Resolution, based on the Memorandum of Understanding in place between the City and the Genesee County Land Bank, to enter into a contract for \$602,084.98 to allow them to request reimbursement after demolishing properties they own for which there is fire insurance held by the City's Division of Building Safety and Inspections

By the Mayor:

The Division of Building Safety and Inspections within the Department of Planning and Development has identified \$602,084.98 in fire insurance funds held by the city for properties owned by the Genesee County Land Bank (GCLB); and

Those funds can only be used to pay for the demolition cost of the property to which they are attached – legally they cannot be used for any other purpose; and

The existence of these funds has the potential to close the gap between existing resources that the GCLB has slated to demolish these buildings and the total cost, allowing for more dangerous buildings to be demolished without any financial outlay by the City; and

The City of Flint has a Memorandum of Understanding in place with the GCLB to allow for an executed contract to be put in place for the total amount of fire insurance settlement funds held for Authority-owned properties targeted for demolition to allow the City will reimburse the GCLB for demolition work undertaken on those properties for the lesser of the cost of demolition or the amount of funds held in escrow funds for the subject property; and

The Department of Planning and Development requests to enter into a contract for \$602,084.98 with the GCLB to allow them to request reimbursement after demolishing properties they own for which there is fire insurance held by the City's Division of Building Safety and Inspections; and

Funds are available in the 701.000.000-389.000 account; and

IT IS RESOLVED, that the above referenced contract will be approved and that the appropriate City of Flint officials are hereby authorized to do all things necessary to enter into contract with the GCLB in the amount of \$602,084.98 from account 701.000.000-389.000.

Background/Summary of Proposed Action:

The Division of Building Safety and Inspections within the Department of Planning and Development has identified \$602,084.98 in fire insurance funds held by the city for properties owned by the Genesee County Land Bank (GCLB) and those funds can only be used to pay for the demolition cost of the property to which they are attached—legally they cannot be used for any other purpose. By allowing the GCLB to demolish buildings they own with the understanding of being reimbursed by the fire insurance funds, it enables the demolition of more dangerous buildings without any financial outlay by the City.

The City of Flint has a Memorandum of Understanding in place with the GCLB (enclosed) to allow for an executed contract to be put in place for the total amount of fire insurance settlement funds held for GCLB-owned properties targeted for demolition to allow the City will reimburse the GCLB for demolition work undertaken on those properties for the lesser of the cost of demolition or the amount of funds held in escrow funds for the subject property.

Financial Implications (i.e., budget, account information)

Instead of these withheld insurance funds remaining unused by the City, they will be used for their specified purpose. The city has no financial outlay of funds.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

WHEREAS, the Genesee County Land Bank Authority, a public body corporate organized pursuant to the Michigan Land Bank Fast Track Act, MCL 124.751-124.774, (the "Authority"), is available to demolish vacant and blighted structures in the City of Flint, (the "City"); and

WHEREAS, the City is participating in the fire insurance withholding program to escrow the lesser of 25% or the maximum withholding amount as allowed by Sections 500.2227 and 500.2845 of the Michigan Insurance code, of a fire insurance settlement for losses which meet established criteria to real property within the boundaries of the City of Flint; and

WHEREAS, the City has obtained through ordinance procedures the right to demolish structures located in the City of Flint with funds collected and escrowed; and

WHEREAS, the City represents and warrants that its ordinance procedures are valid; and

WHEREAS, the Authority obtains ownership of properties with escrowed funds through tax foreclosure; and

WHEREAS, the Authority is willing and able to allocate grant funding, if available, to complete the demolition of the properties if the amount set aside in escrow is insufficient; and

NOW THEREFORE, the City and Authority agree as follows:

- 1. The City may contract with the Authority to demolish selected properties not to exceed the amount of the escrow received by the City.
- 2. Once an executed contract exists for the total amount of fire insurance settlement funds held for Authority-owned properties targeted for demolition, the City will reimburse the Authority for demolition work undertaken on those properties for the lesser of the cost of demolition or the amount of funds held in escrow funds for the subject property.
- 3. The Authority will demolish the properties after first obtaining all necessary federal, state and local permits.
- 4. The Authority may leverage funds from grants received as available to complete the demolition of selected properties if the cost of demolition exceeds the escrow amount.

