FLINT CITY COUNCIL ELECTRONIC PUBLIC MEETING**

On Friday, October 5, 2020, the Michigan Supreme Court (MSC) issued an order declaring that the Emergency Powers of Governor (EPG) Act as an unconstitutional delegation of legislative authority, which was the primary authority relied on by Governor Whitmer for her COVID-19 related executive orders. Subsequently, Governor Whitmer requested that the MSC clarify that their order does not go into effect until October 30, 2020. On Monday October 12, 2020, the Michigan Supreme Court rejected Governor Whitmer's request to delay the effect of its decision to strike down the EPG. On, Tuesday, October 13, 2020, Senate Bill 1108 passed, amending the Open Meetings Act to allow municipalities to hold electronic meetings. On Friday, October 16, 2020, Governor Whitmer signed into law Senate Bill 1108 amending the Open Meetings Act. Subsequently, on December 22, 2020, Public Act 267 of 1976 was amended through Senate Bill 1246 extending the electronic meetings with no reason through March 31, 2021. The act also allows that after March 31, 2021, electronic meetings may be held if a local state of emergency was declared. On March 23, 2020, the Flint City Council extended Mayor Neeley's declaration of emergency indefinitely due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Therefore, this meeting will be held electronically.

Pursuant to Act 267 of the Public Acts of 1976 Open Meetings Act as amended and Flint City Charter Section 3-202, notice is hereby given that the Flint City Council hereby calls for Regular Meetings of the Flint City Council scheduled to be held as follows:

**CITY OF FLINT CONTRACT WITH
Boyd's Lawn and Landscaping**

The purpose of this agreement is to enter into a contract to provide equipment and mowing & trimming services for parks, traffic triangles, and traffic medians (hereinafter "Services") for the City of Flint (hereinafter "City") and Boyd's Lawn and Landscaping. (hereinafter "Contractor").

Applicable Law: This contract shall be governed by and interpreted according to the laws of the State of Michigan pertaining to contracts made and to be performed in this state.

Arbitration: Contractor agrees that for all claims, disputes, and other matters arising out of or relating to this agreement, Contractor must request the City's consent to arbitrate within 30 days from the date the Contractor knows or should have known the facts giving rise to the claim, dispute or question.

(a) Notice of a request for arbitration must be submitted in writing by certified mail or personal service upon the City Attorney.

(b) Within 60 days from the date a request for arbitration is received by the City, the City shall inform Contractor whether it agrees to arbitrate. If the City does not consent, Contractor may proceed with an action in a court of competent jurisdiction within the State of Michigan. If the City does consent, then within 30 days of the consent each party shall submit to the other the name of one person to serve as an arbitrator. The two arbitrators together shall then select a third person, the three together shall then serve as a panel in all proceedings. Any unanimous decision of the three arbitrators shall be a final binding decision. The City's failure to respond to a timely, conforming request for arbitration is deemed consent to arbitration.

(c) The costs of the arbitration shall be split and borne equally between the parties and such costs are not subject to shifting by the arbitrator.

(d) Contractor's failure to comply with any portion (including timeliness) of this provision shall be deemed a permanent waiver and forfeiture of the claim, dispute, or question.

(e) These provisions shall survive the termination or expiration of this agreement.

City Income Tax Withholding: Contractor and any subcontractor engaged in this contract shall withhold from each payment to his employees the City income tax on all of their compensation subject to tax, after giving effect to exemptions, as follows:

(a) Residents of the City:

At a rate equal to 1% of all compensation paid to the employee who is a resident of the City of Flint.

(b) Non-residents:

At a rate equal to ½ % of the compensation paid to the employee for work done or services performed in the City of Flint.

These taxes shall be held in trust and paid over to the City of Flint in accordance with City ordinances and State law. Any failure to do so shall constitute a substantial and material breach of this contract.

Compensation: The City shall pay for requested services as have been set forth herein, a total contract price not to exceed \$120,600.00 upon submission of proper invoices, releases, affidavits, and the like. Contractor recognizes that the City does not guarantee it will require any set amount of services. Contractor's services will be utilized as needed and as determined solely by the City of Flint. Contractor expressly recognizes that it has no right to payment of any amount exceeding \$120,600.00. Contractor agrees that oral agreements by City officials to pay a greater amount are not binding.

1. Contractor shall submit itemized invoices on a monthly basis for all services provided under this Agreement identifying:

- (a) The date of service
- (b) The name of person providing the service and a general description of the service provided
- (c) The unit rate and the total amount due. Invoices shall be submitted to by e-mail to: accountspayable@cityofflint.com and Amore@cityofflint.com (City of Flint, Planner II)

It is solely within the discretion of the City as to whether Contractor has provided a proper invoice. The City may require additional information or waive requirements as it sees fit. The City will notify the Contractor of any errors or lack of sufficient documentation within 14 days of receipt of the invoice.

Contract Documents: The invitation for bids, instructions to bidders, proposal, affidavit, addenda (if any), statement of bidder's qualifications (when required), general conditions, special conditions, performance bond, labor and material payment bond, insurance certificates, technical specifications, and drawings, together with this agreement, form the contract, and they are as fully a part of the contract as if attached hereto or repeated herein.

Disclaimer of Contractual Relationship With Subcontractors: Nothing contained in the Contract Documents shall create any contractual relationship between the City and any Subcontractor or Sub-subcontractor.

Effective Date: This contract shall be effective upon the date that it is executed by all parties and presented to the City of Flint Clerk.

Certification, Licensing, Debarment, Suspension and Other Responsibilities: Contractor warrants and certifies that Contractor and/or any of its principals are properly certified and licensed to perform the duties required by this contract in accord with laws, rules,

and regulations, and is not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment or declared ineligible for the award of any Federal contracts by any Federal agency. Contractor may not continue to or be compensated for any work performed during any time period where the debarment, suspension or ineligibility described above exists or may arise in the course of Contractor contractual relationship with the City. Failure to comply with this section constitutes a material breach of this Contract. Should it be determined that contractor performed work under this contract while in non-compliance with this provision, Contractor agrees to reimburse the City for any costs that the City must repay to any and all entities.

Force Majeure: Neither party shall be responsible for damages or delays caused by Force Majeure or other events beyond the control of the other party and which could not reasonably have been anticipated or prevented. For purposes of this Agreement, Force Majeure includes, but is not limited to, adverse weather conditions, floods, epidemics, war, riot, strikes, lockouts, and other industrial disturbances; unknown site conditions, accidents, sabotage, fire, and acts of God. Should Force Majeure occur, the parties shall mutually agree on the terms and conditions upon which the services may continue.

Good Standing: Contractor must remain current and not be in default of any obligations due the City of Flint, including the payment of taxes, fines, penalties, licenses, or other monies due the City of Flint. Violations of this clause shall constitute a substantial and material breach of this contract. Such breach shall constitute good cause for the termination of this contract should the City of Flint decide to terminate on such basis.

Hold Harmless and Indemnification: To the fullest extent permitted by law, Contractor agrees to defend, pay on behalf of, indemnify, and hold harmless the City, its elected and appointed officials, employees, volunteers and others working on behalf of the City, against any and all claims, demands, suits, or losses, including all costs connected therewith, and for any and all damages which may be asserted, claimed, or recovered against or from the City, its elected and appointed officials, employees, volunteers or others working on behalf of the City, arising out of this Agreement, including but not limited to those by reason of personal injury, including bodily injury or death and/or property damage, including loss of use thereof, including those which may arise as a result of Contractor's acts, omissions, faults, and negligence or that of any of his employees, agents, and representatives. Should the Contractor fail to indemnify the City in the above-mentioned circumstances, the City may deduct the cost that it incurs from amounts owing under the Agreement without prior notice. These provisions shall survive the termination on expiration of this agreement.

Independent Contractor: No provision of this contract shall be construed as creating an employer-employee relationship. It is hereby expressly understood and agreed that Contractor is an "independent contractor" as that phrase has been defined and interpreted by the courts of the State of Michigan and, as such, Contractor is not entitled to any benefits not otherwise specified herein.

Insurance/Worker's Compensation: Contractor shall not commence work under this contract until he has procured and provided evidence of the insurance required under this

section. All coverage shall be obtained from insurance companies licensed and authorized to do business in the State of Michigan unless otherwise approved by the City's Risk Manager. Policies shall be reviewed by the City's Risk Manager for completeness and limits of coverage. All coverage shall be with insurance carriers acceptable to the City of Flint. Contractor shall maintain the following insurance coverage for the duration of the contract.

(a) Commercial General Liability coverage of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) combined single limit with the City of Flint, and including all elected and appointed officials, all employees and volunteers, all boards, commissions and/or authorities and their board members, employees and volunteers, named as "Additional Insureds." This coverage shall be written on an ISO occurrence basis form and shall include: Bodily Injury, Personal Injury, Property Damage, Contractual Liability, Products and Completed Operations, Independent Contractors; Broad Form Commercial General Liability Endorsement, (XCU) Exclusions deleted and a per contract aggregate coverage. This coverage shall be primary to the Additional Insureds, and not contributing with any other insurance or similar protection available to the Additional Insureds, whether said other available coverage be primary, contributing, or excess.

(b) Workers Compensation Insurance in accordance with Michigan statutory requirements, including Employers Liability coverage.

(c) Commercial Automobile Insurance in the amount of not less than \$1,000,000 combined single limit per accident with the City of Flint, and including all elected and appointed officials, all employees and volunteers, all boards, commissions and/or authorities and their board members, employees and volunteers, named as "Additional Insureds." This coverage shall be written on ISO business auto forms covering Automobile Liability, code "any auto."

(d) Professional Liability - Errors and Omissions. All projects involving the use of Architects, civil engineers, landscape design specialists, and other professional services must provide the City of Flint with evidence of Professional Liability coverage in an amount not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000). Evidence of this coverage must be provided for a minimum of three years after project completion. Any deductibles or self-insured retention must be declared to and approved by the City. In addition, the total dollar value of all claims paid out on the policy shall be declared. At the option of the City, either the insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retention with respect to the City, its officials, employees, agents and volunteers; or Contractor shall procure a bond guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigation, claim, administration, and defense expenses.

Contractor shall furnish the City with two certificates of insurance for all coverage requested with original endorsements for those policies requiring the Additional Insureds. All certificates of insurance must provide the City of Flint with not less than 30 days advance written notice in the event of cancellation, non-payment of premium, non-renewal, or any material change in policy coverage. In addition, the wording "Endeavor to" and "but failure to mail such notice shall impose no obligation or liability of any kind

upon the company, its agents or representatives" must be removed from the standard ACORD cancellation statement. These certificates must identify the City of Flint, Risk Management Division, as the "Certificate Holder." Contractor must provide, upon request, certified copies of all insurance policies. If any of the above policies are due to expire during the term of this contract, Contractor shall deliver renewal certificates and copies of the new policies to the City of Flint at least ten days prior to the expiration date. Contractor shall ensure that all subcontractors utilized obtain and maintain all insurance coverage required by this provision.

Laws and Ordinances: Contractor shall obey and abide by all of the laws, rules and regulations of the Federal Government, State of Michigan, Genesee County and the City of Flint, applicable to the performance of this agreement, including, but not limited to, labor laws, and laws regulating or applying to public improvements.

Modifications: Any modifications to this contract must be in writing and signed by the parties or the authorized employee, officer, board or council representative of the parties authorized to make such contractual modifications under State law and local ordinances.

No Third-Party Beneficiary: No contractor, subcontractor, mechanic, materialman, laborer, vendor, or other person dealing with the principal Contractor shall be, nor shall any of them be deemed to be, third-party beneficiaries of this contract, but each such person shall be deemed to have agreed (a) that they shall look to the principal Contractor as their sole source of recovery if not paid, and (b) except as otherwise agreed to by the principal Contractor and any such person in writing, they may not enter any claim or bring any such action against the City under any circumstances. Except as provided by law, or as otherwise agreed to in writing between the City and such person, each such person shall be deemed to have waived in writing all rights to seek redress from the City under any circumstances whatsoever.

Non-Assignability: Contractor shall not assign or transfer any interest in this contract without the prior written consent of the City provided, however, that claims for money due or to become due to Contractor from the City under this contract may be assigned to a bank, trust company, or other financial institution without such approval. Notice of any such assignment or transfer shall be furnished promptly to the City.

Non-Disclosure/Confidentiality: Contractor agrees that the documents identified herein as the contract documents are confidential information intended for the sole use of the City and that Contractor will not disclose any such information, or in any other way make such documents public, without the express written approval of the City or the order of the court of appropriate jurisdiction or as required by the laws of the State of Michigan.

Non-Discrimination: Contractor shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment with respect to hiring or tenure; terms, conditions, or privileges of employment; or any matter directly or indirectly related to employment, because of race, color, creed, religion, ancestry, national origin, age, sex, height, weight, disability or other physical impairment, marital status, or status with respect to public assistance.

Notices: Notices to the City of Flint shall be deemed sufficient if in writing and mailed,

postage prepaid, addressed to Adam Moore, Planner II, City of Flint, 1101 S. Saginaw Street, Room B17, Flint, Michigan 48502 and Inez Brown, City Clerk, City of Flint, 1101 S. Saginaw Street, Flint, Michigan 48502, or to such other address as may be designated in writing by the City from time to time. Notices to Contractor shall be deemed sufficient if in writing and mailed, postage prepaid, addressed to 5103 W. Coldwater Rd. Flint, MI 48504, or to such other address as may be designated in writing by Contractor from time to time.

R-12 Prevailing Wages: Contractor is aware of City of Flint Resolution #R-12 dated April 8, 1991, which is hereby incorporated by reference, and agrees to abide by all of the applicable covenants and requirements set forth in said resolution.

Records Property of City: All documents, information, reports and the like prepared or generated by Contractor as a result of this contract shall become the sole property of the City of Flint.

Scope of Services: Contractor shall provide all of the materials, equipment, supplies, tools, superintendence and other accessories and services necessary to complete the project in accordance with the proposals submitted opened on February 2, 2018.

