The administration is recommending up to \$8,600,000.00 towards water bill relief in the amount of a \$300 credit per residential account, the equivalent of three months of the average water fill. Funding for this project shall come from the American Rescue Plan Act Fund (287); and

A water bill relief credit in the amount of \$300 per household meter will provide immediate financial relief to residents, many of whom are disproportionately minority and are low-to-moderate income earners. The water relief credit will be applied to those accounts with active meters as of the date credits are applied; and

IT IS RESOLVED, that the appropriate city officials are authorized to do all things necessary to facilitate a \$300 water credit per residential household, NOT-TO-EXCEED \$8,600.000.00 for those accounts with active meters as of the date credits are applied.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, the appropriate city officials are authorized to do all things necessary to facilitate either a \$300 water credit and/or a \$300 payment assistance toward the customer's past due bill with the agreement that they keep their monthly water accounts current, and make arrangements to pay on their past due account with the approval of the water department.

Before funds are distributed, the City of Flint's ARPA administration, compliance and implementation firm shall review and ensure compliance with the latest U.S. Department of Treasury final rules.

The City of Flint has acquired title to certain real estate of 1217 Root St. Parcel ID# 40-12-277-043. The property is a $60' \times 132'$ vacant lot near the intersection of Root St. and Williams in Ward 5. The lot is situated directly north of applicant address.

Pamila G. Price resides at 1213 Root St., which shares a 100% side boundary with the subject property. Under the Side Lot Acquisitions portion of the City's Property Disposition Procedures, Pamila G. Purchase Agreement

By signing this purchase agreement (Agreement), Bryan Graczyk, a married man/single man, whose address is 1585 Bear Creek Lane, Unit D, Petoskey, Michigan 49770 (Seller), and City of Flint, a Michigan Municipal Corporation, whose address is 1101 S. Saginaw Street, Flint, Michigan 48502 (Buyer), agree to sell and purchase the following real estate located in the City of Flint, Genesee County, Michigan, described as follows:

commonly known as 1563 Fenton Road, Flint, Michigan 48507 (the Property), together with all improvements and appurtenances and any other improvements, now on the Property, with Buyer to pay \$5,000.00 (the Purchase Price), subject to the existing building and use restrictions and easements of record and zoning ordinances, if any, on the following conditions:

- The following documents, attached as **Exhibit A**, are hereby incorporated by reference to this Agreement:
 - Waiver of Appraisal;
 - Letter dated April 14, 2022, to Bryan Graczyk (Good Faith Written Offer);
 and
 - Addendum to Good Faith Written Offer.

Evidence of Title

Seller will convey title to the Property to Buyer by delivery of a warranty deed conveying marketable title on tender of the Purchase Price. Payment of the Purchase Price is to be made by bank cashier's check, certified funds, a confirmed wire transfer, or a title insurance company check.

As evidence of title, Seller, at Seller's expense, agrees to furnish Buyer within 10 days of the Effective Date (as defined below), a commitment for title insurance issued by Sargent's Title Company (or a similar national title insurance company acceptable to Buyer offering a substantially similar policy of title insurance) (the Title Company) in an amount not less than the Purchase Price and bearing a date later than the acceptance date of this Agreement, with the owner's policy to be issued pursuant to the commitment insuring marketable title (as defined below) to the Property in Buyer's name.

Seller agrees that the commitment for title insurance and the subsequent policy to be issued will be without standard exceptions. It will also be recertified and updated at the closing of this transaction as of the date of the closing or the most recent date through which the county register of deeds has completed the recording and indexing of real estate instruments and documents to eliminate the "gap" period between the date of the title commitment and the closing of this transaction and to close any "gap" period between the date of closing and the date of the recording of the deed to Buyer. Seller will also arrange to provide Buyer with a marked-up commitment for title insurance at the closing of this transaction guaranteeing that title is in the condition required under this paragraph.

Seller will execute an owner's affidavit and such other documents as the title insurance company or its agent typically requires for the issuance of a policy without standard survey-related exceptions. However, Buyer will pay for the cost of any survey required for the deletion of the standard exceptions. For purposes of this Agreement, *marketable title* means fee simple title free and clear of any and all liens and encumbrances whatsoever, except only recorded and enforceable building and use restrictions, public utility easements of record, and zoning ordinances, which appear in the title commitment and will not constitute title defects or render the title to the Property unmarketable. However, Buyer, at Buyer's sole option, may elect to accept title in whatever condition it may be in, notwithstanding the condition would not meet the above definition of *marketable title* and, in such event, *marketable title* will mean the condition of title that Buyer has elected to accept.

