PUBLIC NOTICE FLINT CITY COUNCIL ELECTRONIC PUBLIC MEETING

On Friday, October 5, 2020, the Michigan Supreme Court (MSC) issued an order declaring that the Emergency Powers of Governor (EPG) Act as an unconstitutional delegation of legislative authority, which was the primary authority relied on by Governor Whitmer for her COVID-19 related executive orders. Subsequently, Governor Whitmer requested that the MSC clarify that their order does not go into effect until October 30, 2020. On Monday October 12, 2020, the Michigan Supreme Court rejected Governor Whitmer's request to delay the effect of its decision to strike down the EPG. On, Tuesday, October 13, 2020, Senate Bill 1108 passed, amending the Open Meetings Act to allow municipalities to hold electronic meetings. On Friday, October 16, 2020, Governor Whitmer signed into law Senate Bill 1108 amending the Open Meetings Act. Subsequently, on December 22, 2020, Public Act 267 of 1976 was amended through Senate Bill 1246 extending the electronic meetings with no reason through March 31, 2021. The act also allows that after March 31, 2021, electronic meetings may be held if a local state of emergency was declared. On March 23, 2020, the Flint City Council extended Mayor Neeley's declaration of emergency indefinitely due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Therefore, this meeting will be held electronically.

Pursuant to Act 267 of the Public Acts of 1976 Open Meetings Act as amended and Flint City Charter Section 3-202, notice is hereby given that the Flint City Council hereby calls for Regular Meetings of the Flint City Council scheduled to be held as follows:

General Terms, Conditions and Understandings

Hamilton Community Health Network is pleased to inform you that a grant in the amount of \$10,381.44 has been approved for City of Flint Police Department Community Policing Project with the North Flint Revitalization Initiative's illuminating Community Change (IC2) Project from the Community Based Crime Reduction funds.

This grant is to be used for the following purpose: Flint Police Department in collaboration with Crime Stoppers Geo-Fencing Community Policing Project. Two Officers identified weekly for 4-hours overtime pay to investigate tips received from Crime Stoppers in IC2 micro-hotspots.

The use of these funds is bound by the following terms, conditions and understandings:

- Grant funds must be used in accordance with the purpose outlined above and budget included in your proposal.
- The grant period for this program is March 1, 2021 through September 30, 2021. A quarterly
 report is required and is due by the 15th of the month. A final report is required and is due thirty
 (30) days following the end of the grant period. The report form will be made available.
- If funds are not used for the purposed described in this agreement Hamilton Community Heelth Network reserves the right to have all grant funds immediately returned.
- 4. If the project requires any changes (such as the grant period, report deadline, budget, or purpose), a request must be submitted in writing and approved by IC2 Project Manager prior to the change being made.





Expenditure of Funds

This grant is made for the purpose outlined in the grant award letter and may not be expended for any other purpose without prior written approval from Hamilton Community Health Network.

Eligible expenditures include personnel costs, program/project supplies and facility use. Federal funds may not be used for food or program incentives. Please consider using other funds for food costs. Capital purchases related to the purchase of vehicles or property will not be considered. All awarded funds must be utilized in the timeline outlined in the grant award letter. Any remaining funds not expended by the contract end date will not be available for project use.

No Assignment or Delegation:

You may not assign, or otherwise transfer, your rights or delegate any of your obligations under this grant without prior written approval from Hamilton Community Health Network.

Records and Reports:

You are required to keep a record of all receipts and expenditures relating to this grant and to provide Hamilton Community Health Network with a written report summarizing the project promptly following the end of the period during which you are to use all grant funds, Hamilton Community Health Network may also require quarterly reports. Your reports should describe your progress in achieving the purposes of the grant and include a detailed accounting of the uses or expenditure of all grant funds. You also agree to provide any other information reasonably requested by Hamilton Community Health Network.

Publicity:

You will allow Hamilton Community Health Network to review and approve the text of any proposed publicity concerning this grant prior to its release. Hamilton Community Health Network may include information regarding this grant, including the amount and purpose of the grant, any photographs you may have provided, your logo or trademark, or other information or materials about your organization and its activities, in Hamilton's periodic public reports, newsletters, and news releases.

<u>Crime Stoppers collaborates with Flint Police Department for Hamilton Community Health Network's</u> North Flint Illuminating Community Change Safety Project

April 16, 2020, Flint, Mi —Crime Stoppers of Flint & Genesee County was awarded a grant from Hamilton Community Health Network (HCHN) for a Geo-Fencing Community Policing Project for the North Flint Illuminating Community Change (IC2) Safety Project. This initiative is in collaboration with the City of Flint Police Department.

Crime Stoppers will provide residents an avenue for community policing by utilizing the innovative technology of geofencing and program awareness via a biliboard at W. Pierson Road and Clio Road in the efforts to prevent and solve crime in the targeted area for the HCHN IC2 Safety Project. Geo-fencing is described here: OUTFRONT Media's Mobile Network is used by placing an ad on a mobile device within a specific geo-targeted area. The ad appears when an individual is on one of the 100,000 apps used daily. The geo-fenced area will target a two-mile radius of the billboard.

The Mobile Network will inform the community on how the Crime Stoppers program works and of unsolved crimes in the targeted area. In addition to geo-fencing, a biliboard highlighting "WORKING TOGETHER FOR A SAFER FLINT/YOUR VOICE MATTERS" will be posted at W. Pierson Road and Clio Road.

The project is scheduled to run through October 31, 2020. OUTFRONT Media reports there will be over 107,000 impressions, or eyes-on, the biliboard per week and 937,000 impressions via geo-fencing during the entire project time period.

With this project, the community will have direct input in crime prevention while remaining anonymous. It will help build trust between the residents and law enforcement when they see that the police are following up on information given to them through Crime Stoppers.

"During this difficult time with COVID-19, we want the community to know we are still working diligently to process tips 24/7 and the community is able to help keep their neighborhoods safe and reduce crime by reporting anonymously," said Julie Lopez, Director of Crime Stoppers of Flint and Genesee County. "We are working closely with Flint Police Department to follow up on information submitted by tipsters."

City of Filnt Police Chief, Phil Hart states, "The relationship between Crime Stoppers and the Flint Police Department is a key ingredient in officers receiving the information necessary to further the investigation or even solve a case without fear of exposure by those supplying the tips. We are looking forward to the addition of the geo-fencing piece, as we are hoping for an increase in the number of tips and the time in which they are submitted. The close working relationship between Crime Stoppers and the Flint Police Department will only be enhanced with this new aspect of anonymous tip submission."

Here is how geo-fencing works:

If a person is on their mobile device in the targeted area and on an app or website connected to OUTFRONT Media, they will see a banner ad within the app at the bottom of their device. The ad reads, "100% ANONYMOUS and North Flint IC2 Safety Project".