Work will be conducted between the spring and fall of 2018 and may be subject for individual annual renewal in 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022. It is the City's intention that parks, cemeteries, trails, medians, and traffic triangles will be mowed bi-weekly at least 14 times a year with 6 optional mows used at the City's discretion, however, no minimum amount of work is guaranteed. City Hall and fire stations will be mowed weekly, or at the City's discretion. Work done around fire stations and City Hall will be managed by the Department of Public Works

The City of Flint reserves the right to remove assigned properties with 30 days prior notice.

Severability: In the event that any provision contained herein shall be determined by a court or administrative tribunal to be contrary to a provision of state or federal law or to be unenforceable for any reason, then, to the extent necessary and possible to render the remainder of this Agreement enforceable, such provision may be modified or severed by such court or administrative tribunal so as to, as nearly as possible, carry out the intention of the parties hereto, considering the purpose of the entire Agreement in relation to such provision. The invalidation of one or more terms of this contract shall not affect the validity of the remaining terms.

Standards of Performance: Contractor agrees to exercise independent judgment and to perform its duties under this contract in accordance with sound professional practices. The City is relying upon the professional reputation, experience, certification, and ability of Contractor. Contractor agrees that all of the obligations required by him under this Contract shall be performed by him or by others employed by him and working under his direction and control. The continued effectiveness of this contract during its term or any renewal term shall be contingent upon Contractor maintaining his certification in accordance with the requirements of State law.

Work shall be conducted with the utmost professionalism and care and shall include:

- Routine lawn mowing, trimming and edging are required to maintain a manicured, uniform, dense stand of turf during the entire mowing season. **Mowing blades shall be set between 2.5 and 3 inches.**
- All turf areas shall be completely mowed and left without clippings or rolled grass after each scheduled cut.
- All mowing shall be done with clean, freshly sharpened and properly adjusted rotary mulching/recycling or reel type mowing equipment.
- All play equipment, trees, buildings, fencing, light poles, downed limbs, pavilions and other obstacles shall be weed whipped and trimmed after each scheduled cut.
- Sidewalks, walkways, parking lots, and curb lines shall be trimmed/edged after each scheduled cut. All trimmings on parking lots, sidewalks, walkways, basketball/tennis courts, curb lines or other hard surfaces shall be eliminated by whatever means are available to the Contractor and at no expense to the City. Clippings shall not be blown into the street.
- Mowing direction shall be varied with each mowing to change the patterns of wear and cut. Mow no closer than 4" to trees or park equipment or other obstacles. Trimming shall be completed around trees, etc. so as to avoid damage.
- **If grass clippings left by the mowing lay on top of the grass and become unsightly the clippings shall be eliminated by whatever means are available to the Contractor and at no expense to the City. Clippings shall not be blown into the streets.**
- Normal, everyday litter shall be removed prior to mowing. The City of Flint shall be contacted immediately if large quantities of illegal dumped debris are present.
- Clippings and related mowing and maintenance waste from all walks, grounds cover beds, parking lots and drives, etc. shall be removed from the site before mowing is considered complete and before the Contractor leaves the job site. Contractor is responsible for proper, legal disposal of waste.
- Under no circumstances are areas with saturated soils to be mowed that will result in destruction of turf or the soil profile by mowing equipment. In the event of wet conditions, which prevent full service on the property, the City of Flint is to be notified.
- **Unless explicitly instructed in writing, wet areas, low-lying areas, heavily wooded areas, or areas of rough terrain are to be trimmed.**
- The City of Flint may make temporary signage available for the contractor to mark areas that are "too wet to mow" to provide communication to residents.

Evaluation:

Each contractor will be evaluated on a monthly basis to ensure proper performance of their work. Appendix A contains a sample of the evaluation standards for each property.

Contractor's performance will be reviewed every month to evaluate their performance based on standards in the RFP and contract. A total of 10 points are available for each property based on the criteria below. Scores of 0 to 5 will result in Unsatisfactory rating, 6 to 7 Needs Improvement, and 8 or above Satisfactory.

All property scores will be averaged into one monthly score, which will determine if the contractor's performance is Unsatisfactory, Needs Improvement, or Satisfactory.

A monthly average of Unsatisfactory twice over the season or Needs Improvement 5 times over the season will result in a formal Notice of Complaint by the City of Flint. Contractors will have 30 days to remedy the poor performance that resulted in Notice of Complaint. Failure to do so may be used as cause to terminate the contract with the vendor.

Property scores of Unsatisfactory for any one single property 3 times in one season will also result a formal Notice of Complaint by the City of Flint. Failure to remedy the poor performance at that property may be used as cause to terminate the contract with the vendor.

Frequency of Mowing/Scheduling:

Mowing will be conducted at the discretion of the City of Flint.

- Contractor shall be assigned properties to be maintained by the City of Flint.
- Mowing, trimming, edging and clipping removal shall occur approximately every 14 days or as scheduled by the City of Flint. Please see above for general standards of service.
- It is the City's intention to cut the grass at least 14 times between March and December. Up to 6 individual, optional cuts or special event cuts are available to be used if requested in writing by the City.
- Contractor may request an additional cut, double cut, or special event cut, however, that work is to be completed with expressed written verification and approval of the City of Flint.
- Contractor will provide the City of Flint a weekly schedule as to which day of the week each property shall be mowed. The City of Flint shall be alerted by e-mail if weather delays the mowing, or changes to the schedule are requested.
- It is the City will mow each property 14 times per a season. No additional mowing shall occur on a property unless special event mows are requested by the City of Flint and/or double cuts are requested by the vendor. Please see below for information on double cuts or special event requests.
- It is the City's intention that parks will be cut at least 6 to 8 times prior to June 30th, 2018, though work is weather dependent and to be done at the City's discretion.
- It is the City's intention that parks will be cut 8 to 12 times after June 30th, 2018, though work is weather dependent and to be done at the City's discretion.
- **While the City does not guarantee any minimum amount of work, the Contract expresses acknowledges that payment is not to exceed any amount above \$120,600.00.**
- If the City experiences periods of extreme rain, heat or drought, a City representative will notify selected contractor to authorize the frequency of mowing.

Special Events:

At times the City of Flint may contact the contractor to perform a one time off schedule mow for a special event. Requests from the City will be made with at least five days prior to the special event. Special event cuts (also known as optional cuts) are to be billed to the City at the single cut rate.

Double Cuts:

At times the contractor may feel as though multiple cuts are necessary to meet contract standards due to high grass conditions. In this event the contractor may request a double cut. Double cuts shall only be conducted with expressed written/e-mailed consent of the City of Flint. Contractors may provide a double cut mowing price in their proposals.

Communication:

Contractors are required to contact assigned City of Flint representative by e-mail by noon every Monday on a weekly basis to provide an update on mowing completed the week before and an estimated schedule of work to be conducted over the next week. Any changes from the previous week's schedule should be noted and any problems or interruptions with service should be noted. Monthly evaluations from the City of Flint will be emailed to contractor's assigned representatives by the 1st of every month after work has begun.

Notice to Proceed:

No work shall commence without the expressed consent of the City of Flint. Each contractor is requested to attend a pre-service meeting to discuss services to be provided.

Subcontracting: No subcontract work, if permitted by the City, shall be started prior to the written approval of the subcontractor by the City. The City reserves the right to accept or reject any subcontractor.

Termination: This contract may be terminated by either party hereto by submitting a notice of termination to the other party. Such notice shall be in writing and shall be effective 30 days from the date it is submitted unless otherwise agreed to by the parties hereto. Contractor, upon receiving such notice and prorated payment upon termination of this contract shall give to the City all pertinent records, data, and information created up to the date of termination to which the City, under the terms of this contract, is entitled.

Time of Performance: Contractor's services shall commence immediately upon receipt of the notice to proceed and shall be carried out forthwith and without reasonable delay.

Union Compliance: Contractor agrees to comply with all regulations and requirements of any national or local union(s) that may have jurisdiction over any of the materials, facilities, services, or personnel to be furnished by the City. However, this provision does not apply if its application would violate Public Act 98 of 2011.

Waiver: Failure of the City to insist upon strict compliance with any of the terms, covenants, or conditions of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of any term, covenant, or condition. Any waiver or relinquishment of any right or power hereunder at any one or more times shall not be deemed a waiver or relinquishment of that right or power at any other time.

Whole Agreement: This written agreement and the documents cited herein embody the entire agreement between the parties. Any additions, deletions or modifications hereto must be in writing and signed by both parties.

BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ACTION:

Janitorial services were contracted out around 2012. The current contract expires June 30, 2021 and sealed proposals were solicited. Fourteen bids were received and a janitorial services committee reviewed the bids. Some vendors did not meet the bid specifications; others did not attend the mandatory pre-bid meeting. The committee interviewed the three lowest bidders that met the criteria and picked the lowest responsive bidder, RNA Facilities Management. RNA is a national company and they were the low bidder for the first year, and then the yearly cost went up by 3% for the following two years. They also included chemicals in their bid response (no other vendor did so), which will reduce the amount the Maintenance Division spends on janitorial supplies. Last year, the Maintenance Division spent approximately \$4,386 buying chemicals, which makes up the difference in price for the second year between RNA and the next lowest bidder (CITI Building Services).

Pole Shaft

The pole shaft is two section design, each section being fabricated from standard 7 gauge (0.1793") steel. The pole shaft material is a weldable grade hot rolled commercial quality carbon steel with a guaranteed minimum yield strength of 55,000 psi after fabrication. Each section is one-piece construction with a full length longitudinal weld and is square in cross-section having a uniform taper of 0.10 inches of diameter change per foot of length.

Base Plate

The anchor base is fabricated from a structural quality hot rolled carbon steel plate that meets or exceeds a minimum yield strength of 36,000 psi. The anchor base telescopes the pole shaft and is circumferentially welded top and bottom. All welds are performed in accordance with the American Welding Society specification AWS D1.1, latest edition.

Anchor Bolts

Anchor bolts are fabricated from commercial quality hot rolled carbon steel bar that meets or exceeds a minimum yield strength of 55,000 psi. Four properly sized anchor bolts, each with two regular hex nuts and washers, are furnished and shipped with all poles unless otherwise specified. Anchor bolts shall have the threaded end galvanized a minimum of 8 inches in accordance with ASTM A153. Fully galvanized anchor bolts are available upon request.

Handhole

An oval reinforced gasketed handhole, having a nominal 4" x 6.5" inside opening, located at 1' - 6" above the base, is standard on all poles. A grounding provision is located inside the handhole ring.

Finish

Standard - The exterior surface is cleaned with an alkaline rinse to remove surface contaminants and shot blasted to specifications as published by the Steel Structures Painting Council Standards SSPC-SP10 (near white). The exterior surface is chemically pretreated with an iron phosphate conversion coating then rinsed with ambient fresh water containing special surfactants and sealers forming a dry tight micro-crystalline coating. A polyester thermosetting powder coating applied to the surface of the substrate to a minimum of 3 mils is standard on all color finishes. The internal surface including the powder coated area at the base end is coated with ~~ASTM A153~~, a thermoplastic hydrocarbon resin system specially formulated for application over untreated steel surfaces, to a thickness of 3 mils. The internal coating shall contain special corrosion inhibitors and is capable of passing 1000 hours of salt spray exposure (ASTM B117).

Proposals will be accepted at any time during the normal course of business only, said hours being 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. local time, Monday through Friday, legal holidays as exception.
 - c) Bids must be enclosed in a sealed, non-transparent envelope, box or package, and clearly marked on the outside with the following: RFP Title, RFP Number, Deadline and Bidder's name.
 - d) Submission of a bid establishes a conclusive presumption that the Bidder is thoroughly familiar with the Request for Proposals (RFP), and that the Contractor understands and agrees to abide by each and all of the stipulations and requirements contained therein.
 - e) All prices and notations must be typed or printed in ink. No erasures are permitted. Mistakes may be crossed out and corrections must be initialed in ink by the person(s) signing the bid.
 - f) Proposals sent by email, facsimile, or other electronic means will not be considered unless specifically authorized in this RFP.

- g) All costs incurred in the preparation and presentation of the bid are the Bidder's sole responsibility; no pre-bid costs will be reimbursed to any Bidder. All documentation submitted with the proposal will become the property of the City of Flint.

The City of Flint and their officials have the vested authority to execute a contract, subject to City Council and Mayoral approval where required.

If the City does not consent, Contractor may proceed with an action in a court of competent jurisdiction within the State of Michigan. Any unanimous decision of the three arbitrators shall be a final binding decision. The City's failure to respond to a timely, conforming request for arbitration is deemed consent to arbitration.

- 15) **NONCOMPLIANCE:** Failure to deliver in accordance with specifications will be cause for the City of Flint and they may cancel the contract or any part thereof and purchase on the open market, charging any additional cost to the Contractor/Vendor.
- 16) **DISCLAIMER OF CONTRACTUAL RELATIONSHIP:** Nothing contained in these documents shall create any contractual relationship between the City and any Subcontractor or Sub-subcontractor.
- 17) **ERRORS AND OMISSIONS:** Bidder is not permitted to take advantage of any obvious errors or omissions in specifications.

- 18) **INTERPRETATION:** In the event that any provision contained herein shall be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction or an appropriate administrative tribunal to be contrary to the provision of law or to be unenforceable for any reason, then, to the extent necessary and possible to render the remainder of this Agreement enforceable, such provision may be modified or severed by such court or administrative tribunal having jurisdiction over this Agreement and the interpretation thereof, or the parties hereto, so as to, as nearly as possible, carry out the intention of the parties hereto, considering the purpose of the entire Agreement in relation to such provision.
- 19) **LAWS AND ORDINANCES:** The Bidder shall obey and abide by all of the laws, rules and regulations of the Federal Government, State of Michigan, Genesee County and the City of Flint, applicable to the performance of this Agreement, including, but not limited to, labor laws, and laws regulating or applying to public improvement, local government, and its operational requirements.
- 20) **LOCAL PREFERENCE:** Contractors/bidders located within the corporate city limits of Flint, Michigan may be given a seven percent (7%) competitive price advantage. Bidder, if required, must furnish satisfactory evidence of quality materials; offers of experimental or unproven equipment may be disregarded.
- 22) **MODIFICATIONS/CHANGES:** Any modification to this agreement must be in writing and signed by the authorized employee, officer, board or council representative authorized to make such modifications pursuant to the State law and local ordinances.
- 23) **NON-COLLUSION:** The Bidder acknowledges that by signing this document that she/he/they is/are duly authorized to make said offer on behalf of the company she/he/they represent(s) and that said bid is genuine and not sham or collusive and not made in the interests or on behalf of any person not therein named, and that she/he/they and said bidder have not directly induced or solicited any other person(s) or corporation to refrain from responding to this solicitation and that she/he/they and said bidder have not in any manner sought by collusion to secure to themselves and said bidder any advantage over any other bidder.