Title Objections

If objection to the title is made in the commitment for title insurance or based on a written opinion of Buyer's attorney that the title is not in the condition required for performance of this Agreement, Seller, at Seller's sole option, will have 30 days from the date Seller is notified in writing of the particular defects claimed either (1) to fulfill the requirements in the commitment or to remedy the title defects set forth in Buyer's attorney's opinion using Seller's best efforts or (2) to refund the deposit in full termination of this Agreement. If Seller is able to comply with these requirements or remedy the defects within the time specified, as evidenced by written notification, revised commitment, or endorsement to commitment, Buyer agrees to complete the sale within 14 days of receipt of a revised commitment or endorsement to commitment, subject to any other contingency in this Agreement. If, after best efforts, Seller is unable to furnish satisfactory title within the time specified, the deposit will be immediately refunded in full termination of this Agreement, unless Buyer elects to proceed with the sale accepting the title as Seller is able to convey.

Earnest Money Deposit

No earnest money deposit shall be required from Buyer.

Taxes and Prorated Items

Seller agrees to pay all real estate taxes due and payable at the time of closing. Seller also agrees to pay any special assessment levied at the time of closing. Seller also agrees to pay any personal property taxes due and payable at the time of closing including all jeopardy assessments filed at the time of closing. Ad-valorem real property taxes will be prorated in accordance with the provisions of Act 288, P.a. 1966.

Water Escrow

No water escrow shall be required.

Personal Property

Seller and Buyer agree that the personal property identified in this Agreement is being sold together with the Property and that the consideration for the personal property is in the Purchase Price for the Property. Seller agrees to provide Buyer with a bill of sale containing standard warranties of title for the personal property being sold to Buyer as so identified. Seller further agrees to transfer to Buyer, to the extent that transfer or assignment is permitted, all warranties and guaranties relating to any equipment, fixtures, or personal property affixed to the Property or to be conveyed to Buyer. Seller further agrees to deliver to Buyer all service manuals, operating instructions, owner's manuals, repair records, service records, and the like in Seller's possession relating to the Property or any personal property, fixtures, or equipment to be sold or conveyed to Buyer.

Closing

Closing will take place at the office of the Title Company. If closing takes place anywhere other than at the office of the Title Company, Seller will arrange for a Title Company representative with authority to update and mark up the commitment for title insurance as required under this Agreement to be present at closing. If title can be conveyed in the condition required under this Agreement and all contingencies have been satisfied or waived, closing will take place on a date and time as is mutually agreeable to the parties. However, closing will occur not later than October 31, 2022. Seller will provide or cause to be provided a complete package of every document to be executed by Buyer to Buyer's attorney within 48 hours of closing.

Payment of Fees and Closing Costs

Buyer will pay all closing fees and all costs associated with recording the required deed. The parties agree that the Title Company will prepare the required deed and closing documents necessary to complete this transaction, that the Title Company will conduct

the closing, and that the cost of same, together with any settlement, document preparation, or disbursement fee, will be borne by Seller. Seller will pay the required transfer tax, the cost of an owner's commitment and policy of title insurance, and recording fees relative to the discharge of Seller's mortgage, if any. At closing, the parties will execute closing statements prepared by the Title Company and all income or other tax reporting documents as required by the Title Company.

Possession

Seller will deliver possession of the Property to Buyer free of all occupants and debris at closing.

Buyer's Contingencies

Buyer's obligations under this Agreement will be contingent on obtaining approval of the Agreement from all persons and/or entities required by Buyer's Charter and Code of Ordinances.

