Agenda Item Title: RESOLUTION APPROVING A BUDGET AMENDMENT FOR IMAGINE FLINT NEIGHBORHOOD PLANNING GRANT FROM THE RUTH MOTT FOUNDATION

#### **Background/Summary of Proposed Action:**

In June 2018, the City received grant funding from the Ruth Mott Foundation (RMF) to continue its neighborhood planning initiative. The program will be led by the Planning Division and afford the City the continued ability to work with residents of Flint to develop and implement neighborhood specific plans and strategies across the City.

The grant is for two years and will allow the Division to retain the services of one employee (Planner I) and hire a new employee (Urban Designer). The grant will also enable groups to implement strategies identified in their plan, through funding directly tied to plan execution.

The neighborhood planning initiative will allow the City to further implement its master plan, through the "creation of at least two neighborhood plans annually".

#### **Financial Implications:**

This grant leverages existing funds throughout the community, and delivers no impact to the City's General Fund accounts.