- 24) **NON-DISCRIMINATION:** Pursuant to the requirements of 1976 P.A. 453 (Michigan Civil Rights Act) and 1976 P.A. 220 (Michigan Handicapped Rights Act), the local unit and its agent agree not to discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment with respect to hire, tenure, terms, conditions, or privileges of employment or a matter directly or indirectly related to employment because of race, color, religion, national origin, age, sex, height, weight, marital status or because of a handicap that is unrelated to the person's ability to perform the duties of nondiscrimination provision identical to this provision and binding upon any and all contractors and subcontractors. A breach of this covenant shall be regarded as a material breach of this contract.
- 25) **SUBCONTRACTING:** No subcontract work shall be started prior to the written approval of the subcontractor by the City. The City reserves the right to accept or reject any subcontractor.
- 26) **UNION COMPLIANCE:** Bidder agrees to comply with all regulations and requirements of any national or local union(s) that may have jurisdiction over any of the materials, facilities, services or personnel to be furnished by the City.

Should Force Majeure occur, the parties shall mutually agree on the terms and conditions upon which the services may continue.
- 33) **INDEMNIFICATION:** To the fullest extent permitted by law, Bidder agrees to defend, pay on behalf of, indemnify, and hold harmless the City of Flint, its elected and appointed officials, employees and volunteers and others working on behalf of the City of Flint, including the Project Manager, against any and all claims, demands, suits, or losses, including all costs connected therewith, and for any damages which may be asserted, claimed, or recovered against or from the City of Flint, its elected and appointed officials, employees, volunteers or others working on behalf of the City of Flint, by reason of personal injury, including bodily injury or death and/or property damage, including loss of use thereof, which may arise as a result of Bidder's acts, omissions, faults, and negligence or that of any of his employees, agents, and representatives in connection with the performance of this contract. Should the Bidder fail to indemnify the City in the above-mentioned circumstances, the City may exercise its option to deduct the cost that it incurs from the contract price forthwith. *These provisions shall survive the termination or expiration of any agreement entered into as a result of this request.*
- 34) **INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR:** No provision of this contract shall be construed as creating an employer-employee relationship. It is hereby expressly understood and agreed that Bidder is an "independent contractor" as that phrase has been defined and interpreted by the courts of the State of Michigan and, as such, Bidder is not entitled to any benefits not otherwise specified herein.
- 35) **NO THIRD-PARTY BENEFICIARY:** No contractor, subcontractor, mechanic, material man, laborer, vendor, or other person dealing with the principal Contractor shall be, nor shall any of them be deemed to be, third-party beneficiaries of this contract, but each such person shall be deemed to have agreed (a) that they shall look to the principal Contractor as their sole source of recovery if not paid, and (b) except as otherwise agreed to by the principal Contractor and any such person in writing, they may not enter any claim or bring any such action against the City under any circumstances. Except as provided by law, or as otherwise agreed to in writing between the City and such person, each such person shall be deemed to have waived in writing all rights to seek redress from the City under any circumstances whatsoever.
- 36) **NON-ASSIGNABILITY:** Contractor shall not assign or transfer any interest in this contract without the prior written consent of the City provided, however, that claims for money due or to become due to Contractor from the City under this contract may be assigned to a bank, trust company, or other financial institution without such approval. Notice of any such assignment or transfer shall be furnished promptly to the City.
- 37) **NON-DISCLOSURE/CONFIDENTIALITY:** Contractor agrees that the documents identified herein as the contract documents are confidential information intended for the sole use of the City and that Contractor will not disclose any such information, or in any other way make such documents public, without the express written approval of the City or the order of the court of appropriate jurisdiction or as required by the laws of the State of Michigan.

- 38) **RECORDS PROPERTY OF CITY:** All documents, information, reports and the like prepared or generated by Contractor as a result of this contract shall become the sole property of the City of Flint.
- 39) **SEVERABILITY:** In the event that any provision contained herein shall be determined by a court or administrative tribunal to be contrary to a provision of state or federal law or to be unenforceable for any reason, then, to the extent necessary and possible to render the remainder of this Agreement enforceable, such provision may be modified or severed by such court or administrative tribunal so as to, as nearly as possible, carry out the intention of the parties hereto, considering the purpose of the entire Agreement in relation to such provision. The invalidation of one or more terms of this contract shall not affect the validity of the remaining terms.
- 40) **TERMINATION:** This contract may be terminated by either party hereto by submitting a notice of termination to the other party. Such notice shall be in writing and shall be effective 30 days from the date it is submitted unless otherwise agreed to by the parties hereto. Contractor, upon receiving such notice and prorated payment upon termination of this contract shall give to the City all pertinent records, data, and information created up to the date of termination to which the City, under the terms of this contract, is entitled.
- 41) **TIME PERFORMANCE:** Contractor's services shall commence immediately upon receipt of the notice to proceed and shall be carried out forthwith and without reasonable delay.
- 42) **EVALUATION OF PROPOSAL:** In the City's evaluation of proposals, at minimum: cost, serviceability, financial stability, and all requirements set forth in this document shall be considered as selection and award criteria unless otherwise specified.
- 43) **PREVAILING WAGE:** When applicable, all work for state and federal funded projects must meet Davis-Bacon Act requirements and full prevailing wage. Information on Davis-Bacon reporting and requirements, including payroll reporting, can be found at: <https://www.dol.gov/whd/govcontracts/dbra.htm>
- 44) **BONDS – PAYMENT AND PERFORMANCE:** The City of Flint may request that before any contract, exceeding \$50,000.00 for the construction, alteration, or repair of any public building or public work or improvement of the state or a county, city, village, township, school district, public educational institution, other political subdivision, public authority, or public agency hereinafter referred to as the "governmental unit", is awarded, the proposed contractor, hereinafter referred to as the "principal contractor", shall furnish at his or her own cost to the governmental unit a performance bond and a payment bond which shall become binding upon the award of the contract to the principal contractor. (b) Workers Compensation Insurance in accordance with Michigan statutory requirements, including Employers Liability coverage.

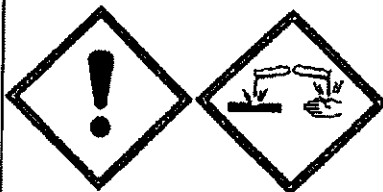

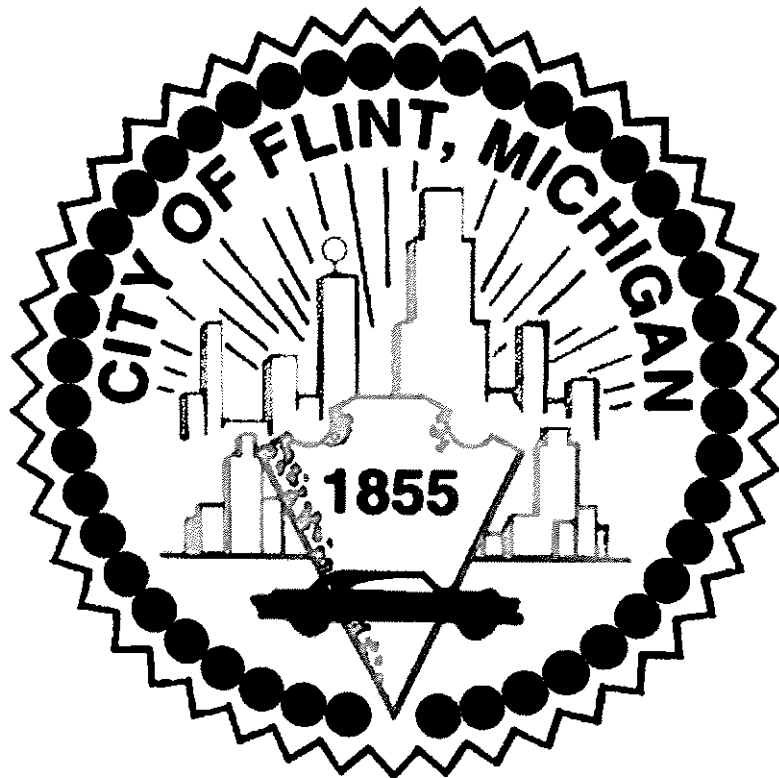

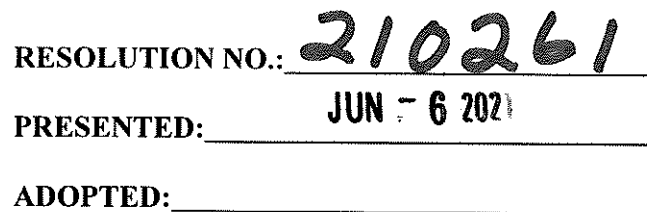

On Tuesday, March 10, 2020, Governor Gretchen Whitmer declared a State of Emergency after two individuals were confirmed testing presumptively positive for COVID-19. - 2) **RFP MODIFICATIONS:** The City of Flint has the right to correct, modify or cancel the RFP, in whole or in part, or to reject any Bid, in whole or in part, within the discretion of the City of Flint, or their designee. If any such changes are made, all known recipients of the RFP will be sent a copy of such changes. If any changes are made to this RFP document by any party other than the City of Flint, the original document in the City of Flint's files takes precedence.
- 3) **PROPOSAL SUBMISSION:**
 - a) The Bidder must include the following items, or the proposal may be deemed non-responsive:
 - i) All forms contained in this RFP, fully completed.

 - 8) **PROCUREMENT POLICY:** Procurement for the City of Flint will be handled in a manner providing fair opportunity to all businesses. The City of Flint and their officials have the vested authority to execute a contract, subject to City Council and Mayoral approval where required.
 - 9) **BID SIGNATURES:** Bids must be signed by an authorized official of the Bidder Each signature represents binding commitment upon the Bidder to provide the goods and/or services offered to the City of Flint if the Bidder is determined to be the lowest Responsive and Responsible Bidder.
 - 10) **CONTRACT AWARD/SPLIT AWARDS:** The City of Flint reserves the right to award by item, group of items, or total bid. The Bidder to whom the award is made will be notified at the earliest possible date. Any unanimous decision of the three arbitrators shall be a final binding decision. The City's failure to respond to a timely, conforming request for arbitration is deemed consent to arbitration.
 - (c) The costs of the arbitration shall be split and borne equally between the parties and such costs are not subject to shifting by the arbitrator.
 - (d) Contractor's failure to comply with any portion (including timeliness) of this provision shall be deemed a permanent waiver and forfeiture of the claim, dispute, or question.
 - (e) This provision shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement in perpetuity.

- 17) **ERRORS AND OMISSIONS:** Bidder is not permitted to take advantage of any obvious errors or omissions in specifications.

- 18) **INTERPRETATION:** In the event that any provision contained herein shall be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction or an appropriate administrative tribunal to be contrary to the provision of law or to be unenforceable for any reason, then, to the extent necessary and possible to render the remainder of this Agreement enforceable, such provision may be modified or severed by such court or administrative tribunal having jurisdiction over this Agreement and the interpretation thereof, or the parties hereto, so as to, as nearly as possible, carry out the intention of the parties hereto, considering the purpose of the entire Agreement in relation to such provision.
- 19) **LAWS AND ORDINANCES:** The Bidder shall obey and abide by all of the laws, rules and regulations of the Federal Government, State of Michigan, Genesee County and the City of Flint, applicable to the performance of this Agreement, including, but not limited to, labor laws, and laws regulating or applying to public improvement, local government, and its operational requirements.
- 20) **LOCAL PREFERENCE:** Contractors/bidders located within the corporate city limits of Flint, Michigan may be given a seven percent (7%) competitive price advantage. Additionally, if the lowest responsible bidder is not located within the limits of the City of Flint, but is located within the County of Genesee, and said bidder does not exceed the bid of the lowest non-local bidder by more than three and one-half percent (3-1/2%), then said lowest Genesee County bidder may be determined to be the lowest responsible bidder, and make the award to such Genesee County bidder accordingly, subject to the approval of the City Council. If the lowest non-local bidder does not exceed that of any Proposers/bidders by (7%) inside the City of Flint or (3-1/2%) inside the County of Genesee, then the Purchasing Director shall be allowed to request that the lowest local vendor match the price offered by the lowest non-local vendor.
- 21) **MATERIAL WORKMANSHIP AND STANDARDS OF PERFORMANCE:** The Bidder agrees to exercise independent judgment and to complete performance under this Agreement in accordance with sound professional practices. In entering into this Agreement, the City is relying upon the professional reputation, experience, certification and ability of the Bidder by her/him/themselves or by others employed by her/him/them and working under their direction and control. The continued effectiveness of this Agreement during its term or any renewal term shall be contingent, in part, upon the Bidder maintaining her/his/their operating qualifications in accordance with the requirements of federal, state and local laws. All materials furnished must be new, of latest model and standard first grade quality, or best workmanship and design, unless otherwise expressly specified. Bidder, if required, must furnish satisfactory evidence of quality materials; offers of experimental or unproven equipment may be disregarded.
- 22) **MODIFICATIONS/CHANGES:** Any modification to this agreement must be in writing and signed by the authorized employee, officer, board or council representative authorized to make such modifications pursuant to the State law and local ordinances.
- 23) **NON-COLLUSION:** The Bidder acknowledges that by signing this document that she/he/they is/are duly authorized to make said offer on behalf of the company she/he/they represent(s) and that said bid is genuine and not sham or collusive and not made in the interests or on behalf of any person not therein named, and that she/he/they and said bidder have not directly induced or solicited any other person(s) or corporation to refrain from responding to this solicitation and that she/he/they and said bidder have not in any manner sought by collusion to secure to themselves and said bidder any advantage over any other bidder.

