According to the Flint/Genesee County Continuum of Care (CoC), in 2021 nearly 4,000 people experienced homelessness in Genesee County and, on any given date, there were roughly 258 local residents without a safe place to sleep at night; and,

The Genesee County Metropolitan Planning Commission reports that Genesee County has a shortage of nearly 5,000 units of housing affordable to households with extremely low incomes; and,

Exclusionary zoning laws and a lack of available funding often block the development of quality, affordable housing options; and,

A lack of affordable housing is a significant community issue impacting persons seeking housing especially during the COVID-19 pandemic; and,

To prevent and address homelessness, it is essential to provide a comprehensive set of supportive services to mitigate the traumatic experience of homelessness; and,

The CoC is a cross-sector community collaboration working together to achieve access to safe and affordable housing for all residents of Flint; and,

The CoC works in partnership with the Michigan State Housing Development Authority (MSHDA) and the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), and the Michigan Coalition Against Homelessness (MCAH) towards the common goal of ending homelessness and,

The City of Flint, along with countless community partners, stand committed to ending homelessness in our community once and for all; and,

It is critical for citizens, agencies, and governments to work collaboratively to build a community that ensures that every person has a home; and,

During this month of November, it is important to show our gratitude for the dedicated and significant work of our front-line staff and provider partners regularly serving those enduring homelessness;

RESOLUTION ADOPTING ARPA ALLOCATION PLAN

BY THE CITY COUNCIL:

Under the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), the City of Flint received grant funding from the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund through the US Department of Treasury in the amount of \$94,726,664.00, to address public health and economic impacts of the COVID-19 public health emergency, respond to workers performing essential work during the COVID-19 public health emergency, provide government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue due to the COVID-19 public health emergency, and to make necessary investments in infrastructure.

\$34,374,696.00 of the City's ARPA funding has already been allocated and/or spent for these purposes. The remaining \$60,351,968.00 must be spent by December 31, 2026, to cover eligible costs incurred during the period that begins on March 3, 2021 and ends on December 31, 2024.

Background/Summary of Proposed Action:

The resolution based on the subcontract between Michigan State University, and the City of Flint, to conduct activities for the Flint Lead Exposure Registry Program.

This program is for the maintenance of a registry in response to the recent public health emergency involving Flint residents' exposure to lead drinking water. This is meant to provide a succinct description of the current situation in Flint and the overall proposed approach to build upon the pilot registry previously implemented.

The Flint Lead Exposure Registry (FLExR) program was created to address the exposure to lead in the drinking water, which addresses a critical need to create a comprehensive list which can be used to identify exposed individuals for long-term surveillance, and determine the neurodevelopmental, medical and socioeconomic impacts of the crisis. Through a community-engaged and community-collaborative process, a team has been established a leadership team that has created connections between numerous and diverse stakeholder groups to ensure that this effort addresses the health concerns of the Flint community, improves the health and developmental outcomes among registrants, and expands the use of lead exposure reduction methods. Michigan State University (MSU) – Hurley Children's Hospital Pediatric Public Health Initiative (PPHI) and the Greater Flint Health Coalition (GFHC) have been collaborating closely since the onset of the Flint Water Crisis to coordinate and strengthen the network of available community, state, federal, and academic partners and resources to support the creation of a registry. In December 2016, a registry pilot study was funded by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation and in January 2017, the Michigan Dept. of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) awarded a registry planning grant to MSU.

Building on the registry pilot and planning efforts, MSU proposes to establish FLExR to specifically accomplish the following aims: 1) register eligible Flint residents; 2) conduct baseline health and development assessments on all registrants; 3) assess service needs and eligibility of all registrants and refer them to available clinical, preventive and lead-elimination services; and 4) track and evaluate improvements in population lead exposure and in health and development outcomes in response to service utilization, via follow-up assessment.

MSU will pay for costs incurred, including non-cancelable obligations, through the date of termination. If the Prime Agreement is terminated, MSU may terminate this Agreement immediately.
- 18. <u>Job Description</u>: Chief Resilience Officer – (Lottie Ferguson)
Lottie Ferguson will assist with identifying existing lead-related programming (services and training opportunities) and connect the registry to the FAST start pipe replacement program. She will help develop a City of Flint 'lead elimination report' that will be updated regularly. She will serve as a liaison between City of Flint and community partners working on this project. She will attend planning and organization meetings andthen share that information with City of Flint and their partners.

<u>Job Description</u>: Manager of Public Health – (Qiana Towns Williams)
This position is responsible for providing support and coordination for the City of
Flint Chief Resilience Officer. This position will involve working with Flint Registry
outreachand service partners, attending monthly Flint Registry Outreach and All
Group meetings, and assuring that City programming and activities align with

Flint Registry activities.

Job Description: Family Navigator – (One staff at 30%)

This position assists families impacted by the Flint Water Crisis in accessing and navigating available resources. This position works closely with families and communitypartners. The Family Navigator will assure that Flint Registry enrollees, especially thoseof special populations, identifying as needing assistance with City services (i.e., water bill payment, service line replacement, lead based paint hazard reduction/healthy homes activities, etc.) are linked to such services. The Family Navigator will assure thatthe appropriate City personnel/contractor addresses referrals from Flint Registry.