BY THE MAYOR:

Whereas, the City of Flint's budget is monitored on an ongoing basis by the Finance Department and City department heads; and

Whereas, the Ordinance #3865, or the Purchasing Ordinance for the City of Flint, defines the responsibilities that City Council and Administration are to do to ensure that the funds of the city are spent in a fiscally and ethically responsible way; and

Whereas, recent departures by both the Purchasing Manager (Derrick Jones) and Interim Purchasing Manager (Bryan Bond) have left the position temporarily vacant; and

Whereas, during this temporary vacancy, the city is currently relying on the Chief Financial Officer to fill the role of Purchasing Manager until a suitable long-term replacement can be found; and

Whereas, in order to provide temporary transactional support to the Chief Financial Officer, the City has hired a consultant to vet requisitions and help guide department heads and the Chief Financial Officer in making procurement decisions in lieu of a Purchasing Manager until that role can be filled; and

Whereas, the city has entered into a contract with Robert Half Staffing Agency, not-to-exceed \$70,000, which provides this temporary support until a permanent solution can be found; and

Whereas, the adopted FY19 Budget did not include provisions for consulting (professional services) expenditures in anticipation of finding a permanent Purchasing Manager and will now have to be amended in order to transfer some of the funds for wages and fringes over to professional services to fund the proper account to procure professional services,

IT IS RESOLVED, that the FY19 Budget of the City of Flint is hereby amended to move \$64,400 (FY19 portion of the contract) from the wages and fringes accounts for the

Purchasing Division (#101-191.201-702.000 \$60,000 and #101-191.201-719.100 \$4,400) to the Professional Services account #101-191.201-801.000.

Both the Purchasing Director and the Purchasing Buyer for the City of Flint have recently retired. Since March, the Human Resources Division has been working to fill these vacancies. Until such time that these positions can be filled, the Finance Department has engaged the consulting services of Mr. Rudy Aguilar through Robert Half Management Services.

Therefore, a budget amendment is needed to move funds in the amount of \$38,000 from wages account #101-191.201-702.000 and \$3,420 from direct fringe account #101-191.201-719.100 to professional services account #101-201-801.000 to cover these expenditures.

It is the recommendation of the Chief Financial Officer to amend the 2018-2019 budget in the amount of \$41,420 as outlined above.

Hiring Fee

<u>Summary of Proposed Action:</u> Funding for the Safe Routes to School (SRTS) program was established by Congress under the Safe, Accountable, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users of 2005 (SAFETEA-LU). The SRTS program provides educational programs, infrastructure improvements and encouragement activities to help children safely walk and bike to school and increase their physical activities. SRTS funding is 100 percent federal funds with no local match requirements.

MDOT administers the federally legislated SRTS program and encourages opportunities for collaboration between agencies and partners not traditionally involved in transportation funding. MDOT requires local agencies to partner with schools awarded funding by awarding the transportation funds through the local agency and requiring the local agency to maintain the facilities after construction.

The Department of Public Works & Utilities supports the Neithercut Elementary School, Freeman Elementary School, Pierce Elementary School, and Doyle-Ryder Elementary School SRTS programs, Adoption of this resolution will attest to the City's commitment to partnering with the Crim Foundation and Flint Community Schools.



Priority 1. Restripe crosswalks leading to campus. Replace "School Zone" signage where necessary.





Proposed Safe Routes to School Infrastructure Improvements Neithercut Elementary School 2010 Crestbrook Ln, Flint, MI 48507




Priority 1. Repair sidewalk on Crestbrook Ln. Bridge over Carman Creek.


Proposed Safe Routes to School Infrastructure Improvements Freeman Elementary School 4001 Ogema Ave, Flint, MI 48507