- 24) **NON-DISCRIMINATION:** Pursuant to the requirements of 1976 P.A. 453 (Michigan Civil Rights Act) and 1976 P.A. 220 (Michigan Handicapped Rights Act), the local unit and its agent agree not to discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment with respect to hire, tenure, terms, conditions, or privileges of employment or a matter directly or indirectly related to employment because of race, color, religion, national origin, age, sex, height, weight, marital status or because of a handicap that is unrelated to the person's ability to perform the duties of nondiscrimination provision identical to this provision and binding upon any and all contractors and subcontractors. A breach of this covenant shall be regarded as a material breach of this contract.
- 25) **SUBCONTRACTING:** No subcontract work shall be started prior to the written approval of the subcontractor by the City. The City reserves the right to accept or reject any subcontractor.
- 26) **UNION COMPLIANCE:** Bidder agrees to comply with all regulations and requirements of any national or local union(s) that may have jurisdiction over any of the materials, facilities, services or personnel to be furnished by the City.
- 27) **WAIVER:** Failure of the City to insist upon strict compliance with any of the terms, covenants or conditions of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of that term, covenant or condition or of any other term, covenant or condition. Any waiver or relinquishment of any right or power hereunder at any one or more times shall not be deemed a waiver or relinquishment of that right or power at any other time.
- 28) **CITY INCOME TAX WITHHOLDING:** Contractor and any subcontractor engaged in this contract shall withhold from each payment to his employees the City income tax on all of their compensation subject to tax, after giving effect to exemptions, as follows:
- a) Residents of the City:
At a rate equal to 1% of all compensation paid to the employee who is a resident of the City of Flint.
 - b) Non-residents:
At a rate equal to 1/2% of the compensation paid to the employee for work done or services performed in the City of Flint.
- These taxes shall be held in trust and paid over to the City of Flint in accordance with City ordinances and State law. Any failure to do so shall constitute a substantial and material breach of this contract.
- 29) **CONTRACT DOCUMENTS:** The invitation for proposal, instructions to proposal, proposal, affidavit, addenda (if any), statement of Bidder's qualifications (when required), general conditions, special conditions, performance bond, labor and material payment bond, insurance certificates, technical specifications, and drawings, together with this agreement, form the contract, and they are as fully a part of the contract as if attached hereto or repeated herein.
- 30) **DISCLAIMER OF CONTRACTUAL RELATIONSHIP WITH SUBCONTRACTORS:** Nothing contained in the Contract Documents shall create any contractual relationship between the City and any Subcontractor or Sub-subcontractor.
- 31) **EFFECTIVE DATE:** Any agreement between the City and the Bidder shall be effective upon the date that it is executed by all parties hereto.

- 32) **FORCE MAJEURE:** Neither party shall be responsible for damages or delays caused by Force Majeure nor other events beyond the control of the other party and which could not reasonably have anticipated the control of the other party and which could not reasonably have been anticipated or prevented. For purposes of this Agreement, Force Majeure includes, but is not limited to, adverse weather conditions, floods, epidemics, war, riot, strikes, lockouts, and other industrial disturbances; unknown site conditions, accidents, sabotage, fire, and acts of God. Should Force Majeure occur, the parties shall mutually agree on the terms and conditions upon which the services may continue.
- 33) **INDEMNIFICATION:** To the fullest extent permitted by law, Bidder agrees to defend, pay on behalf of, indemnify, and hold harmless the City of Flint, its elected and appointed officials, employees and volunteers and others working on behalf of the City of Flint, including the Project Manager, against any and all claims, demands, suits, or losses, including all costs connected therewith, and for any damages which may be asserted, claimed, or recovered against or from the City of Flint, its elected and appointed officials, employees, volunteers or others working on behalf of the City of Flint, by reason of personal injury, including bodily injury or death and/or property damage, including loss of use thereof, which may arise as a result of Bidder's acts, omissions, faults, and negligence or that of any of his employees, agents, and representatives in connection with the performance of this contract. Should the Bidder fail to indemnify the City in the above-mentioned circumstances, the City may exercise its option to deduct the cost that it incurs from the contract price forthwith. *These provisions shall survive the termination or expiration of any agreement entered into as a result of this request.*

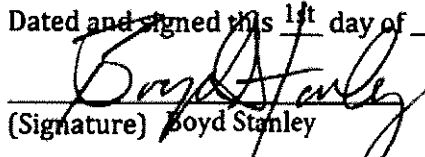

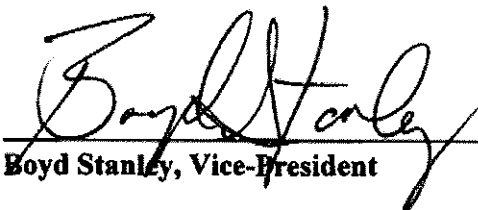

General Instructions

Section references are to the Internal Revenue Code unless otherwise noted.

Purpose of Form

A person who is required to file an information return with the IRS must obtain your correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) to report, for example, income paid to you, real estate transactions, mortgage interest you paid, acquisition or abandonment of secured property, cancellation of debt, or contributions you made to an IRA.

Use Form W-9 only if you are a U.S. person (including a resident alien), to provide your correct TIN to the person requesting it (the requester) and, when applicable, to:

1. Certify that the TIN you are giving is correct (or you are waiting for a number to be issued),
2. Certify that you are not subject to backup withholding, or
3. Claim exemption from backup withholding if you are a U.S. exempt payee. If applicable, you are also certifying that as a U.S. person, your allocable share of any partnership income from a U.S. trade or business is not subject to the withholding tax on foreign partners' share of effectively connected income.

Note. If a requester gives you a form other than Form W-9 to request your TIN, you must use the requester's form if it is substantially similar to this Form W-9.

Definition of a U.S. person. For federal tax purposes, you are considered a U.S. person if you are:

- An individual who is a U.S. citizen or U.S. resident alien,
- A partnership, corporation, company, or association created or organized in the United States or under the laws of the United States,
- An estate (other than a foreign estate), or
- A domestic trust (as defined in Regulations section 301.7701-7).

Special rules for partnerships. Partnerships that conduct a trade or business in the United States are generally required to pay a withholding tax on any foreign partners' share of income from such business. Further, in certain cases where a Form W-9 has not been received, a partnership is required to presume that a partner is a foreign person, and pay the withholding tax. Therefore, if you are a U.S. person that is a partner in a partnership conducting a trade or business in the United States, provide Form W-9 to the partnership to establish your U.S. status and avoid withholding on your share of partnership income.

The person who gives Form W-9 to the partnership for purposes of establishing its U.S. status and avoiding withholding on its allocable share of net income from the partnership conducting a trade or business in the United States is in the following cases:

- The U.S. owner of a disregarded entity and not the entity,

- The U.S. grantor or other owner of a grantor trust and not the trust, and
- The U.S. trust (other than a grantor trust) and not the beneficiaries of the trust.

Foreign person. If you are a foreign person, do not use Form W-9. Instead, use the appropriate Form W-8 (see Publication 515, Withholding of Tax on Nonresident Aliens and Foreign Entities).

Nonresident alien who becomes a resident alien. Generally, only a nonresident alien individual may use the terms of a tax treaty to reduce or eliminate U.S. tax on certain types of income. However, most tax treaties contain a provision known as a "saving clause." Exceptions specified in the saving clause may permit an exemption from tax to continue for certain types of income even after the payee has otherwise become a U.S. resident alien for tax purposes.

If you are a U.S. resident alien who is relying on an exception contained in the saving clause of a tax treaty to claim an exemption from U.S. tax on certain types of income, you must attach a statement to Form W-9 that specifies the following five items:

1. The treaty country. Generally, this must be the same treaty under which you claimed exemption from tax as a nonresident alien.
2. The treaty article addressing the income.
3. The article number (or location) in the tax treaty that contains the saving clause and its exceptions.
4. The type and amount of income that qualifies for the exemption from tax.
5. Sufficient facts to justify the exemption from tax under the terms of the treaty article.

Example. Article 20 of the U.S.-China income tax treaty allows an exemption from tax for scholarship income received by a Chinese student temporarily present in the United States. Under U.S. law, this student will become a resident alien for tax purposes if his or her stay in the United States exceeds 5 calendar years. However, paragraph 2 of the first Protocol to the U.S.-China treaty (dated April 30, 1984) allows the provisions of Article 20 to continue to apply even after the Chinese student becomes a resident alien of the United States. A Chinese student who qualifies for this exception (under paragraph 2 of the first protocol) and is relying on this exception to claim an exemption from tax on his or her scholarship or fellowship income would attach to Form W-9 a statement that includes the information described above to support that exemption.

If you are a nonresident alien or a foreign entity not subject to backup withholding, give the requester the appropriate completed Form W-8.

What is backup withholding? Persons making certain payments to you must under certain conditions withhold and pay to the IRS 28% of such payments. This is called "backup withholding." Payments that may be subject to backup withholding include interest, tax-exempt interest, dividends, broker and barter exchange transactions, rents, royalties, nonemployee pay, and certain payments from fishing boat operators. Real estate transactions are not subject to backup withholding.

You will not be subject to backup withholding on payments you receive if you give the requester your correct TIN, make the proper certifications, and report all your taxable interest and dividends on your tax return.

Payments you receive will be subject to backup withholding if:

1. You do not furnish your TIN to the requester,
2. You do not certify your TIN when required (see the Part II instructions on page 3 for details),
3. The IRS tells the requester that you furnished an incorrect TIN,

4. The IRS tells you that you are subject to backup withholding because you did not report all your interest and dividends on your tax return (for reportable interest and dividends only), or

5. You do not certify to the requester that you are not subject to backup withholding under 4 above (for reportable interest and dividend accounts opened after 1983 only).

Certain payees and payments are exempt from backup withholding. See the instructions below and the separate Instructions for the Requester of Form W-9.

Penalties

Failure to furnish TIN. If you fail to furnish your correct TIN to a requester, you are subject to a penalty of \$50 for each such failure unless your failure is due to reasonable cause and not to willful neglect.

Civil penalty for false information with respect to withholding. If you make a false statement with no reasonable basis that results in no backup withholding, you are subject to a \$500 penalty.

Criminal penalty for falsifying information. Willfully falsifying certifications or affirmations may subject you to criminal penalties including fines and/or imprisonment.

Misuse of TINs. If the requester discloses or uses TINs in violation of federal law, the requester may be subject to civil and criminal penalties.

Specific Instructions

Name

If you are an individual, you must generally enter the name shown on your income tax return. However, if you have changed your last name, for instance, due to marriage without informing the Social Security Administration of the name change, enter your first name, the last name shown on your social security card, and your new last name.

Limited liability company (LLC). Check the "Limited liability company" box only and enter the appropriate code for the tax classification ("D" for disregarded entity, "C" for corporation, "P" for partnership) in the space provided.

For a single-member LLC (including a foreign LLC with a domestic owner) that is disregarded as an entity separate from its owner under Regulations section 301.7701-3, enter the owner's name on the "Name" line. Enter the LLC's name on the "Business name" line.

For an LLC classified as a partnership or a corporation, enter the LLC's name on the "Name" line and any business, trade, or DBA name on the "Business name" line.

Other entities. Enter your business name as shown on required federal tax documents on the "Name" line. This name should match the name shown on the charter or other legal document creating the entity. You may enter any business, trade, or DBA name on the "Business name" line.

Note. You are requested to check the appropriate box for your status (individual/sole proprietor, corporation, etc.).

Exempt Payee

If you are exempt from backup withholding, enter your name as described above and check the appropriate box for your status, then check the "Exempt payee" box in the line following the business name, sign and date the form.

Generally, individuals (including sole proprietors) are not exempt from backup withholding. Corporations are exempt from backup withholding for certain payments, such as interest and dividends.

Note. If you are exempt from backup withholding, you should still complete this form to avoid possible erroneous backup withholding.

The following payees are exempt from backup withholding:

1. An organization exempt from tax under section 501(a), any IRA, or a custodial account under section 403(b)(7) if the account satisfies the requirements of section 401(f)(2),
2. The United States or any of its agencies or instrumentalities,
3. A state, the District of Columbia, a possession of the United States, or any of their political subdivisions or instrumentalities,
4. A foreign government or any of its political subdivisions, agencies, or instrumentalities, or
5. An international organization or any of its agencies or instrumentalities.

Other payees that may be exempt from backup withholding include:

6. A corporation,
7. A foreign central bank of issue,
8. A dealer in securities or commodities required to register in the United States, the District of Columbia, or a possession of the United States,
9. A futures commission merchant registered with the Commodity Futures Trading Commission,
10. A real estate investment trust,
11. An entity registered at all times during the tax year under the Investment Company Act of 1940,
12. A common trust fund operated by a bank under section 584(a),
13. A financial institution,
14. A middleman known in the investment community as a nominee or custodian, or
15. A trust exempt from tax under section 664 or described in section 4947.

Part I. Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN)

You can get Forms W-7 and SS-4 from the IRS by visiting www.irs.gov or by calling 1-800-TAX-FORM (1-800-829-3676).

If you are asked to complete Form W-9 but do not have a TIN, write "Applied For" in the space for the TIN, sign and date the form, and give it to the requester. For interest and dividend payments, and certain payments made with respect to readily tradable instruments, generally you will have 60 days to get a TIN and give it to the requester before you are subject to backup withholding on payments. The 60-day rule does not apply to other types of payments. You will be subject to backup withholding on all such payments until you provide your TIN to the requester.

Note. Entering "Applied For" means that you have already applied for a TIN or that you intend to apply for one soon.

Caution: A disregarded domestic entity that has a foreign owner must use the appropriate Form W-8.

Part II. Certification

2. Interest, dividend, broker, and barter exchange accounts opened after 1983 and broker accounts considered inactive during 1983. You must sign the certification or backup withholding will apply. If you are subject to backup withholding and you are merely providing your correct TIN to the requester, you must cross out item 2 in the certification before signing the form.

3. Real estate transactions. You must sign the certification. You may cross out item 2 of the certification.

4. Other payments. You must give your correct TIN, but you do not have to sign the certification unless you have been notified that you have previously given an incorrect TIN. "Other payments" include payments made in the course of the requester's trade or business for rents, royalties, goods (other than bills for merchandise), medical and health care services (including payments to corporations), payments to a nonemployee for services, payments to certain fishing boat crew members and fishermen, and gross proceeds paid to attorneys (including payments to corporations).

5. The most common act is sending an email to a user falsely claiming to be an established legitimate enterprise in an attempt to scam the user into surrendering private information that will be used for identity theft.