Furthermore, the "Family Navigator" will:

- Be trained on the community referral platform and ensure that referrals from theRegistry team for City of Flint services are accepted and completed within a timely manner.
- Identify Flint based families who qualify for the Flint Registry and assist them withpre-enrollment in the Registry.
- Assist the Flint Registry team in creating an environment that promotescommunity resilience and trauma informed principles.
- Assist families referred from the Flint Registry in enrolling and maintainingenrollment in programs sponsored by the City of Flint.
- Assist special population families (Spanish Speaking and American Sign Language) with completing surveys for the Flint Registry so they can be linked tomedical and social programs.
- Attend community meetings, outreach and networking events to gather input andshare information about the Flint Registry in coordination with the Director of Outreach at Greater Flint Health Coalition.
- Assist Chief Resilience Officer, Manager of Public Health and other City of Flint Administration staff in planning and implementing citywide programs and eventspertaining to public health and water recovery.
- Other duties assigned.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF FLINT TO ENTER INTO AGREEMENT WITH THE FY-22 NATIONAL SEXUAL ASSAULT KIT INITIATIVE GRANT FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE FOR A POLICE DEPARTMENT SAKI GRANT FOR \$2,500,000.00

BY THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR:

WHEREAS, the City of Flint Police Department has applied for and accepted a US Department of Justice (DOJ) grant under the FY22 National Sexual Assault Kit Initiative (SAKI) award number 15PBJA-22-GG-03768-SAKI, in the amount of \$2,500,000.00; and

WHEREAS, this grant was created to address the issue of unsubmitted sexual assault kits (SAKs); and

WHEREAS, the funds are designed to be used over a three year period from October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2025 and must be utilized in compliance with the grant agreement and approved grant budget; and

PROJECT ABSTRACT

Purpose of the project: The City of Flint "CoF" (Michigan) Community Based Violence Intervention and Prevention Initiative (CVIPI) aims to implement evidence-informed strategies to reduce and prevent violent crime in the "CoF". Violent crime, specifically gun violence, continues to be a major issue affecting the entire community thus eroding public health, causing economic disruption, and contributing to lasting individual and community traumas. On July 23, 2021, the "CoF" Mayor declared a state of emergency due to the rising gun violence in the City.

Primary activities: The Flint (CVIPI) project will be led by the "CoF". A multidisciplinary team (MDT) of stakeholders will be involved in the forming, planning and implementation of the CVIPI, this will include, mental health service providers, community based organizations, faith based organizations, law enforcement, victim advocates, service providers, hospital and other healthcare providers, researchers and community residents and other relevant stakeholders.

While working collaboratively, the MDT will ensure that the key principles of this solicitation are at the forefront of all planning and implementation. Expected outcomes: As a result of activities, it is expected there will be a reduction in violence as reported via individual surveys and police incident data. It is expected that during the first 6 - 9 months of this award, the needs assessment and subsequent strategic plan will shape any expected

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> outcomes, however, the aim is to see an overall reduction of violence in the "CoF" by 15% -20% with a reduction of gun related homicides by 10% - 15%. Service area: Flint has experienced significant economic and traumatic hardships over the past two decades including the Flint lead water emergency (aka the 'Flint Water Crisis') economic recession, and most recently the COVID-19 pandemic. Research shows that a manifest effect of hardships such as these is an increase in crime. For instance, consistent exposure to leadparticularly during vulnerable periods such as before age two-is correlated with increased likelihood of negative outcomes including violent crime. Social justice researchers arque this as being an issue of environmental racism due to certain populations, in particular, Black or African Americans in urban areas, being disproportionately exposed to higher lead levels. According to the latest census, black or African American community makes up the majority of the population of the "CoF", at 54%.

WHEREAS, the City of Flint is a duly created and validly existing political subdivision of the State of Michigan under the Constitution and laws of the state of Michigan, and;

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2021, the President of the United States of America signed into law the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021", also known as House Resolution 1319, an Act approved by the Congress of the United States, and which authorized the Treasury of the United States to disburse certain funds to local governments, including the City of Flint, which could be used for specific and defined purposes, and;

WHEREAS, in accordance with the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, the City of Flint wishes to exercise its right to extend and disseminate assistance to impacted households tied to specific criteria, as authorized by the Act, to assist citizens who may have been impacted financially by the ongoing COVID-19 Pandemic.

WHEREAS, the administration recommends funding up to \$421,249.25 for the City of Flint's Office of Public Health to continue providing needed access to public health resources, direct navigation for city residents to many community resources on a case-by-case basis, continuance of lead mitigation services including distribution of water filtration systems, conducting the distribution of test kits for Lead and Copper Rule testing, and expanding their scope of work to include public health initiatives that focus on equity, environmental justice, food policy mental health, substance abuse, and more.

IT IS RESOLVED that the appropriate City officials are authorized to do all things necessary to provide funding to operate the Office of Public Health, amend the FY23 budget, and appropriate funding for revenue and expenditures in future fiscal years, for as long as funds are available from the funder. Funds will be paid from the American Rescue Plan Act fund (287). Before funds are spent, the City of Flint's ARPA administration, compliance, and implementation firm shall review and ensure compliance with the latest US Department of Treasury final rules.

Background/Summary of Proposed Action:

The grants that previously funded the Office of Public Health, Healthy Start grant provided to the Genesee County Health Department from the Health Resources and Services Administration, an agency of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services; and Flint Lead Exposure Registry at Michigan State University, have ended, and the office has become an essential part of public health services and referrals for the City of Flint. The Office of Public Health is often the first point of contact for residents in crisis, and the Information Desk is the first point of contact for visitors to City Hall, and includes the only person on city staff who is fluent in Spanish.

The Office of Public Health provides access to public health resources, direct navigation for city residents to many community resources on a case-by-case basis, continuance of lead mitigation services including distribution of water filtration systems, conducting the distribution of test kits for Lead and Copper Rule testing, with plans to expand their scope of work to include public health initiatives that focus on equity, environmental justice, food policy, mental health, substance abuse, and more, in continued partnership with community based organizations and the Genesee County Health Department.

This would fund operations for the Office of Public Health for one year, with the expectation that additional grant funding would be secured for office ongoing sustainability.