Seller's Representations

Seller represents and warrants to Buyer as follows:

- 1. There is no pending litigation affecting all or any part of the Property or Seller's interest in it.
- 2. There are no uncorrected violations of any building codes and regulations, health codes, or zoning ordinances affecting the Property or the use or enjoyment of it. If it is determined that any of these violations exist, Seller will cure all those violations, at Seller's sole expense, before the date of closing.
- 3. To the best of Seller's knowledge, there are no undisclosed or latent defects affecting the Property and its improvements other than as set forth and identified on the Seller's Disclosure Statement, the terms of which are incorporated in this Agreement.
- 4. To the best of Seller's knowledge, there are no unrecorded interests of any person (or persons) or entity (or entities) in and to the Property whatsoever (including, but not limited to, easements, profits, and licenses).
- 5. To the best of Seller's knowledge, there are no easements, either above the surface, at grade, or subsurface, other than utility easements of record, that would affect or interfere with Buyer's use and enjoyment of the Property, as determined by Buyer.
- 6. Access to the Property is by public road.

- 7. To the best of Seller's knowledge, the Property does not lie within a 100-year flood plain.
- 8. There are no underground storage tanks or hazardous or toxic substances existing on, under, or above the Property as defined in any federal, state, or local law, regulation, rule, statute, or directive, nor is there any asbestos or urea formaldehyde foam insulation installed in or on the Property.
- 9. Seller holds all possible division rights to the Property and will transfer all these division rights to Buyer with the deed.

These representations and warranties will survive the closing of this transaction and will not be deemed merged into the deed.

Condition of Property

Seller agrees to maintain the Property in the same condition in which it existed as of the date of this Agreement for the period through the last date of Seller's occupancy and possession of the Property. If Buyer is not then satisfied that the premises and Property have been maintained by Seller as required under this Agreement, Buyer will have the right to delay the closing until the premises and Property are returned to the required condition. If Seller fails or refuses to return the premises and Property to the required condition within 14 days of Buyer's demand for same, Buyer will have the right (but not the obligation) to declare this Agreement null and void and all deposits paid by Buyer will be immediately returned to Buyer or to close and, after closing, maintain an action against Seller for all resulting damages.

Legal Description

Buyer and Seller acknowledge and agree that the legal description for the Property will be that as set forth in the commitment for title insurance to be obtained by Seller, and furnished to Buyer under this Agreement, and the survey obtained by Buyer, if any. If there is a conflict between the legal description in the commitment for title insurance and any survey obtained by Buyer, the legal description in the survey will control and Seller will cause the title insurance company to insure that description.

Binding Agreement

This Agreement will bind and inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns of the respective parties.

Time of the Essence

Time is of the essence of this Agreement, except that Buyer may, in Buyer's sole discretion, waive this provision for the purpose of permitting Seller to cure title defects.

Brokers

Seller acknowledges and agrees that notwithstanding the fact that a real estate broker or sales agent in this transaction may be operating as a buyer's agent, all commissions due and owing to any real estate brokers or sales agents will be paid by Seller.

Entire Agreement/Written Agreements Only

This Agreement contains the entire agreement between Seller and Buyer. There are no agreements, representations, statements, or understandings that have been relied on by Seller or Buyer that are not stated in this Agreement. IT IS THE PARTIES' INTENT IN THEIR DEALINGS THAT IF IT IS NOT IN WRITING, IT IS NOT ENFORCEABLE. This Agreement (and written and signed addenda, if any) cannot be modified, altered, or otherwise amended without a writing being duly signed or initialed, as the case may be, by both Seller and Buyer. The parties agree that facsimile signatures and duly initialed changes are legally enforceable provided the applicable writing contains the signature or initials of all parties to this Agreement.

Effective Date

The effective date of this Agreement, i.e., the date on which the timing provisions and contingencies of this Agreement begin (the Effective Date), will be the date on which the last person to sign this document will have signed the document. If the parties fail to insert the date they signed this Agreement beneath their signatures below, the Effective Date will be the date on which Buyer received a fully executed copy of this document. IT IS THEREFORE VERY IMPORTANT FOR EACH PERSON SIGNING THIS DOCUMENT TO PLACE THE DATE OF SIGNING IN THE SPACE PROVIDED BELOW HIS OR HER SIGNATURE.

North- C-2 (Highway Commercial - Charter Township of Genesee, Michigan)

South- A-2 (Single Family Medium Density)

West- D-3 (Community Business)

BACKGROUND

The applicant, Jaycee LLC/Jeff Gappy, requests a rezoning from D-3 to D-5 at 3402 Richfield Rd. The applicant intends to redevelop the property for a self-storage facility. Self-storage facilities require properties to be in the D-5, D-6, E, F, or G, zoning districts.