The IRS does not initiate contacts with taxpayers via emails. Also, the IRS does not request personal detailed information through email or ask taxpayers for the PIN numbers, passwords, or similar secret access information for their credit card, bank, or other financial accounts.

If you receive an unsolicited email claiming to be from the IRS, forward this message to phishing@irs.gov. You may also report misuse of the IRS name, logo, or other IRS personal property to the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration at 1-800-366-4484. You can forward suspicious emails to the Federal Trade Commission at: spam@uce.gov or contact them at www.consumer.gov/idtheft or 1-877-IDTHEFT(438-4338).

Privacy Act Notice

The City of Flint Water Pollution Control (herein referred to as WPC) is seeking qualified washer compactor manufacturers to supply a new compactor for its East Pumping Station. This bid shall include all necessary engineering, integration, consultation, recommendations and oversight required to provide a complete and functioning compaction equipment. WPC shall have the final decision on all equipment, design, engineering, programming and recommendations

1.1 SUMMARY**A. SCOPE OF WORK**

Manufacturer shall supply an interleaving, dual auger washer compactor assembly as detailed in the following specifications. A single unit shall provide washing and compacting action on wastewater screenings collected from two (2) existing Duperon barscreens located at the City's East Pumping Station.

B. QUALITY ASSURANCE

- 1 All equipment supplied under this section shall be of a single manufacturer and demonstrate, to the satisfaction of the City, that the quality is equal to equipment made by those manufacturers specifically named herein.
- 2 The equipment furnished shall be fabricated, assembled, erected, and placed in proper operating condition in full conformity with approved drawings, specifications, engineering data, and/or recommendations furnished by the equipment manufacturer.

1.2 SUBMITTALS

The equipment manufacturer shall submit the following items:

1. (4)- Sets of Shop Drawings, including: Main Layout Drawings, List of Equipment Specifications, and Recommendations furnished by the Equipment Manufacturer.
2. (4)- Sets As-Built Drawings of Washer Compactor Structure, Controls, and Accessories (as applicable)
3. Detailed description of how to integrate controls with the existing conveyor and two (2)- Duperon bar screen controls.
4. List of Spare Parts and Special Tools (as applicable).
5. (4)- Sets O&M Manuals (including As-Built Drawings) to be provided after equipment ships for inclusion in the close-out Submittal process.

1.3 QUALITY ASSURANCE

- A. The Washer Compactor shall be fully assembled and shop tested at the manufacturing facility prior to shipment. Shop testing shall include a minimum of 4 hours of run time.
- B. To assure quality and performance All equipment furnished under this Section and related sections shall be of a single manufacturer who has been regularly engaged in the design and manufacture of the equipment and demonstrates, to the satisfaction of the City, that the quality is equal to equipment made by those manufacturers specifically named herein. 2.2 BASIS OF DESIGN

- A. Compacting Action:** The Washer Compactor shall have dual augers to provide positive displacement action. Augers shall be oriented on top of each other and rotate in opposing directions. Augers shall be intermeshed, with one left-hand and one right-hand lead. Augers shall be designed with a limited float on top of a strainer to allow for the accommodation of irregular debris.
- B. Washing Action:** The Washer Compactor shall have a wash water manifold integrated into the main housing. Two ports inside the unit shall emit a medium pressure stream. Wash water shall run continuously when the Washer Compactor is in motion. Continuous operation (non-batching) equipment is required; filling- and batching-type equipment shall not be accepted.
- C. Operation:** The Washer Compactor shall be continuous run, not requiring an operator. The Washer Compactor shall be equipped with a self-regulating, active pressure zone designed to accept non-standard wastewater debris in its original form, including but not limited to: rocks; broken concrete; and metal (such as bolts or short pipe) up to 4 inches long. 2.3 COMPONENTS

- A. **Main Housing:** The main housing of the Washer Compactor shall be constructed of stainless steel (material options contained in table) with a minimum thickness of 11 gauge. Support and flange connections shall be 3/8 inch
- B. **Hopper:** The hopper of the Washer Compactor shall be constructed of stainless steel with a minimum thickness of 11 gauge. Manufacturer shall measure and design the hopper to fit under the existing conveyor.
- C. **Augers:** The augers shall be of stainless steel with 8-inch diameter flights, 3/8 inch-thick, with 4-inch flight pitch. The augers shall be coupled to a transmission at the drive end and be supported at the compaction end with UHMW plane bearings. This arrangement shall allow for the accommodation of irregular debris. The auger shaft shall be 2-inch stainless steel schedule 40 pipe with 2-inch solid stainless steel stub shaft
- D. **Compaction Housing:** The compaction housing of the Washer Compactor shall be 1/4 inch stainless steel and shall house a spring and gate assembly to provide the resistance for compaction. The compaction housing shall contain the auger supports
- E. **Discharge Chute:** The discharge chute of the Washer Compactor shall be constructed of stainless steel with a minimum thickness of 14 gauge. Support and flange connections shall be 1/4 inch. The discharge chute shall be tapered outward toward the discharge end. Manufacturer shall measure and design the discharge chute to run from the end of the conveyor to dumpster shed.
- F. **Water Supply:** The water supply shall connect at a single point with a 1/2 inch NPT female connector. A NEMA 7/9 Explosion proof solenoid valve is provided to limit the wash water flow to only when the washer compactor is running. Ball valves shall be provided to distribute flow to the washing and trough sprayer connections
- G. **Strainer:** A strainer shall be located beneath the lower auger to filter the washed solids. The strainer shall be removable via drain trough and pressed against the lower auger with spring pressure. The strainer shall be self-cleaning through continuous, even contact with the lower auger. Strainers requiring auger-mounted brushes will not be accepted
- H. **Drain Trough:** A removable pan shall be provided beneath the main housing to collect wash water. Wash water shall be drained through a 3 inch NPT male drain port. The pan shall be a minimum of 11-gauge stainless steel.
- I. **Drive Assembly:**
1. Each Washer Compactor unit shall operate independently, with its own drive unit and driven components. The gearbox shall not be vented to the outside atmosphere.
 2. The gearbox shall be grease lubricated and designed for 5 years (or 20,000 hours of operation) between recommended clean and re-grease services. The gearbox shall be right angle type, and shall incorporate cycloidal and spiral bevel gearing with a total ratio of 123:1. The gear reducer output shaft speed shall be 3.5 RPM minimum to 14.2 RPM maximum and controlled by an AC Tech, vector-type inverter (or greater service factor) based on unit torque requirements. It shall be shaft-mounted utilizing the keyless Taper-Grip bushing.
 3. The motor shall be mounted to the gear reducer by utilizing a quill, C-Face mounting style. The motor shall be AC induction type, 5 HP, 3/60/230/460 volt, explosion-proof, inverter-duty model
 4. The drive assembly shall incorporate the Duperon® standard coating system.
- J. **Auger Transmission:**
1. The Drive Assembly shall be coupled to a dual gear transmission, which drives the augers in a counter-rotation.
 2. The spur gears are contained in a stainless steel housing and supported by Delrin (or equivalent) plane bearing.
 3. Grease fittings shall be located outside of the transmission housing to provide lubrication to the gears.
- K. **Speed Reducer:** The Speed Reducer shall have a maximum output of 14.2 RPM, 123:1 reduction ratio with 18,900 in-lb. of output torque.
- L. **Thrust Bearings:** Thrust Bearings shall be Delrin (or equivalent), self-lubricating, and be capable of withstanding a minimum of 2000 lb. of thrust load (each auger) at 14.2 RPM for life of machine.

- M. **Screw Supports:** Screw supports shall be UHWM plane type, self-lubricating, and fastened into place using stainless steel fasteners.

2.4 ELECTRICAL, CONTROLS, INSTRUMENTATION

- A. **General:** Controls for the washer compactor shall be in an enclosure provided by the washer compactor manufacturer. The washer compactor manufacturer shall be responsible for proper sizing and function of the controls at 480V. **Note that the washer compactor controls must be interlocked with the main control panel of the bar screens and conveyors.**

1. Controls shall be designed to accept incoming power supply per specs and shall include a step-down transformer as needed to achieve 120V.
2. Control Panel shall be constructed to meet the appropriate NEMA classification requirements and will include a main, lockable disconnect. The panel will be constructed by a UL certified control panel build facility and will be supported by the appropriate UL labeling.
3. Controls shall be tested prior to shipment to owner. The washer compactor manufacturer shall verify all overload settings in the motor controller to insure proper overload and speed settings required for the application are properly programmed.
4. Control panel shall be wired complete with a minimum of #16 MTW wire in the appropriate colors for the circuits being supplied. 120VAC control shall be red, grounded AC neutral shall be white, DC control shall be blue, DC neutral shall be blue with a white tracer, equipment ground shall be green and all incoming and outgoing external power source wires shall be a yellow configuration. All AC power wiring shall be a minimum of #12 Black. All wires shall be labeled at both ends with heat-shrink wire markers. Internal panel wiring shall be contained in non-flammable, covered wire way.
5. All panel and panel mounted devices shall be labeled with engraved I.D. markers that reference back to the system schematics. Tags shall be white with black core, engraved as required.
6. All field wiring and power cables between the washer compactor Main Control Panel and the Local Push Button Station shall be provided by others

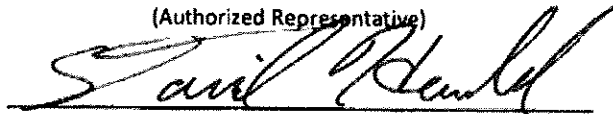

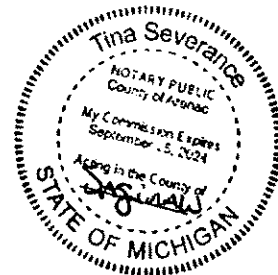

Mechanical Screen/Washer Compactor Process Control Narrative for Flint P9450

Process Description

The existing facility houses two mechanical bar screening channels. All channels have manually operated slide gates at their inlet and outlet for channel isolation and/or hydraulic control. Two submersible level transducers are mounted in each channel upstream and downstream of the existing mechanical screen for screen control and alarming. Ideally, the screens will run continuously any time there is at least one foot of influent level in the channel and the screens will speed up based on a high influent level or high differential level signal.

A new washer-compactor will receive screenings from the existing Conveyor to the new washer compactor inlet hopper, and will wash, compact, and convey the screenings to a site provided disposal bin. Drainage / wash water will return to the screening channel by gravity and will be plumbed by others.

Operation

The mechanical screens are controlled by the Screening Main Control Panel with PLC logic and door-mounted operator interface located in the control room of the Headworks building. The Screening Main Control Panel has a Hand/Off/Auto selector, elapsed run-time meter, main disconnect and indication for 'Power On', 'Forward', 'VFD Fault', and 'Motor Overtemp'. It also contains a variable frequency drive to control the speed of the multi-rake, adjustable on/off cycle timers, and hard contacts/Ethernet communication for SCADA interlock. In Hand Mode, the screen utilizes input signals from the local pushbutton panel. A local control push-button station is located directly adjacent to the multi-rake bar screen, and includes 'Forward', 'Jog Reverse' and 'E-Stop' buttons. These buttons enable the operator to reverse the direction of the rake movement to address service issues, and allow for emergency shut-down. In Auto Mode, the mechanical screens are controlled by the Screening Main Control Panel. Under normal flow conditions, when the differential level, as measured by the two submersible level transducers, is between the low (level TBD) and high (level TBD, less than 12") set points, the screens operate continuously at a normal speed/speed proportional to the differential. If the differential level is below the low set point, the screens will operate intermittently, as controlled by a cycle timer in the Main Control Panel at an operator-adjustable interval. If the differential level exceeds the high set point, the screen will move to high speed operation in an attempt reduce blinding. When the upstream channel level exceeds the high channel level setpoint, the screen will start (if not already running based on differential level) and operate at high speed. An alarm is also sent to SCADA, as this could indicate a blockage in the mechanical screen or abnormal flow condition that requires operator attention. The motor thermostat will shut down the equipment if motor over-temperature condition occurs.

The existing Conveyor located behind the screens runs when either screen is running and has an off delay timer to continue running for a period of time once both screens have shut off. The conveyor will deposit the screenings into the new washer compactor Inlet hopper. The washer-compactor will be controlled by its own Washer Compactor Main Control Panel to be located in the control room of the building. The Washer Compactor Main Control Panel will be Relay Logic based and include a

Hand/Off/Auto selector, speed controller, elapsed run-time meter, push-to-test indicator lights for 'Power On', 'Forward', 'VFD Fault', and 'Motor Overtemp'. It will also contain a variable frequency drive to control the speed of the augers, and hard contacts for SCADA interlock. In Hand Mode, the washer-compactor will utilize input signals from the local pushbutton panel. A new local pushbutton panel for the washer-compactor will be located adjacent to the washer-compactor, and will include 'Forward', 'Jog Reverse' and 'E-Stop' buttons. In Auto Mode, the washer-compactor will be controlled by the Washer Compactor Main Control Panel, and will operate whenever the existing conveyor is operating. The speed of the compactor augers will be controlled by a user adjustable VFD and will be set to run from the factory at a normal speed of (30Hz). The wash water solenoid valve will be open whenever the washer compactor is running to wash and flush the washer compactor perforated plate strainer. In the absence of an input signal or upon receiving a stop signal in Auto mode, an off-delay timer allows debris to finish depositing, including upon cessation of mechanical screen operation. The motor thermostat will shut down the Washer Compactor if motor over-temperature condition ever occurs as well as send an alarm to SCADA.

The Terms and Conditions ("Terms") contained herein shall apply to any and all Equipment sales by Duperon Corporation, Inc. ("Duperon Corporation") to Purchasers ("Purchasers"). These Terms apply in lieu of any course of dealing between the parties or usage of trade in the industry. Any changes in the Terms contained herein must specifically be agreed to in writing and signed by Duperon Corporation before becoming binding on either party. The sale and purchase of Equipment described herein shall be governed exclusively by the foregoing and the following Terms.

