PUBLIC NOTICE FLINT CITY COUNCIL ELECTRONIC PUBLIC MEETING

On Friday, October 5, 2020, the Michigan Supreme Court (MSC) issued an order declaring that the Emergency Powers of Governor (EPG) Act as an unconstitutional delegation of legislative authority, which was the primary authority relied on by Governor Whitmer for her COVID-19 related executive orders. Subsequently, Governor Whitmer requested that the MSC clarify that their order does not go into effect until October 30, 2020. On Monday October 12, 2020, the Michigan Supreme Court rejected Governor Whitmer's request to delay the effect of its decision to strike down the EPG. On, Tuesday, October 13, 2020, Senate Bill 1108 passed, amending the Open Meetings Act to allow municipalities to hold electronic meetings. On Friday, October 16, 2020, Governor Whitmer signed into law Senate Bill 1108 amending the Open Meetings Act. Subsequently, on December 22, 2020 Public Act 267 of 1976 was amended through Senate Bill 1246 extending the electronic meetings with no reason through March 31, 2021. The act also allows that after March 31, 2021 electronic meetings may be held if a local state of emergency was declared. On March 23, 2020, the Flint City Council extended Mayor Neeley's declaration of emergency indefinitely due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Therefore, this meeting will be held electronically.

Pursuant to Act 267 of the Public Acts of 1976 Open Meetings Act as amended and Flint City Charter Section 3-202, notice is hereby given that the Flint City Council hereby calls for a Regular Meeting of the Flint City Council scheduled to be held as follows:

Background/Summary of Proposed Action:

The goal of this project is to build a partnership between Revive Flint and the two of the city's programs, Flint ReCAST (Resilience in Communities After Stress and Trauma) and Lead-Based Paint Hazard Control Program to prioritize lead-paint mitigation of homes, to provide education of expectant families and/or families with young children that reduce neurotoxic exposure and effects of stress and trauma. Current partnerships with Greater Flint Health Coalition exists as they are key partners with both the Flint ReCAST and LBPHC programs. Services rendered will be expanded to include targeted families.

Revive Flint will market the program to eligible families and receive referrals from local health practitioners and community-based organizations. Eligible families will be those who are low-moderate income (as determined by HUD program eligibility) and include a currently pregnant mother who lives inside the geographical boundaries of the City of Flint. Each mother will receive incentives for program participation from Revive Flint, resources and/or workshops on reducing stress and trauma from Flint ReCAST, and health assessments, lead inspection, and later remediation by the Lead Based Paint Hazard Control program, if qualified by HUD.

Background/Summary of Proposed Action:

The purpose of this resolution is to accept the funding from GFHC, in order for City of Flint Employees to obtain training, and provide capacity support, for the Flint Registry referral tool.

The City of Flint will participate in a Flint/Genesee County community-clinical linkages referral network for residents identified via the Flint Registry in partnership with Michigan State University and Greater Flint Health Coalition.

The City of Flint will receive funding to compensate their designated staff members for training and utilization of the Michigan Health Information Network (formerly Great Lakes Health Connect) community referral tool application (also known as Referrals Plus), as well as participation in community meetings and reporting. After completing the training, these staff members will support the utilization of the referral tool application within their organization. This will allow the Flint Registry to develop best practices for establishing community linkages as well as address capacity issues to use the referral tool. The City of Flint staff will develop required organizational workflow procedures and processes for the use of the referral tool application. Flint Registry Community Referral Network Capacity Support January 1, 2021 – July 31, 2021

The purpose of this Subcontract Agreement is to outline the responsibilities and expectations of the partnership between the Greater Flint Health Coalition (serving as project manager for the Flint Registry Community Referral Network) and City of Flint, hereinafter referred to as the Subcontractor. The relationship between the named entities is based on adherence to the Eligibility Criteria, Standards and Practices and Expectations, as outlined by the GFHC.

To be eligible for Community Referral Network Capacity Support funds and/or continuation funding, the Subcontractor agrees that it will adhere to all terms and conditions as set forth in this Subcontract Agreement.

Governance:

The Subcontractor is recognized under Section 501(c)3 of the Internal Revenue Code; is governed by a volunteer Board of Directors; and will observe the non-discrimination policies of the laws, statutes and ordinances of all local, state and federal governmental jurisdictions. The Subcontractor will provide its established services to residents of Flint and Genesee County and will not proselytize or require adherence to religious beliefs or practices, nor a declaration of same, as a condition for service.

Services and Scope of Work:

The Subcontractor will participate in a Flint/Genesee County community-clinical linkages referral network for residents identified via the Flint Registry in partnership with Michigan State University and Greater Flint Health Coalition.

The Subcontractor will receive funding to compensate their designated staff members for training and utilization of the Michigan Health Information Network (formerly Great Lakes Health Connect) community referral tool application (also known as Referrals Plus), as well as participation in community Subcontractor meetings and reporting. After completing the training these staff members will support the utilization of the referral tool application within their organization. This will allow the Flint Registry to develop best practices for establishing community linkages as well as address capacity issues to use the referral tool. Subcontractor staff will develop required organizational workflow procedures and processes for the use of the referral tool application. They will also monitor and improve utilization of the tool to process referrals received via the community referral tool application. Greater Flint Health Coalition and the Subcontractor (the "parties") agree:

Funding:

Greater Flint Health Coalition, on behalf of the Flint Registry project, agrees to provide capacity support funds for staff time associated with participation in the Community Referral Platform and Network in the amount of \$10,000 for activities as detailed in the Services and Scope of Work. Funds are allocated at \$20.00/hour for 200 hours/staff member for 2.5 staff. Subcontractor agrees to maintain and retain financial records, and, upon request of Greater Flint Health Coalition, Flint Registry, and/or the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, to make those records available. Any unspent funds are to be returned to Greater Flint Health Coalition at the close of the subcontract agreement period. Subcontractor will receive its 2021 Community Referral Network capacity support allocation from the GFHC upon signing of the contract.

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE SAFE BOATING CAMPAIGN AND NATIONAL SAFE BOATING WEEK

BY THE CITY COUNCIL:

For nearly 100 million Americans, boating continues to be a popular recreational activity. From coast to coast and everywhere in between, people are taking to the water and enjoying time together boating, sailing, paddling, and fishing. During National Safe Boating Week, the U.S. Coast Guard and its federal, state, and local safe boating partners encourage all boaters to explore and enjoy America's beautiful waters responsibly; and

Safe boating begins with preparation. The Coast Guard estimates that human error accounts for most boating accidents and that life jackets could prevent nearly 86% of boating fatalities. Through basic boating safety procedures – carrying lifesaving emergency distress and communications equipment, wearing life jackets, attending safe boating courses, participating in free boat safety checks, and staying sober when navigating – we can help ensure boaters on America's coastal, inland, and offshore waters stay safe throughout the season; and

National Safe Boating Week is observed to bring attention to important life-saving tips for recreational boaters so they can have a safer, more fun experience out on the water throughout the year. On average, 600 people die each year in boating-related accidents in the United States, with 79% of these fatalities caused by fatal drowning. The vast majority of these accidents are caused by human error or poor judgment and not by the boat, equipment or environmental factors. A significant number of boaters who lose their lives by drowning each year would be alive today had they worn their life jacket.
