FLINT CITY COUNCIL ELECTRONIC PUBLIC MEETING

On Friday, October 5, 2020, the Michigan Supreme Court (MSC) issued an order declaring the Emergency Powers of Governor (EPG) Act as an unconstitutional delegation of legislative authority, which was the primary authority relied on by Governor Whitmer for her COVID-19 related executive orders. Subsequently, Governor Whitmer requested that he MSC clarify that their order does not go into effect until October 30, 2020. On Monday October 12, 2020, the Michigan Supreme Court rejected Governor Whitmer's request to delay the effect of its decision to strike down the EPG. On Tuesday, October 13, 2020, Senate Bill 1108 passed, amending the Open Meetings Act to allow municipalities to hold electronic meetings before January 1, 2021 and retroactive to March 18, 2020. On Friday, October 16, 2020, Governor Whitmer signed into law Senate Bill 1108 amending the Open Meetings Act. Therefore, pursuant to the amended Open Meetings Act, the following meeting is scheduled electronically:

The Food Bank of Eastern Michigan and City of Flint Brennan Park Agreement

This agreement (hereinafter "Agreement") by and between the City of Flint, a Michigan Municipal Corporation, 1101 S. Saginaw Street, Flint, MI 48502, (hereinafter the "City"), and The Food Bank of Eastern Michigan, hereinafter referred to as "Contractor."

Whereas, the City and the Contractor entered into an agreement on August 8, 2012, for the Contractor to utilize a section of Brennan Park for a parking lot and upgrades to the park ("City Property"),

Whereas, the City and the Contractor agree to extend the August 8, 2012, Agreement for seven (7) years.

- 1. Authorization to Use. In consideration of Contractor's payment of one US dollar (\$1.00) and Contractor's performance of its obligations under this Agreement the City confers to Contractor a revocable, persona, and non-possessory license to utilize a section of Brennan Park for a parking lot and upgrades to the park ("City Property"), subject to the terms, conditions, and restrictions set forth below. This Agreement does not constitute a grant of any ownership interest in the City Property to Contractor.
- Contractor Obligations. Contractor will mow the park grounds every 7-10 days during the growing season and every 10-14 days during non-growing months with equipment provided by Contractor.
- 3. Terms of Use. The use shall be for seven years from the execution date of this agreement. Contractor shall have the option to renew this agreement twice with the same terms as the current agreement. Contractor shall renew by submitting a letter to the Mayor of the City of Flint indicating its intention to renew 30 days before the termination of the agreement.
- 4. Permitted Use. Contractor shall use the City Property to construct a parking lot and may park its vehicles and may use the lot for other Food Bank activities. The lot shall be open to Contractor and the public for use of Brennan Park at all times.
- Restrictions on Use. Contractor shall not use, and Contractor shall prohibit any of its Agents from using the City Property for any activities other than the Permitted Uses. Contractor also shall not allow any commercial use of the parking lot.
- 6. Subject to City Uses. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Agreement, Contractor's right to use the City Property hereunder shall be subject and subordinate to City's necessary uses of the City Property for municipal purposes including public recreation.

- 15. Non-Assignability: Contractor shall not assign or transfer any interest in this contract without the prior written consent of the City provided, however, that claims for money due or to become due to Contractor from the City under this contract may be assigned to a bank, trust company, or other financial institution without such approval. Notice of any such assignment or transfer shall be furnished promptly to the City.
- 16. Non-Disclosure/Confidentiality: Contractor agrees that Contractor will not disclose any such information provided to Contractor in furtherance of this Agreement, or in any other way make such documents public, without the express written approval of the City or the order of a court of competent jurisdiction.
- 17. Non-Discrimination: The Contractor shall comply with the Elliott Larsen Civil Rights Act, 1976 PA 453, as amended, MCL 37.2101 et seq., the Persons with Disabilities Civil Rights Act, 1976 PA 220, as amended, MCL 37.1101 et seq., and all other federal, state, and local fair employment practices and equal opportunity laws and covenants that it
 - conditions, or privileges of employment, or any matter directly or indirectly related to employment, because of his or her race, religion, color, national origin, age, sex, height, weight, marital status, association with the federal government, or physical or mental disability that is unrelated to the individual's ability to perform the duties of a particular job or position or status with respect to public assistance. A breach of this covenant is a material breach of this Agreement.
- 18. Ethics: Pursuant to the Flint City Charter § 1-602 (I) entitled Notice, every public servant, volunteer and city, contractor is to receive training and be provided with a copy of these ethical standards upon passage of this Charter or at the time of appointment and or hire or the commencement of services. Therefore, Contractor acknowledges receipt of Flint City Charter §1-602 and agrees that Contractor and its staff shall abide by the terms and participate in any training provided by the City/or update orientation as may be necessary from time to time (See Attached Flint City Charter §1-602). Public servants are all persons employed or otherwise engaged by the corporation of the City of Flint to conduct business on its behalf including but not limited to elected officials, appointed employees, members of boards and commissions, classified employees, contractual employees, and volunteers, in accordance with Flint City Charter §1-602.
- 19. Notices: Notices to the City of Flint shall be deemed sufficient if in writing and mailed, postage prepaid, addressed to Clyde Edwards, City Administrator, City of Flint, 1101 S. Saginaw Street, Flint, Michigan 48502, or to such other address as may be designated in writing by the City from time to time. Notices to Contractor shall be deemed sufficient if in writing and mailed, postage prepaid, addressed to Kara Ross, President and CEO, Food

Bank of Eastern Michigan, 2300 Lapeer Road, Flint, MI 48503, or to such other address as may be designated in writing by Contractor from time to time.

20. Whole Agreement. This Agreement and the documents cited herein embody the entire agreement between the parties. Any additions, deletions or modifications hereto must be in writing and signed by both parties. This Agreement may be executed by facsimile and in counterparts, all of which, taken together, shall constitute a single agreement.