- 1 **ACCEPTANCE:** Any prior Duperon Corporation price quotation or pricing letter is for Purchaser's information only. Duperon Corporation shall only be bound by written confirmation of acceptance of the proposal. All Purchaser orders and agreements are expressly conditioned upon assent to these terms and conditions. Terms additional to or different from those in these terms and conditions are rejected. Duperon Corporation and Purchaser agree that these terms and conditions are accepted in good faith by both parties as the controlling terms and conditions notwithstanding Section 2-207 of the Uniform Commercial Code, as enacted. Duperon Corporation's commencement of performance is not to be construed as acceptance of any of Purchaser's terms or conditions. Duperon Corporation may commence performance in reliance on Purchaser's acceptance of these terms and conditions.
- 2 **SPECIFICATIONS:** The proposal or Equipment may not be in strict compliance with the Engineer's/Owner's plans, specifications, or addenda as there may be deviations. The Equipment will meet the mechanical specifications as described by Duperon Corporation.
- 3 **ITEMS INCLUDED:** Duperon Corporation's offer includes only the listed Equipment and does not include erection, installation, accessories or associated materials such as controls, piping, etc.
- 4 **PARTIES TO CONTRACT:** Duperon Corporation is not a party to or bound by the terms of any other Purchaser contract, agreement, or understanding with third-parties and Duperon Corporation's duties are limited to this proposal with Purchaser to which there are no intended third-party beneficiaries.
- 5 **PRICE AND DELIVERY:** All selling prices quoted are subject to change without notice after 30 days from the date of a proposal unless specified otherwise. Unless otherwise stated, all prices are F.O.B. Duperon Corporation or its supplier's shipping points with freight allowed. All claims for damage, delay or shortage shall be made by Purchaser directly against the carrier. When shipments are quoted F.O.B. job site or other designation, Purchaser shall inspect the Equipment shipped, notifying Duperon Corporation of any damage or shortage within forty-eight hours of receipt. Failure to so notify Duperon Corporation shall constitute acceptance by Purchaser, relieving Duperon Corporation of any liability for shipping damages or shortages.
- 6 **PAYMENTS:** All invoices are net 30 days. Delinquencies and failure to pay after demand by Duperon Corporation are subject to a 1.5% service charge per month or the maximum permitted by law, whichever is less, on all past due accounts. Pro rata payments are due as shipments are made. If shipments are delayed by the Purchaser, invoices shall be sent on the date when Duperon Corporation is prepared to make shipment and payment shall become due under standard invoicing terms. If the work to be performed hereunder is delayed by the Purchaser, payments shall be based on percentage of completion. Unless specifically stated otherwise, prices quoted are for Equipment only. If at any time the financial condition of the Purchaser gives Duperon Corporation, in its judgment, doubt concerning the Purchaser's ability to pay, Duperon Corporation may require full or partial payment in advance or may suspend any further deliveries or continuance of the work to be performed by Duperon Corporation until such payment has been received or terminate its contract.

- Employer's Liability - \$100,000 each accident/\$100,000 disease - each employee
- \$500,000 disease - policy limit

Professional Liability – Covering acts, errors or omissions of a professional nature committed or alleged to have been committed by the Contractor or any of its subcontractors. Depending on the subject matter of the transaction, the City may require other insurance coverage in addition to the coverage's contained herein.

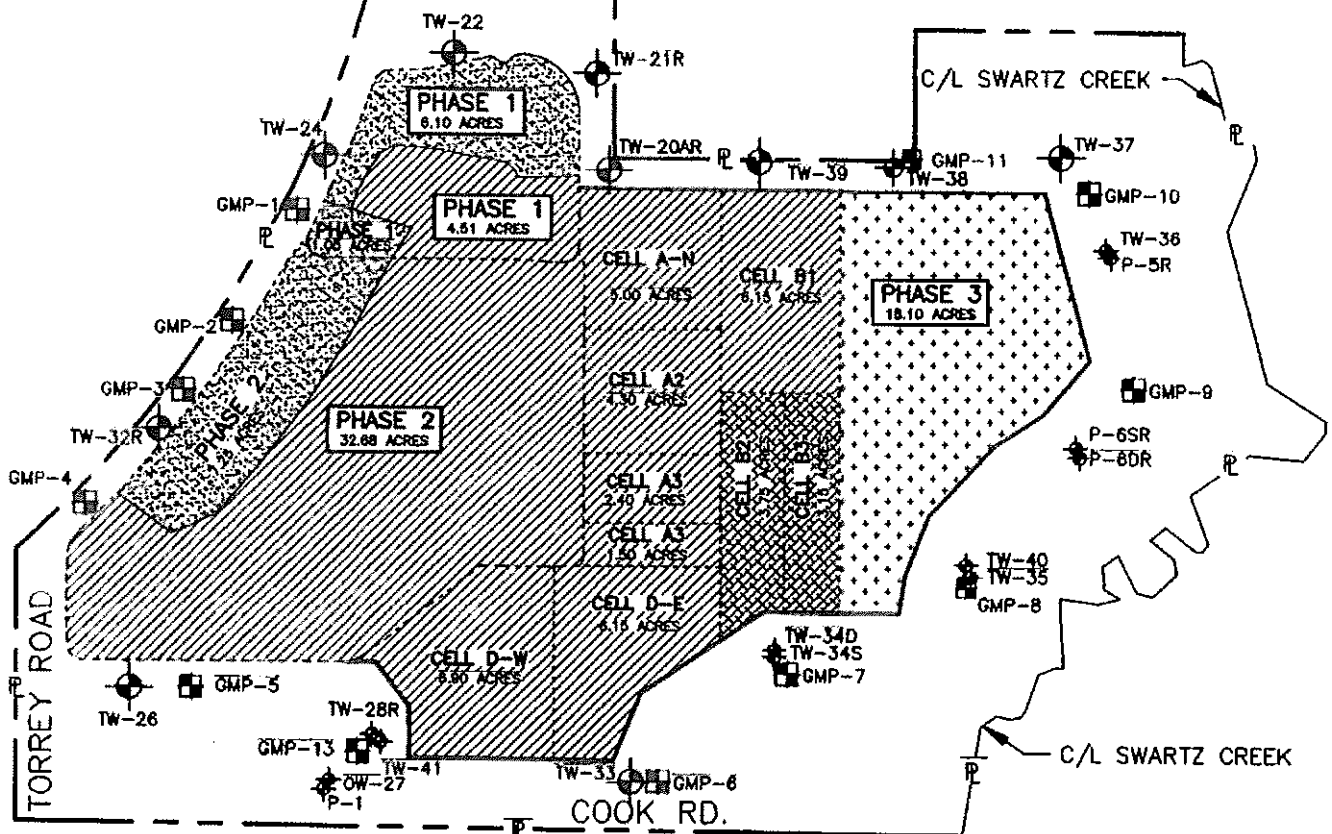

SPECIAL ALTERNATIVE LIMITS (SALS)

Local limits under an IPP are commonly determined using a uniform allocation methodology. While providing the required environmental protection, this approach restricts treatment plant utilization and development of the local economy.

Due to reduced flows and pollutant loads, many communities are experiencing issues with WWTP utilization and operating margins. Many communities also have industrial users that, if allowed, could discharge more while paying extra-strength surcharges. Local limit allocations can be viewed as pieces of a pie that represents the Maximum Allowable Headworks Loading (MAHL). Like a real pie, there is nothing left when all the pieces have been claimed.

A uniform local limit, while straightforward to implement, has several disadvantages:

- Artificially depletes available capacity by allocating load to industrial users which do not need it.
- Offers minimal flexibility to accommodate special needs of certain industrial users.
- Reduces surcharge revenue by requiring pretreatment of compatible pollutants, even when the WWTP is underutilized.

SALs represent an alternate local limit allocation approach which is rapidly gaining popularity. Conceptually, SALs are simply an extension of the uniform allocation method:

- Set aside a portion of the MAHL as reserve.
- Uniformly allocate what remains.
- When SAL assigned, withdraw from reserve.

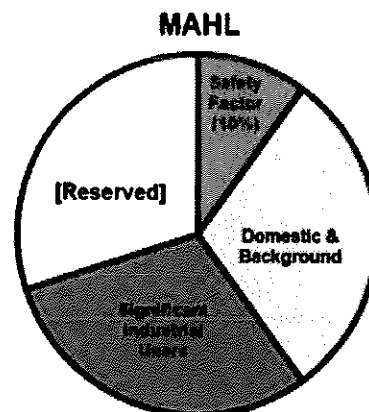
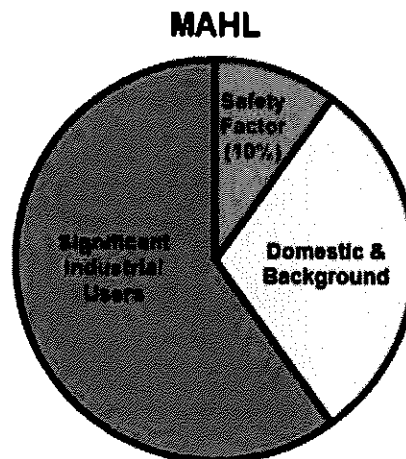

SURCHARGE RATE EVALUATIONS

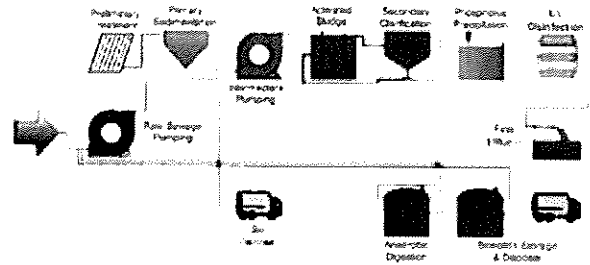
Many communities find it beneficial to regularly reevaluate extra-strength surcharge rates to reflect current wastewater treatment costs. Outdated rates may decrease justifiable revenues, prevent some users from paying their fair share, or place an undue economic burden on other users.

To help maintain up-to-date surcharge rates, Fishbeck has developed a software package to accurately determine O&M costs to treat extra-strength discharges of compatible pollutants from nondomestic sources. Calibrated with the site-specific process configuration and performance/cost data, this software is linked with a state-of-the-art computer program using USEPA models for municipal treatment facilities.

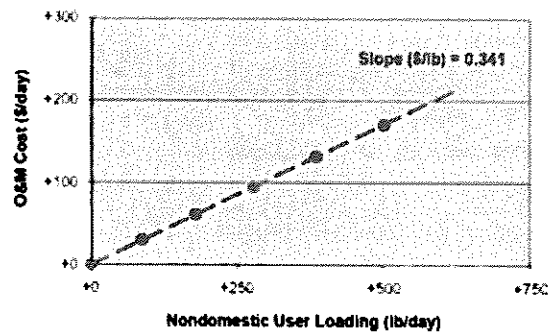
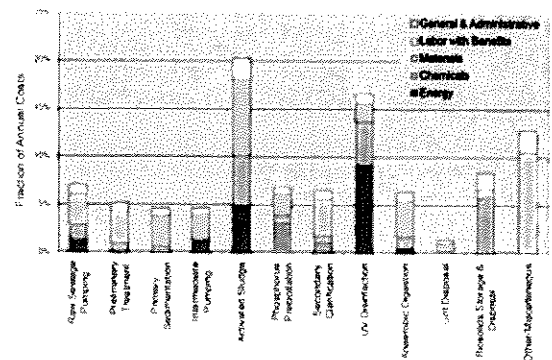

Project Understanding and Approach

Fishbeck understands the City seeks a qualified consultant to provide as-needed support for the City of Flint – Water Pollution Control (WPC) regulatory compliance program during fiscal years 2021, 2022, and 2023. We also understand the City's needs are dependent on specific issues that arise during that time, so this contract's scope of services must remain flexible.

THE PAST AND PRESENT...

Our ability to respond to the City's needs is best demonstrated by our performance on the WPC's Regulatory Assistance Program over the past 18 years. We successfully provided services for a wide range of projects, including the tasks highlighted below:

NPDES Permit Negotiations

Helped WPC staff and the City's attorney negotiate the renewal of Flint's NPDES discharge permits with the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ), now the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes & Energy (EGLE). Evaluated conceptual designs and costs of retention basin options to mitigate wet weather overflows. Developed a master plan for the Mercury Minimization Program. Provided technical expertise resulting in the MDEQ's acceptance of a less restrictive effluent limit for low-level mercury.

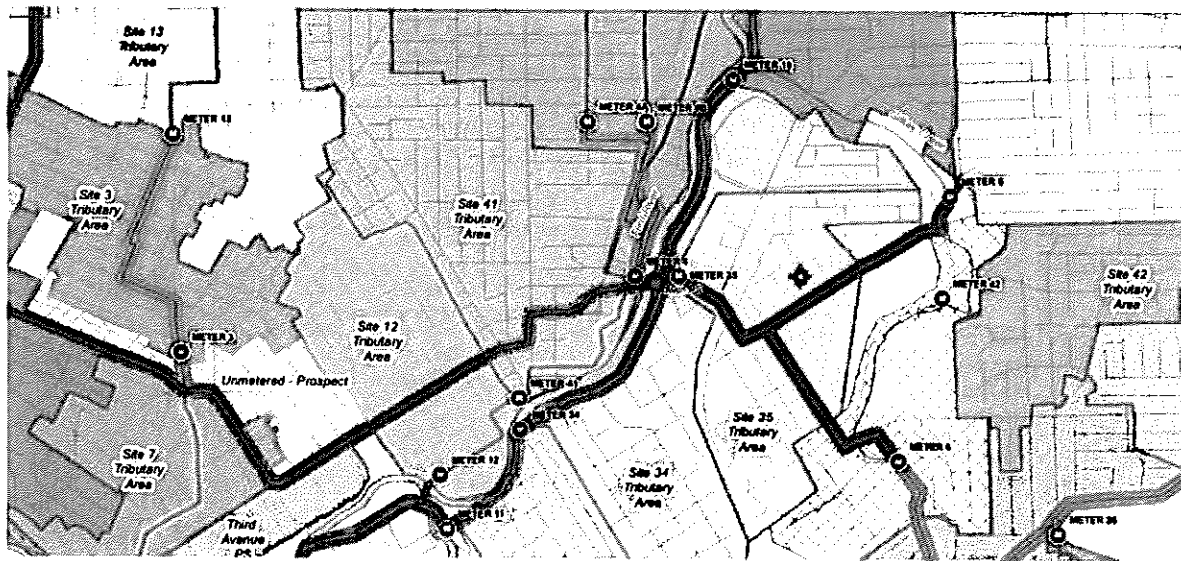
Industrial Pretreatment Program (IPP)

Performed a headworks loading reevaluation of the WPC for compatible pollutants. Assisted in negotiations with the MDEQ that led to the approval of a flexible Special Allocation Limit (SAL) program for regulating the City's industrial users. Provided technical consultation to the City's attorney for drafting a new sewer use ordinance. Helped develop a headworks load accounting system, which provides the City with a tool for the straightforward monitoring of pollutant allocations to non-domestic users.