The subject property is surrounded by D-3 zoned properties to the east and west. To the south, the property abuts the A-2 single family medium density residential zoning district. To the north, the Charter Township of Genesee, Michigan has a highway commercial zoning district.

On May 8, 2021, the applicant presented a use variance to the Zoning Board of Appeals to be allowed to operate a storage facility business in the "D-3" Community Business District. Commissioner Jerry Kea made a motion to approve ZBA 21-2252 on the condition that: 1) the

facility is completely enclosed with a security fence equipped with barbed wire on top; 2) security and lighting are included in the infrastructure upgrades that the applicant has spoken to. It complies with standard two based on the fact that it is the minimum variance necessary to provide adequate relief. It complies with standard four, based on the fact that the zoning ordinance unreasonably restricts the property from being used to its full potential, which is not a hardship created by the property owners, but was created by the City of Flint. This motion was not support.

Commissioner Yelle made a motion to deny ZBA 21-2252 based on findings that the property is zoned D-3 where the applicant wants to do a D-5 business. This motion was supported and carried 7 yes – 3 no. Minutes from this meeting are provided with this application's materials.

APPLICANT REQUEST:

The applicant requests to rezone the property from the current zoning district D-3 to the proposed zoning district D-5. The applicant states that the property has been vacant for over ten years and that the rezoning will allow for the redevelopment of this parcel into self-storage. Additionally, the applicant shared that the property has been marketed for retail, to no avail.

The D-5 district permits any use in the D-3 District as well as:

- D-4 district uses, which include office buildings, printing, light manufacturing, residential
 uses of any kind provided that such use does not occupy the ground floor, clubs and
 lodges.
- C-2 district uses, which include multifamily housing and institutional uses by-right, and hotels, offices, clinics, funeral homes, and mobile home parks as conditional land uses.
- **D-5 district uses**, which include automotive service and repair, rental, and sales; manufacturing, provided such use shall not occupy any ground floor street frontage, schools, wholesale and warehouses, laboratories, and studios.
- Group B Special Regulated Uses, which include pawnshops, liquor stores, and tattoo parlors.
- Group E Special Regulated Uses, which include marihuana provisioning, retail, & secure transport.
- Group G Special Regulated Uses, which include marihuana micro businesses.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION AND COMMENTS:

Staff recommends denial of this rezoning request. Rezoning this parcel would not be in line with the current Master plan, or Zoning code. Under current zoning the property is zoned D-3 and future zoned "TN-2 – Traditional Neighborhood", which does not permit self-storage facilities. In the future master plan, self-storage facilities are a permitted use within the "CC – City Corridor" zoning district.

The purpose and intent of the TN-2 Traditional Neighborhood-Medium Density:

The TN-2 Traditional Neighborhood district is intended to accommodate neighborhoods of moderate density, where single-family homes are located upon lots comparable in dimension to those typically found in the community's older established neighborhoods. Single-family homes are the predominant use, but two-family and single-family attached development is also permitted. Various non-residential uses that complement the traditional neighborhood including schools, community centers, religious institutions, and parks are permitted on a limited scale.

Rezoning this parcel would be considered spot zoning which is not conducive under the City of Flint Current Master Plan or Zoning Code or Future Master Plan and proposed Zoning Code.

According to <u>Brad Neumann</u>, <u>Michigan State University Extension</u> - June 17, 2016: "illegal form of rezoning is spot zoning. This practice gets its name from the appearance of small spots of different zoning districts on a zoning map that otherwise has large contiguous areas in the same zoning district around the spots. To be considered a spot zone, the property, in most cases, must meet the following four criteria:

- The area is small compared to districts surrounding the parcel in question.
- The new district allows land uses inconsistent with those allowed in the vicinity.
- The spot zone would confer a special benefit on the individual property owner not commonly enjoyed by the owners of similar property.
- The existence of the spot zone conflicts with the policies in the text of the master plan and the future land use map.

Rezonings that have the four characteristics of spot zoning listed above run a high risk of invalidation if challenged in court and not consistent with the master plan. In some cases, master plans anticipate these relationships and provide for them (for example, a small commercial area may serve a residential neighborhood). In those cases where the master plan supports a relatively small zoning district that is dissimilar to the zoning that surrounds it, this is probably not a spot zone"
