SPECIAL PUBLIC NOTICE - FLINT CITY COUNCIL ELECTRONIC PUBLIC MEETING

On Tuesday, March 10, 2020, Governor Whitmer declared a State of Emergency after two individuals were confirmed testing presumptively positive for COVID-19. On Thursday, March 12, 2020, Mayor Neeley declared a local State of Emergency to exist in the City of Flint as a result of the threat of COVID-19. On Sunday, March 15, 2020, effective March 17, 2020, Mayor Neeley, based on the COVID-19 public health threat, closed City Hall to the public. [At the time that this notice was posted] Michigan [had] 549 confirmed COVID-19 cases. Based on the White House guidelines issued on March 16, 2020, it is recommended that, over the next 15 days, people not gather in groups larger than 10 in order to "flatten" the curve and slow the spread of the virus. Based on our conversation, we are submitting a proposal to audit the financial statements of the City of Flint for the year ended June 30, 2019, with an alternative three-year option for the years ending June 30, 2019-2021. Our audit will be conducted in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America; the standards for financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States; the Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996; and the provisions of the Uniform Guidance. In addition, we will assist the City in preparing its Comprehensive Annual Financial Report. Our audit will encompass the City and its related component units (DDA and EDC) as well as federal award compliance (Single Audit).

We understand the City has had significant turnover in the finance department with several positions yet to be filled. Our proposal assumes that the City will have an appropriate level of staff, either City employees or supplemental employees provided by outside contractors, to provide the necessary resources to have the audit completed in a timely manner and that we will receive a reasonably adjusted trial balance with all accounts reconciled and supported by appropriate documentation.

Given the substantial time and effort associated with a first-year engagement with new auditors, we are offering either a one-year contract option or a three-year contract option, which would provide cost savings to the City by amortizing those one-time costs over several years. For context, the Government Finance Officers Association has issued a best practice, Audit Procurement, that states, "governmental entities should enter into multi-year agreements of at least five years in duration when obtaining the services of independent auditors".

- Option 1 a one-year contract for the year ended June 30, 2019, the estimated fee would be \$225,000 plus out of pocket expenses.
- Option 2 a three-year option for the years ended June 30, 2019-2021, the fees would be as follows plus out of pocket expenses:

Due to the significant turnover in the City's finance department and how short-staffed the City finance department is and has been throughout the year, we anticipate the 2019 audit to be a challenge. Based on this, the fees quoted include an investment of up to 825 hours to complete the audit, issue the required reports, and communicate with those charged with governance. If for any reason the actual hours incurred exceed this amount, the additional hours will be billed at a blended hourly rate of \$225.

The quoted fees are based on professional standards effective as of the date of this proposal. The fees quoted may be subject to renegotiation if significant changes in professional standards or reporting requirements make our initial estimate of hours to complete the audit unrealistic. If any such changes occur, we will discuss the reasons with the City and arrive at a new fee arrangement prior to incurring any additional charges.

This proposal is based on the following required factors:

- Once we have entered into a contract, we will meet with the City and develop a
 mutually agreed upon milestone timeline for the entire audit process that will allow for
 issuance of the City's reports no later than December 23 of each year of the contract.
- Once this timeline is set, if the City is not able to meet certain milestones in the agreed upon timeframe and the audit cannot be issued by December 23 of each year, then the audit will not be completed and issued until subsequent to December 31 (i.e., it is understood that Rehmann staff will be unavailable during the holidays).
- The City will provide reasonably adjusted trial balances, schedule of expenditures of federal awards, general ledger detail and substantially all supporting documentation one week before the agreed upon fieldwork date.
- The City staff (and outside contractors) will be responsive to all audit requests and provide necessary information in a timely manner.

In accordance with professional standards, this proposal is subject to successful completion of engagement acceptance procedures.



Background/Summary of Proposed Action:

The Maintenance Division would like to amend FY20 budget to cover shortages in wages and fringes. When the budget was approved, the position of landscape gardener had been removed from the budget by the Finance department. Since the employee in that position has a disability HR directed DPW to not to lay him off. He wasn't laid off as was planned in the budgeting process. Once the previous HR director left, DPW was able to move forward with the plan of laying off that employee. In that time frame he worked approximately 7 months of the fiscal year without any funding for his position and we are now attempting to correct this issue. Said employee was transferred to the Water Pollution Control Facility as a laborer.

The other reason is the Maintenance clerical support did not have the proper percentage of wages budgeted to maintenance. The clerical support position was working part of the time doing purchasing work and was being charged to purchasing. When purchasing decided they no longer wanted her services, the allocation percentages were never corrected. Maintenance was never budgeted for the higher amount. This budget amendment is attempting to correct this issue as well.

In order for the Facilities Maintenance budget to be corrected, monies must be taken from fund balance and transferred to the following wage and fringes accounts: 101-753.200-702.000 (\$31,184.20), 101-753.200-719.100 (\$2,823.57), 101-753.200-719.200 (\$1,083.24), 101-753.200-719.150 (\$11,269.00)

<u>Financial Implications</u>: Amending the Facilities Maintenance Budget in the amount of \$43,360.01 by moving said funds from Fund Balance into the appropriate wage and fringe accounts.