Wet Weather Management

Worked with the City to select metering locations, assist with installation and troubleshooting, and provide data analysis for over 30 locations throughout the system from the onset of the City's Flow Metering program nearly 18 years ago.

Prepared a detailed map of the City's overall collection system (pictured below) using as-built drawings provided by the City. Developed a dynamic hydraulic model of main trunk lines using a commercial software package (XP-SWMM). Helped WPC staff purchase new and replacement flow meters for the collection system and provided field support to install/relocate these meters at selected points across the City. Assisted in the installation of cell modems in select locations to automate the meter data uploading process, relieving some time constraints for busy field staff. Fishbeck routinely worked with WPC staff to review metering data and determine locations for future flow metering.



Prepared an extensive flow capacity report in accordance with NPDES permit requirements. Helped conduct evaluations aimed at determining whether the system can achieve the MDEQ's wet weather capacity standard (i.e., 25-year/24-hour storm event during growth conditions and normal soil moisture). Prepared capacity assessment reports in accordance with NPDES permit requirements. Provided data from a temporary flow meter to help WPC staff identify suspicious discharges from a non-domestic user (OilChem).

Asset Management

Advised on the WPC's capital improvements program for improving and upgrading the plant. Investigated biosolids disposal options, including capital/O&M cost estimates of alternatives. Evaluated influent and effluent flow measurement systems, leading to improvements and improved accuracy. Provided structural repair assessment of influent junction chamber and primary tank influent channels. Provided technical support to upgrade the WPC grit removal system. Provided design services to improve the chlorine gas system, including evaluating sodium hypochlorite as an alternate chemical for disinfection. Provided design services to repair and replace components of system feeding polymer to the solids dewatering process. Helped evaluate the reactivation of anaerobic digester tanks for proposed waste-to-energy modifications; performed structural assessment of necessary repairs. Provided electrical engineering support for motor control center upgrade, leading to new monitoring instrumentation and improved process control. Performed architectural assessment of a former process building to control deterioration during idle period. Assisted with the evaluation of upgrade alternatives for the Northwest Pump Station to improve pumping efficiency, reliability, and effectiveness.

Other Regulatory Support

Provided technical assistance to update the WPC's Process Safety Management (PSM) program, ensuring compliance with federal regulations for highly hazardous chemicals. This included an audit of the overall program and updating PSM documentation.

Provided Risk Management Plan (RMP) consulting services including conducting the required RMP audit, submitting the RMP renewal, and updating the City's RMP documentation.

THE FUTURE...

As the City moves to another 3-year WPC regulatory compliance program, Fishbeck is eager to continue to provide the regulatory services the City needs. We anticipate the following tasks and associated activities, as follows.

Task 1 — NPDES Permit Negotiation and Support

Fishbeck is prepared to continue assisting the City with NPDES permit negotiations and related activities. Our team is fully knowledgeable in the state and federal wastewater regulations, and has longstanding relationships with EGLE staff.

Our experience with the City's permit, as well as NPDES permits in general, could be useful for negotiating the term of the anticipated draft NPDES permit. We also would be available for assisting with Whole Effluent Toxicity (WET) tests, administering the Mercury Minimization Program, addressing issues that may arise related to PFAS or other emerging contaminants of concern, assisting in the City's response to EGLE on an NPDES-related enforcement action, and other general permit-required activities.

Task 2 — Wet Weather Management

Fishbeck is prepared to continue providing as-needed assistance to evaluate the collection and treatment system's capacity for flows relative to EGLE's wet weather standard.

Combining our experience with the City's previous flow studies with the now fully operational XP-SWMM model, we could seek to further define the site-specific relationship between rainfall intensity to plant flows. This would involve the ongoing assessment of collection system details, updating system maps, and evaluating collected data on plant flows, river elevations, and rainfall.

We could continue evaluating the data collected from flow meters installed in the collection system, including additional updates to the XP-SWMM model. The City completed a SAW Grant in 2018 which included an update to the City-wide sewer system GIS database. This allows for the opportunity to expand the hydraulic model into upstream areas of the system that may be of interest to the City. These areas may include portions of the system that are susceptible to sanitary sewer overflow or an area that is a candidate for future rehabilitation. We will also provide guidance on additional metering recommended to define the flow characteristics of the given areas.

We could also continue identifying area(s) within the model boundaries where the predicted flow exceeds the collection system's capacity and quantifying any additional storage volume and/or source removal required to meet the wet weather capacity standard. We have previously used the hydraulic model and metering data to identify sewersheds with excessive inflow and infiltration that should be targeted for future investigation. This is an evolving process that would be beneficial to reevaluate annually, as areas of the system are rehabilitated, and new data flow measurements are collected.

Fishbeck can also provide recommendations on where to focus on future flow monitoring efforts. We understand the collection system group continues to line sewers in localized areas where there are structural issues that can also affect infiltration. We can provide assistance with post-sewer lining flow metering to quantify flow reductions from sewer rehabilitation efforts.

Task 3 – IPP Assistance

With extensive experience in all facets of this federally-mandated program, we are prepared to provide a variety of IPP-related services when needed by the WPC. Our team is fully knowledgeable in both the state and federal IPP regulations and has longstanding relationships with EGLE staff providing local and statewide oversight.

Our prior experience drafting the City's current sewer use ordinance could be useful in support of efforts to further revise the ordinance, or to work cooperatively with other jurisdictions to update their ordinances. We observe many communities to be challenged by the need for up-to-date interjurisdictional agreements on IPP requirements and administration.

Our general IPP experience could also be useful if the City seeks to revise its headworks loading evaluations for compatible or toxic pollutants. We have worked with EGLE to develop alternate methods for calculating background loads, allowing for less stringent local limits. Fishbeck is experienced and available for other IPP-related activities the City may require; these could include updating the IPP Manual of Procedures, reevaluating extra-strength surcharge rates, and assisting in the City's response to EGLE on an IPP-related enforcement action.

Note: Fishbeck is not currently working for any industrial users of the WPC. While we have previous involvement on a few relatively small environmental projects for General Motors (in Grand Rapids and Lansing) and for Delphi and Country Fresh (in West Michigan), none of these projects would constitute a conflict of interest relative to serving as IPP consultant to the City.

Task 4 —Asset Management

Fishbeck is familiar with the City's Asset Management Plan and the 5-year Project Plan, and is prepared to assist with implementation of this plan either through discussions with EGLE or as a technical advisor for the implementation of the plan. With our prior experience at the City and grant/loan opportunities for other communities in Michigan, this could be a continuation of our previous work with the WPC's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) and to help implement the City's Asset Management Plan as well as the 5-year Project Plan.

Task 5 – Stormwater Management Program

Fishbeck staff members with extensive familiarity of the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) regulations are available on an as-needed basis to assist with the City's Stormwater Management Program. Such assistance could include preparation for an MS4 compliance audit by developing program updates, reviewing the overall program, or conducting a mock audit. We can also help with future planning, as we continuously maintain an awareness of what is evolving at the state/federal levels. Elements for which our expertise is particularly suitable include:

- Public education plan.
- Illicit discharge elimination program.
- Post-construction stormwater control for new development and redevelopment projects.
- Brownfield sites where contaminated seepage might be problematic inputs to storm sewers.
- Municipal pollution prevention and good housekeeping activities.

Other As-Needed Tasks

We understand, because this contract covers three years, currently unanticipated tasks may appear. Our team, supplemented by additional Fishbeck staff members, has the technical expertise to assist with a wide variety of assignments.

We are able to assist the City with the next RMP compliance audit due no later than July 22, 2022, and the next PSM compliance audit due no later than September 6, 2022.

If an issue arises outside of our expertise, we will work with WPC staff to select and retain an appropriate subconsultant. We will then oversee these subconsultants to ensure an effective, economical resolution for the City.

Schedule | Cost of Services

Because this is an as-needed contract, individual tasks must have a flexible budget and schedule. The scope, budget, and schedule for each task will be discussed with Ms. Best, or her designee, at the time of the request. Adjustments will then be made, as appropriate, to match the City's needs and available funding. To effectively manage the contract, each task will be assigned a separate project number and invoiced separately. This approach will ensure that, if the full contract budget is not required, the excess funds will not be spent.

Services will be on a time-and-materials basis, using hourly rates in effect when the work is performed. Our current standard rate schedule is enclosed. Direct reimbursable expenses such as company vehicles, special equipment, copying, etc., will be billed at Fishbeck's current rates. Other reimbursable expenses, including outside subcontracted services, will generally be billed at our standard of actual charges plus 10 percent.

Fishbeck will continue to apply the following project management philosophy that has been successfully used for the WPC regulatory assistance contracts, of which the last six were with Fishbeck:

- As each task arises, hold general discussions with Ms. Best, or her designee, regarding the City's goals and objectives.
- Agree on scope, schedule, and budget before proceeding.
- Clearly communicate the City-Fishbeck agreement to a senior project specialist, which is selected based on appropriate experience and expertise. For those situations where specialized services are warranted, we will work with City staff to identify and retain qualified subconsultants.
- Provide an activity report with each invoice to summarize how the City's funds were expended, as demonstrated by the attached report from a recent invoice.
- Periodically follow-up with Ms. Best, or her designee, to ensure the City's goals and objectives are being met.

We have attached figures of the final budget status since fiscal year (FY) 2003, when the City initially retained Fishbeck as the WPC's regulatory consultant. These figures clearly demonstrate how our contract management has consistently responded to the City's needs while maintaining costs at, or below, the allocated budgets.

She understands the need to develop a cost-effective plan to abate, or at least manage, the excess flows. Task 3 – Industrial Pretreatment Program (IPP) Assistance

Ms. Haybarker will also lead the Fishbeck team assisting WPC staff with the City's IPP. 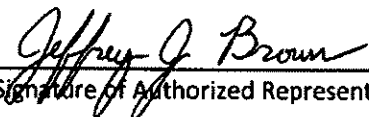

On May 26, 2020, the Proper City Officials authorized the issuance of a contract to Spalding DeDecker for the Miller Rd. rehabilitation from Hammerberg to Ballenger Hwy. The original scope of work included a water main design for the entire length of the project. This was removed from the scope of work between the submittal of the preliminary plans and the final submittal package to MDOT. This caused substantial revisions to the design. The cost of removing the water main and making substantial changes to the design has resulting in additional fees in the amount of \$25,000.00

FACT SHEET: The Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds Will Deliver \$350 Billion for State, Local, Territorial, and Tribal Governments to Respond to the COVID-19 Emergency and Bring Back Jobs

May 10, 2021

Aid to state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments will help turn the tide on the pandemic, address its economic fallout, and lay the foundation for a strong and equitable recovery

Today, the U.S. Department of the Treasury announced the launch of the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds, established by the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, to provide \$350 billion in emergency funding for eligible state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments. Treasury also released details on how these funds can be used to respond to acute pandemic response needs, fill revenue shortfalls among these governments, and support the communities and populations hardest-hit by the COVID-19 crisis. With the launch of the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds, eligible jurisdictions will be able to access this funding in the coming days to address these needs.

State, local, territorial, and Tribal governments have been on the frontlines of responding to the immense public health and economic needs created by this crisis – from standing up vaccination sites to supporting small businesses – even as these governments confronted revenue shortfalls during the downturn. As a result, these governments have endured unprecedented strains, forcing many to make untenable choices between laying off educators, firefighters, and other frontline workers or failing to provide other services that communities rely on. Faced with these challenges, state and local governments have cut over 1 million jobs since the beginning of the crisis. The experience of prior economic downturns has shown that budget pressures like these often result in prolonged fiscal austerity that can slow an economic recovery.

To support the immediate pandemic response, bring back jobs, and lay the groundwork for a strong and equitable recovery, the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 established the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds, designed to deliver \$350 billion to state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments to bolster their response to the COVID-19 emergency and its economic impacts. Today, Treasury is launching this much-needed relief to:

- Support urgent COVID-19 response efforts to continue to decrease spread of the virus and bring the pandemic under control;
- Replace lost public sector revenue to strengthen support for vital public services and help retain jobs;
- Support immediate economic stabilization for households and businesses; and,
- Address systemic public health and economic challenges that have contributed to the unequal impact of the pandemic on certain populations.

The Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds provide substantial flexibility for each jurisdiction to meet local needs—including support for households, small businesses, impacted industries, essential workers, and the communities hardest-hit by the crisis. These funds also deliver resources that recipients can invest in building, maintaining, or upgrading their water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure.

Starting today, eligible state, territorial, metropolitan city, county, and Tribal governments may request Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds through the Treasury Submission Portal. Concurrent with this program launch, Treasury has published an Interim Final Rule that implements the provisions of this program.

FUNDING AMOUNTS

The American Rescue Plan provides a total of \$350 billion in Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to help eligible state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments meet their present needs and build the foundation for a strong recovery. Congress has allocated this funding to tens of thousands of jurisdictions. These allocations include:

Treasury expects to distribute these funds directly to each state, territorial, metropolitan city, county, and Tribal government. Local governments that are classified as non-entitlement units will receive this funding through their applicable state government. Treasury expects to provide further guidance on distributions to non-entitlement units next week.

Local governments should expect to receive funds in two tranches, with 50% provided beginning in May 2021 and the balance delivered 12 months later. States that have experienced a net increase in the unemployment rate of more than 2 percentage points from February 2020 to the latest available data as of the date of certification will receive their full allocation of funds in a single payment; other states will receive funds in two equal tranches. Governments of U.S. territories will receive a single payment. Tribal governments will receive two payments, with the first payment available in May and the second payment, based on employment data, to be delivered in June 2021.

