesee County for operation of the Flint Holding Facility. [NOTE: The City of Flint Police Department includes a 110-person holding facility with the ability to hold detainees for up to 72 hours. The Genesee County Sheriff currently operates the holding facility. The city and the sheriff have agreed to the terms of a contract for the sheriff to continue operating the facility for a contract price NOT-TO-EXCEED \$2,764,275.00. The agreement is contingent on the city receiving funding from the State of Michigan to pay the full costs of the contract and the Sheriff receiving a continued waiver from the Michigan Department of Corrections.] [NOTE: Agreement is attached.]

150872 Budget Amendment/Water and Sewer Budget/Switch Back to Detroit Water and Sewerage Department (DWSD) Water Supply

Resolution resolving that the Finance Department is authorized to process a budget amendment to the appropriate Water and Sewer funds to facilitate the switch back to the Detroit water system as soon as practicable, with specific revenue and expenditure line items to be provided by the Chief Financial Officer. [NOTE: The State of Michigan and C.S. Mott Foundation have committed \$6 million and \$4 million dollars respectively to assist the City with the cost of purchasing water from the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department (DWSD) and its successor, the Great Lakes Water Authority (GLWA), until the City is able to received water from the Karegnondi Water Authority (KWA). At

this time the KWA reports that construction is on schedule to be completed by June 30, 2015 [2016]. The City estimates the total cost to purchase water through DWSD will be \$12 million for nine months. The balance of \$2 million not covered by the pledges of State and Local resources is the responsibility of the City. A budget amendment is necessary to reflect both an increase in revenues for the receipt of \$10 million in assistance and \$2 million of budgeted Use of Fund Balance, and an increase in expenditures of \$12 million for the purchase of DWSD water supply.]
