PUBLIC NOTICE FLINT CITY COUNCIL ELECTRONIC PUBLIC MEETING

On Friday, October 5, 2020, the Michigan Supreme Court (MSC) issued an order declaring that the Emergency Powers of Governor (EPG) Act as an unconstitutional delegation of legislative authority, which was the primary authority relied on by Governor Whitmer for her COVID-19 related executive orders. Subsequently, Governor Whitmer requested that the MSC clarify that their order does not go into effect until October 30, 2020. On Monday October 12, 2020, the Michigan Supreme Court rejected Governor Whitmer's request to delay the effect of its decision to strike down the EPG. On, Tuesday, October 13, 2020, Senate Bill 1108 passed, amending the Open Meetings Act to allow municipalities to hold electronic meetings. On Friday, October 16, 2020, Governor Whitmer signed into law Senate Bill 1108 amending the Open Meetings Act. Subsequently, on December 22, 2020, Public Act 267 of 1976 was amended through Senate Bill 1246 extending the electronic meetings with no reason through March 31, 2021. The act also allows that after March 31, 2021, electronic meetings may be held if a local state of emergency was declared. On March 23, 2020, the Flint City Council extended Mayor Neeley's declaration of emergency indefinitely due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Therefore, the following meeting will be held electronically:

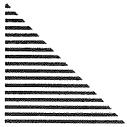

Crime Stoppers collaborates with Flint Police Department for Hamilton Community Health Network's North Flint Illuminating Community Change Safety Project

April 16, 2020, Fiint, MI —Crime Stoppers of Flint & Genesee County was awarded a grant from Hamilton Community Health Network (HCHN) for a Geo-Fencing Community Policing Project for the North Flint Illuminating Community Change (IC2) Safety Project. This initiative is in collaboration with the City of Flint Police Department.

Crime Stoppers will provide residents an avenue for community policing by utilizing the innovative technology of geofencing and program awareness via a biliboard at W. Pierson Road and Clic Road in the efforts to prevent and solve crime in the targeted area for the HCHN IC2 Safety Project. Geo-fencing is described here: OUTFRONT Media's Mobile Network is used by placing an ad on a mobile device within a specific geo-targeted area. The ad appears when an Individual is on one of the 100,000 apps used daily. The geo-fenced area will target a two-mile radius of the billboard.

The Mobile Network will inform the community on how the Crime Stoppers program works and of unsolved crimes in the targeted area. In addition to geo-fencing, a biliboard highlighting "WORKING TOGETHER FOR A SAFER FLINT/YOUR VOICE MATTERS" will be posted at W. Pierson Road and Clio Road.

The project is scheduled to run through October 31, 2020. OUTFRONT Media reports there will be over 107,000 impressions, or eyes-on, the biliboard per week and 937,000 impressions via geo-fencing during the entire project time period.

With this project, the community will have direct input in crime prevention while remaining anonymous. It will help build trust between the residents and law enforcement when they see that the police are following up on information given to them through Crime Stoppers.

"During this difficult time with COVID-19, we want the community to know we are still working diligently to process tips 24/7 and the community is able to help keep their neighborhoods safe and reduce crime by reporting anonymously," said Julie Lopez, Director of Crime Stoppers of Flint and Genesee County. "We are working closely with Flint Police Department to follow up on information submitted by tipsters."

City of Flint Police Chief, Phil Hart states, "The relationship between Crime Stoppers and the Flint Police Department is a key ingredient in officers receiving the information necessary to further the investigation or even solve a case without fear of exposure by those supplying the tips. We are looking forward to the addition of the geo-fencing piece, as we are hoping for an increase in the number of tips and the time in which they are submitted. The close working relationship between Crime Stoppers and the Flint Police Department will only be enhanced with this new aspect of anonymous tip submission."

Here is how geo-fencing works:

If a person is on their mobile device in the targeted area and on an app or website connected to OUTFRONT Media, they will see a banner ad within the app at the bottom of their device. The ad reads, "100% ANONYMOUS and North Flint IC2 Safety Project".