USES OF FUNDING

Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds provide eligible state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments with a substantial infusion of resources to meet pandemic response needs and rebuild a stronger, more equitable economy as the country recovers. Within the categories of eligible uses, recipients have broad flexibility to decide how best to use this funding to meet the needs of their communities. Recipients may use Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to:

- **Support public health expenditures**, by funding COVID-19 mitigation efforts, medical expenses, behavioral healthcare, and certain public health and safety staff;
- **Address negative economic impacts caused by the public health emergency**, including economic harms to workers, households, small businesses, impacted industries, and the public sector;
- **Replace lost public sector revenue**, using this funding to provide government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue experienced due to the pandemic;
- **Provide premium pay for essential workers**, offering additional support to those who have borne and will bear the greatest health risks because of their service in critical infrastructure sectors; and,
- **Invest in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure**, making necessary investments to improve access to clean drinking water, support vital wastewater and stormwater infrastructure, and to expand access to broadband internet.

Within these overall categories, Treasury's Interim Final Rule provides guidelines and principles for determining the types of programs and services that this funding can support, together with examples of allowable uses that recipients may consider. As described below, Treasury has also designed these provisions to take into consideration the disproportionate impacts of the COVID-19 public health emergency on those hardest-hit by the pandemic.

1. Supporting the public health response

Mitigating the impact of COVID-19 continues to require an unprecedented public health response from state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments. Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds provide resources to meet these needs through the provision of care for those impacted by the virus and through services that address disparities in public health that have been exacerbated by the pandemic. Recipients may use this funding to address a broad range of public health needs across COVID-19 mitigation, medical expenses, behavioral healthcare, and public health resources. Among other services, these funds can help support:

- **Services and programs to contain and mitigate the spread of COVID-19, including:**
 - ✓ Vaccination programs
 - ✓ Medical expenses
 - ✓ Testing
 - ✓ Contact tracing
 - ✓ Isolation or quarantine
 - ✓ PPE purchases
 - ✓ Support for vulnerable populations to access medical or public health services
 - ✓ Public health surveillance (e.g., monitoring for variants)
 - ✓ Enforcement of public health orders
 - ✓ Public communication efforts
 - ✓ Enhancement of healthcare capacity, including alternative care facilities
 - ✓ Support for prevention, mitigation, or other services in congregate living facilities and schools
 - ✓ Enhancement of public health data systems
 - ✓ Capital investments in public facilities to meet pandemic operational needs
 - ✓ Ventilation improvements in key settings like healthcare facilities

- **Services to address behavioral healthcare needs exacerbated by the pandemic, including:**
 - ✓ Mental health treatment
 - ✓ Substance misuse treatment
 - ✓ Other behavioral health services
 - ✓ Hotlines or warmlines
 - ✓ Crisis intervention
 - ✓ Services or outreach to promote access to health and social services
- **Payroll and covered benefits expenses** for public health, healthcare, human services, public safety and similar employees, to the extent that they work on the COVID-19 response. For public health and safety workers, recipients can use these funds to cover the full payroll and covered benefits costs for employees or operating units or divisions primarily dedicated to the COVID-19 response.

2. **Addressing the negative economic impacts caused by the public health emergency**

The COVID-19 public health emergency resulted in significant economic hardship for many Americans. As businesses closed, consumers stayed home, schools shifted to remote education, and travel declined precipitously, over 20 million jobs were lost between February and April 2020. Although many have since returned to work, as of April 2021, the economy remains more than 8 million jobs below its pre-pandemic peak, and more than 3 million workers have dropped out of the labor market altogether since February 2020.

To help alleviate the economic hardships caused by the pandemic, Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds enable eligible state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments to provide a wide range of assistance to individuals and households, small businesses, and impacted industries, in addition to enabling governments to rehire public sector staff and rebuild capacity. Among these uses include:

- **Delivering assistance to workers and families**, including aid to unemployed workers and job training, as well as aid to households facing food, housing, or other financial insecurity. In addition, these funds can support survivor's benefits for family members of COVID-19 victims.
- **Supporting small businesses**, helping them to address financial challenges caused by the pandemic and to make investments in COVID-19 prevention and mitigation tactics, as well as to provide technical assistance. To achieve these goals, recipients may employ this funding to execute a broad array of loan, grant, in-kind assistance, and counseling programs to enable small businesses to rebound from the downturn.
- **Speeding the recovery of the tourism, travel, and hospitality sectors**, supporting industries that were particularly hard-hit by the COVID-19 emergency and are just now beginning to mend. Similarly impacted sectors within a local area are also eligible for support.
- **Rebuilding public sector capacity**, by rehiring public sector staff and replenishing unemployment insurance (UI) trust funds, in each case up to pre-pandemic levels. Recipients may also use this funding to build their internal capacity to successfully implement economic relief programs, with investments in data analysis, targeted outreach, technology infrastructure, and impact evaluations.

3. **Serving the hardest-hit communities and families**

While the pandemic has affected communities across the country, it has disproportionately impacted low-income families and communities of color and has exacerbated systemic health and economic inequities. Low-income and socially vulnerable communities have experienced the most severe health impacts. For example, counties with high poverty rates also have the highest rates of infections and deaths, with 223 deaths per 100,000 compared to the U.S. average of 175 deaths per 100,000.

Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds allow for a broad range of uses to address the disproportionate public health and economic impacts of the crisis on the hardest-hit communities, populations, and households. Eligible services include:

- **Addressing health disparities and the social determinants of health**, through funding for community health workers, public benefits navigators, remediation of lead hazards, and community violence intervention programs;
- **Investments in housing and neighborhoods**, such as services to address individuals experiencing homelessness, affordable housing development, housing vouchers, and residential counseling and housing navigation assistance to facilitate moves to neighborhoods with high economic opportunity;
- **Addressing educational disparities** through new or expanded early learning services, providing additional resources to high-poverty school districts, and offering educational services like tutoring or afterschool programs as well as services to address social, emotional, and mental health needs; and,
- **Promoting healthy childhood environments**, including new or expanded high quality childcare, home visiting programs for families with young children, and enhanced services for child welfare-involved families and foster youth.

Governments may use Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to support these additional services if they are provided:

- within a Qualified Census Tract (a low-income area as designated by the Department of Housing and Urban Development);
- to families living in Qualified Census Tracts;
- by a Tribal government; or,
- to other populations, households, or geographic areas disproportionately impacted by the pandemic.

4. **Replacing lost public sector revenue**

State, local, territorial, and Tribal governments that are facing budget shortfalls may use Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to avoid cuts to government services. With these additional resources, recipients can continue to provide valuable public services and ensure that fiscal austerity measures do not hamper the broader economic recovery.

Many state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments have experienced significant budget shortfalls, which can yield a devastating impact on their respective communities. Faced with budget shortfalls and pandemic-related uncertainty, state and local governments cut staff in all 50 states. These budget shortfalls and staff cuts are particularly problematic at present, as these entities are on the front lines of battling the COVID-19 pandemic and helping citizens weather the economic downturn.

Recipients may use these funds to replace lost revenue. Treasury's Interim Final Rule establishes a methodology that each recipient can use to calculate its reduction in revenue. Specifically, recipients will compute the extent of their reduction in revenue by comparing their actual revenue to an alternative representing what could have been expected to occur in the absence of the pandemic. Analysis of this expected trend begins with the last full fiscal year prior to the public health emergency and projects forward at either (a) the recipient's average annual revenue growth over the three full fiscal years prior to the public health emergency or (b) 4.1%, the national average state and local revenue growth rate from 2015-18 (the latest available data).

For administrative convenience, Treasury's Interim Final Rule allows recipients to presume that any diminution in actual revenue relative to the expected trend is due to the COVID-19 public health emergency. Upon receiving Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds, recipients may immediately calculate the reduction in revenue that occurred in 2020 and deploy funds to address any shortfall. Recipients will have the opportunity to re-calculate revenue loss at several points through the program, supporting those entities that experience a lagged impact of the crisis on revenues.

Importantly, once a shortfall in revenue is identified, recipients will have broad latitude to use this funding to support government services, up to this amount of lost revenue.

5. Providing premium pay for essential workers

Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds provide resources for eligible state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments to recognize the heroic contributions of essential workers. Since the start of the public health emergency, essential workers have put their physical well-being at risk to meet the daily needs of their communities and to provide care for others.

Many of these essential workers have not received compensation for the heightened risks they have faced and continue to face. Recipients may use this funding to provide premium pay directly, or through grants to private employers, to a broad range of essential workers who must be physically present at their jobs including, among others:

- | | |

Treasury's Interim Final Rule emphasizes the need for recipients to prioritize premium pay for lower income workers. Premium pay that would increase a worker's total pay above 150% of the greater of the state or county average annual wage requires specific justification for how it responds to the needs of these workers.

In addition, employers are both permitted and encouraged to use Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to offer retrospective premium pay, recognizing that many essential workers have not yet received additional compensation for work performed. Staff working for third-party contractors in eligible sectors are also eligible for premium pay.

6. Investing in water and sewer infrastructure

Recipients may use Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to invest in necessary improvements to their water and sewer infrastructures, including projects that address the impacts of climate change.

Recipients may use this funding to invest in an array of drinking water infrastructure projects, such as building or upgrading facilities and transmission, distribution, and storage systems, including the replacement of lead service lines.

Recipients may also use this funding to invest in wastewater infrastructure projects, including constructing publicly-owned treatment infrastructure, managing and treating stormwater or subsurface drainage water, facilitating water reuse, and securing publicly-owned treatment works.

To help jurisdictions expedite their execution of these essential investments, Treasury's Interim Final Rule aligns types of eligible projects with the wide range of projects that can be supported by the Environmental Protection Agency's Clean Water State Revolving Fund and Drinking Water State Revolving Fund. Recipients retain substantial flexibility to identify those water and sewer infrastructure investments that are of the highest priority for their own communities.

Treasury's Interim Final Rule also encourages recipients to ensure that water, sewer, and broadband projects use strong labor standards, including project labor agreements and community benefits agreements that offer wages at or above the prevailing rate and include local hire provisions.

7. Investing in broadband infrastructure

The pandemic has underscored the importance of access to universal, high-speed, reliable, and affordable broadband coverage. Over the past year, millions of Americans relied on the internet to participate in remote school, healthcare, and work.

Yet, by at least one measure, 30 million Americans live in areas where there is no broadband service or where existing services do not deliver minimally acceptable speeds. For millions of other Americans, the high cost of broadband access may place it out of reach. The American Rescue Plan aims to help remedy these shortfalls, providing recipients with flexibility to use Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to invest in broadband infrastructure.

Recognizing the acute need in certain communities, Treasury's Interim Final Rule provides that investments in broadband be made in areas that are currently unserved or underserved—in other words, lacking a wireline connection that reliably delivers minimum speeds of 25 Mbps download and 3 Mbps upload. Recipients are also encouraged to prioritize projects that achieve last-mile connections to households and businesses.

Using these funds, recipients generally should build broadband infrastructure with modern technologies in mind, specifically those projects that deliver services offering reliable 100 Mbps download and 100

Mbps upload speeds, unless impracticable due to topography, geography, or financial cost. In addition, recipients are encouraged to pursue fiber optic investments.

In view of the wide disparities in broadband access, assistance to households to support internet access or digital literacy is an eligible use to respond to the public health and negative economic impacts of the pandemic, as detailed above.

8. Ineligible Uses

Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds provide substantial resources to help eligible state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments manage the public health and economic consequences of COVID-19. Recipients have considerable flexibility to use these funds to address the diverse needs of their communities.

To ensure that these funds are used for their intended purposes, the American Rescue Plan Act also specifies two ineligible uses of funds:

- **States and territories may not use this funding to directly or indirectly offset a reduction in net tax revenue due to a change in law from March 3, 2021 through the last day of the fiscal year in which the funds provided have been spent.** The American Rescue Plan ensures that funds needed to provide vital services and support public employees, small businesses, and families struggling to make it through the pandemic are not used to fund reductions in net tax revenue. Treasury's Interim Final Rule implements this requirement. If a state or territory cuts taxes, they must demonstrate how they paid for the tax cuts from sources other than Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Funds—by enacting policies to raise other sources of revenue, by cutting spending, or through higher revenue due to economic growth. If the funds provided have been used to offset tax cuts, the amount used for this purpose must be paid back to the Treasury.
- **No recipient may use this funding to make a deposit to a pension fund.** Treasury's Interim Final Rule defines a "deposit" as an extraordinary contribution to a pension fund for the purpose of reducing an accrued, unfunded liability. While pension deposits are prohibited, recipients may use funds for routine payroll contributions for employees whose wages and salaries are an eligible use of funds.

Treasury's Interim Final Rule identifies several other ineligible uses, including funding debt service, legal settlements or judgments, and deposits to rainy day funds or financial reserves. Further, general infrastructure spending is not covered as an eligible use outside of water, sewer, and broadband investments or above the amount allocated under the revenue loss provision. While the program offers broad flexibility to recipients to address local conditions, these restrictions will help ensure that funds are used to augment existing activities and address pressing needs.

ATHERTON RD. TO OAKLEY ST. FROM FY23 TO FY22**

On February 20, 2019, City Council authorized a resolution of support (resolution 190052) for FY2020-2023 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Projects to secure funding for improvements to Federal Aid Eligible Roads within the City of Flint's jurisdiction. The following four projects were approved: the resurfacing of Miller Rd. from Ballenger Hwy. to Hammerberg Rd.; the resurfacing of Robert T. Longway Blvd. from Chavez Dr. to E. Boulevard Dr.; resurfacing of Saginaw St. from Atherton Rd. to Oakley St., and the resurfacing of Twelfth St. from Fenton Rd. to Grand Traverse St. for a total cost of \$4,780,196.00.

At the April 21, 2021 meeting, the Genesee County Metropolitan Alliance approved the following project for the City of Flint to move up a year, from FY2023 to FY2022: resurfacing of Saginaw St. from Atherton Rd. to Oakley St. This project has been programmed with the new Highway Infrastructure Program/COVID Relief funding. By using this money, the City will only pay a 13% local match, instead of a 20% match. The new local match will be \$61,882.00.

IT IS RESOLVED, That this resolution is adopted to attest the City's support for moving the year for resurfacing of Saginaw St. from Atherton Rd. to Oakley St. from FY2023 to FY2022. The City of Flint's local match is in the amount of \$61,882.00

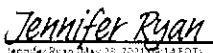
