THE ANNUAL SERVICE CHARGE FOR THE CLASS OF PERSONS OF LOW AND MODERATE INCOME SHALL BE EQUAL TO SIX PERCENT (6%) OF THE ANNUAL RENTS, SHELTER EXCLUSIVE OF CHARGES FOR GAS, ELECTRICITY, HEAT, OR OTHER UTILITIES FURNISHED TO THE OCCUPANTS, INCLUDING THE PORTION OF RENT PAYABLE UNDER ANY **GOVERNMENTAL** SUBSIDY. NOTWITHSTANDING THE FOREGOING. THE ANNUAL SERVICE CHARGE SHALL NOT EXCEED AD VALOREM PROPERTY TAXES THAT WOULD BE ASSESSED OR PAID ABSENT THIS TAX EXEMPTION.

ORDINANCE NO.

An ordinance to amend the Code of the City of Flint by amending Chapter 18, Taxation; Funds; Purchasing; Article I, In General; Section 18-4.1, Service Charge in Lieu of Taxes for Housing Facilities for Certain Persons.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF FLINT:

Sec. 1. That the provisions of Chapter 18, Taxation; Funds; Purchasing; Article I, In General; Section 18-4.1, Service Charge in Lieu of Taxes for Housing Facilities for Certain Persons, shall be amended by adding subsection (AA), which shall read in its entirety as follows:

(AA) THE CITY ACKNOWLEDGES THAT BRINSHORE DEVELOPMENT, LLC. AND THE NORTH FLINT **REINVESTMENT CORPORATION (THE** "SPONSORS") HAVE OFFERED, SUBJECT TO RECEIPT OF AN AUTHORITY-AIDED OR FEDERALLY-AIDED MORTGAGE LOAN AND/OR ALLOCATION OF LOW INCOME HOUSING TAX CREDITS FROM THE MICHIGAN STATE HOUSING AND DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY ("MSHDA"), TO OWN AND OPERATE A HOUSING PROJECT IDENTIFIED AS "EAGLE'S NEST LANDING" (THE "PROJECT") ON CERTAIN PROPERTY LOCATED IN THE CITY TO SERVE PERSONS AND FAMILIES OF LOW INCOME, AND THAT THE SPONSOR HAS OFFERED TO PAY THE CITY ON ACCOUNT OF THIS HOUSING DEVELOPMENT AN ANNUAL SERVICE CHARGE FOR PUBLIC SERVICES IN LIEU OF AD VALOREM TAXES.

THE CITY ACKNOWLEDGES THAT THE SPONSOR SHALL BE AFFORDED TAX BENEFITS OF PAYING A SERVICE CHARGE

IN LIEU OF AD VALOREM TAXES (BUT NOT IN LIEU OF PAYMENT OF SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, THE STREET LIGHTING SPECIAL ASSESSMENT). THE CITY FURTHER ACKNOWLEDGES THAT THE SPONSOR FITS WITHIN THE CLASS AS DESCRIBED IN §18-4.3 BELOW. THE ANNUAL SERVICE CHARGE FOR THE CLASS OF PERSONS OF LOW AND MODERATE INCOME SHALL BE EQUAL TO FOUR PERCENT (4%) OF THE ANNUAL SHELTER RENTS, **EXCLUSIVE** OF CHARGES FOR GAS, ELECTRICITY, HEAT, OR OTHER UTILITIES FURNISHED TO THE OCCUPANTS, INCLUDING THE PORTION PAYABLE OF RENT **UNDER** ANY **GOVERNMENTAL** SUBSIDY. NOTWITHSTANDING THE FOREGOING, THE ANNUAL SERVICE CHARGE SHALL NOT EXCEED AD VALOREM PROPERTY TAXES THAT WOULD BE ASSESSED OR PAID ABSENT THIS TAX EXEMPTION.
