AMENDED RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE AMENDMENT OF THE FY2020-21 BUDGET TO INCLUDE \$94,726,664 OF FUNDING FOR THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT; CORONAVIRUS LOCAL FISCAL RECOVERY FUND FROM THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TREASURY

BY THE CITY COUNCIL:

As part of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), the City of Flint was awarded grant funding from the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund through the US Department of Treasury. The City's allocation of the funds totals \$94,726,664. The City received the first of two payments on May 19, 2021 for \$47,363,332.00; the second payment is expected in May 2022.

The period of performance for this award ends on December 31, 2026, and the City may use the award to cover eligible costs incurred during the period that begins on March 3, 2021 and ends on December 31, 2024. This grant is to address public health and economic impacts of the COVID-19 public health emergency and invest in infrastructure. The City will not expend funds until final rules have been issued by the U.S. Department of Treasury.

AS PREVIOUSLY RESOLVED ON JUNE 14, 2021 BY RESOLUTION 210280, the appropriate City officials are authorized to do all things necessary to appropriate grant funding and abide by terms and conditions of the grant from the United States Department of Treasury for addressing the Public Health and Economic Impacts of the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency under grant code FUSDT-CSLFRF in the amount of \$94,726,664, and to make available in subsequent fiscal years any remaining funds that are still available.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that for any award or expenditure of ARPA funds occurring after the effective date of this Amended Resolution, City Council must authorize, by duly adopted resolution, the award or expenditure.

BY THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR:

WHEREAS, The City of Flint is a recipient of Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act funds (P.L. 116-136) in the amount of \$2,441,943 for Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG-CV) purposes. These funds must be used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus among individuals and families who are homeless or receiving homeless assistance, and to support additional homeless assistance and homelessness prevention activities to mitigate the impacts created by coronavirus.

WHEREAS, At its meeting on August 10, 2021, the Flint City Council authorized allocations of ESG-CV funding to several agencies, including \$355,926 to Shelter of Flint for shelter operations and essential services.

WHEREAS, As these ESG-CV funds expire nationally on September 30, 2022, city staff has been working with shelter agencies to identify uses for such funds.

WHEREAS, The first change order to Shelter of Flint's contract approved November 15, 2021 (Resolution No. 210548) was for \$184,903 for wages and salaries, and appliances associated with the operation of the shelter. The new request, change order No. 2, will allocate \$2,461 for additional items to prevent, prepare for and respond to Covid. Staff is recommending approval of the request for \$2,461.

WHEREAS, ESG-CV Shelter operations funding is available to be allocated to eligible agencies for eligible activities.

WHEREAS, Per the requirements of CPD Notice 21-08, issued July 19, 2021, by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, the City has published on its website, on the Community and Economic Development page, how it is using its ESG-CV funds.

BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ACTION:

The City of Flint is a recipient of Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act (P.L. 116-136) in the amount of \$2,441,943 for Emergency Solutions Grant funding (ESG). These funds must be used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus among individuals and families who are homeless or receiving homeless assistance, and to support additional homeless assistance and homelessness prevention activities to mitigate the impacts created by coronavirus.

As these ESG-CV funds expire nationally on September 30, 2022, city staff has been working with shelter agencies to identify uses for such funds. The Shelter of Flint was initially awarded \$355,926 for shelter operations and essential services. The first change order approved November 15, 2021 (Resolution No. 210548) was \$184,903 for wages and salaries, and appliances associated with the operation of the shelter. The new request, change order No. 2, will allocate funds for additional items to prevent, prepare for and respond to Covid. Staff is recommending approval of the request for \$2,461.

Per the requirements of CPD Notice 21-08, issued July 19, 2021, by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, the City has published on its website, on the Community and Economic Development page, how it is using its ESG-CV funds.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS: Funds for this purpose are reserved to provide services to the homeless population in Flint and serve to prevent, prepare or respond to coronavirus. Funds determined to be ineligible paid and drawn must be repaid using general fund dollars.
