April 21, 2021

On Friday, October 5, 2020, the Michigan Supreme Court (MSC) issued an order declaring that the Emergency Powers of Governor (EPG) Act as an unconstitutional delegation of legislative authority, which was the primary authority relied on by Governor Whitmer for her COVID-19 related executive orders. Subsequently, Governor Whitmer requested that the MSC clarify that their order does not go into effect until October 30, 2020. On Monday October 12, 2020, the Michigan Supreme Court rejected Governor Whitmer's request to delay the effect of its decision to strike down the EPG. On, Tuesday, October 13. 2020, Senate Bill 1108 passed, amending the Open Meetings Act to allow municipalities to hold electronic meetings. On Friday, October 16, 2020, Governor Whitmer signed into law Senate Bill 1108 amending the Open Meetings Act. Subsequently, on December 22, 2020 Public Act 267 of 1976 was amended through Senate Bill 1246 extending the electronic meetings with no reason through March 31, 2021. The act also allows that after March 31, 2021 electronic meetings may be held if a local state of emergency was declared. On March 23, 2020, the Flint City Council extended Mayor Neeley's declaration of emergency indefinitely due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Therefore, this meeting will be held electronically. Pursuant to Act 267 of the Public Acts of 1976 Open Meetings Act as amended and Flint City Charter Section 3-202, notice is hereby given that the Flint City Council hereby calls for a Regular Meeting of the Flint City Council scheduled to be held as follows:

In December 2017, the City of Flint entered into a Master Agreement where among one of the conditions, Flint would establish a Secondary Water Source on North Dort Highway at Frances Road (herein "Property") with the Genesee County Drain Commission (herein "GCDC") and the Great Lakes Water Authority (herein "GLWA").

For this project, the City has granted overlapping easements on the Property to GCDC and GLWA. 

Whereas, the City of Flint, a Municipal Corporation, whose address is 1101 S. Saginaw Street, Flint, Michigan 48502, hereinafter called the ("City" or "Flint) does own land situated in the County of Genesee, Michigan bearing the following Tax Parcel No. and Legal Description:

Tax Parcel No. 11-06-200-037

Legal Description: All that part of the Northeast 1/4 of the Northeast 1/4 of Section 6, T8N, R7E, lying Westerly of Dort Highway, except the South 1015 feet and the East 153.90 feet of the Northwest 1/4 of the Northeast fractional 1/4, except the South 330 feet and West 146.4 feet of the East 300.3 feet of the Northwest 1/4 of the Northeast fractional 1/4, except the South 450 feet, the ("Property").

Whereas, Flint shall retain a permanent, exclusive 50ft x 100ft easement and right of way, running with the land, to own, operate, maintain, repair and/or for replacement of a Secondary Water Main and appurtenances over, across, under and through the described parcel.

Whereas, Flint shall construct a water pipeline, commonly known as the Dort Highway Main, which is to be comprised of three sections: the Genesee County Drain Commissioner- Division of Water & Waste Services, a County Agency ("GCDC") Main, the Great Lakes Water Authority, a municipal authority ("GLWA") Pipe, and the Flint Main. The GCDC Main shall extend from its upstream connection point to the existing GCDC pipeline on the north side of Frances Road into and through the meter in the GCDC FL-02 Meter Facility, where it will connect with the GLWA Pipe. The GLWA Pipe will, in tum, connect with the Flint Main outside the GCDC FL-02 Meter Facility. The Flint Main will continue from this connection point to the Flint Water Treatment Plant. Exhibits 1 and 2 to this Easement and Right of Way depict the Dort Highway Main and its constituent sections. GCDC shall own, operate, and maintain the GCDC Main. GLWA shall own and operate the GLWA Pipe, which GCDC shall maintain at no cost to GLWA. Flint shall own, operate, and maintain the Flint Main. GLWA and GCDC shall each own, operate, and maintain separate communication systems within the GCDC FL-02 Meter Facility, to which GLWA shall have reasonable access. GCDC shall maintain the meter in that Facility.

Subsequent owner(s) further agree not to construct any permanent or

And, including but not limited to, if the property is ever conveyed, transferred or assigned, Flint retains the right to enter upon sufficient land adjacent to said easement and right of way for the purpose of pedestrian and vehicular ingress and egress by the City and its employees, agents, contractors, subcontractors and assignees, for the construction, operation, maintenance, repair and/or replacement of the Flint Main and appurtenances into perpetuity.

The assignment and/or transfer of any rights under this easement and right-of-way shall require the prior written approval of the Flint City Council.

This instrument shall run with the land and be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto, their representatives, successors and assigns.
