WHEREAS, the council will develop plans for continuing public awareness about lead in drinking water, even when the action level is not exceeded; review public awareness campaign materials provided by the statewide drinking water advisory council to ensure the needs and interest of the community, considering the economic and cultural diversity of its residents, are addressed; advise and consult with the water supply on the development of appropriate plans for remediation and public education to be implemented if a lead action level is exceeded; advise and consult with the water supply on efforts to replace private lead service lines at locations where the owner declined service line replacement; assist in promoting transparency of all data and documents related to lead in drinking water within the water supply service area

**WHEREAS**, Mayor Neeley desires to appoint <u>Sherri Miller</u> to the Water System Advisory Council (See Attached Resume).

#### **BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ACTION:**

In July 2018, the State of Michigan's Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy (EGLE) established the Lead and Copper Rule (LCR) under the Michigan Safe Water Drinking Act 399.

The purpose of the LCR is to minimize lead and copper in drinking water and indicates that a Water System Advisory Council (WSAC) is to be established on behalf of cities with 50,000 or more people served by its municipal water system. The WSAC is responsible for assisting with public awareness to create transparency and consumer confidence through statewide efforts of public education and action steps to ensure water quality through water sampling, water treatment and lead service line replacement. A Council shall consist of a least five members appointed by the community supply. To be eligible for appointment to Council, an individual must have a demonstrated interest in or knowledge about lead in drinking water and its effects. At least one member must be a local resident who does not formally represent the interest of any incorporated organization.

In February 2021, the Office of Public Health (OPH) sent notices of participation to public health community partners and community members and requested resumes of those individuals in order to submit an approval to Flint City Council to officially establish the Water System Advisory Council. The WSAC will be hosted by the City's OPH, who will organize and oversee the annual meeting, according to the Open Meetings Act 267. This annual meeting will inform and include the public on the City's lead and copper status, progress and next steps.



The designated appointee has either lived or worked within the Flint community during the Flint Water Crisis and has expressed interest and knowledge concerning lead in drinking water. Appointee's resume is attached.

It is the desire of the City to submit the approval of appointing members to complete the Water System Advisory Council, to Flint City Council. If approved, the City of Flint will, be in compliance with the Lead and Copper Rule required by the State of Michigan; create transparency with Flint residents; avoid any monetary penalties associated with the non-compliance of establishing the Water System Advisory Council.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS: There is no budget required to establish or sustain the Water System Advisory Council.

#### **BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ACTION:**

In July 2018, the State of Michigan's Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy (EGLE) established the Lead and Copper Rule (LCR) under the Michigan Safe Water Drinking Act 399.

The purpose of the LCR is to minimize lead and copper in drinking water and indicates that a Water System Advisory Council (WSAC) is to be established on behalf of cities with 50,000 or more people served by its municipal water system. The WSAC is responsible for assisting with public awareness to create transparency and consumer confidence through statewide efforts of public education and action steps to ensure water quality through water sampling, water treatment and lead service line replacement. A Council shall consist of a least five members appointed by the community supply. To be eligible for appointment to Council, an individual must have a demonstrated interest in or knowledge about lead in drinking water and its effects. At least one member must be a local resident who does not formally represent the interest of any incorporated organization.

In February 2021, the Office of Public Health (OPH) sent notices of participation to public health community partners and community members and requested resumes of those individuals in order to submit an approval to Flint City Council to officially establish the Water System Advisory Council. The WSAC will be hosted by the City's OPH, who will organize and oversee the annual meeting, according to the Open Meetings Act 267. This annual meeting will inform and include the public on the City's lead and copper status, progress and next steps.



The designated appointee has either lived or worked within the Flint community during the Flint Water Crisis and has expressed interest and knowledge concerning lead in drinking water. Appointee's resume is attached.

It is the desire of the City to submit the approval of appointing members to complete the Water System Advisory Council, to Flint City Council. If approved, the City of Flint will, be in compliance with the Lead and Copper Rule required by the State of Michigan; create transparency with Flint residents; avoid any monetary penalties associated with the non-compliance of establishing the Water System Advisory Council.

#### **BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ACTION:**

Clark Commons is a multi-unit, mixed income housing development underway in the neighborhood bounded by Mary St. on the north, Fifth Avenue on the south, Saginaw St. on the east, and ML King on the west. Made possible by a \$30 Million Dollars Choice Neighborhoods Initiative (CNI) grant from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). HUD created the Choice Neighborhoods Initiative (CNI) to help communities revitalize distressed public housing and improve conditions in the surrounding neighborhood using three core goals: 1.) Housing - transform distressed public and assisted housing into energy efficient, mixed-income housing that is physically and financially viable over the long term; 2.) People – support positive outcomes for families who live in target development and the surrounding neighborhoods, and 3.) Neighborhood – transform distressed neighborhood into livable, mixed-income neighborhoods with access to well-functioning services.

The City of Flint applied for and received a \$1,421,911 grant from the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for the purpose of further supporting the development of replacement housing in conjunction with the CNI Transformation Plan approved as part of a \$30 Million Dollars Choice Grant. This funding helps fill a gap in the housing budget which was created due to sustained construction cost increases, labor increases, interest rate increases, and additional remediation costs as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. The funding leverages multiple other funding sources, including funding proposed from MSHDA LIHTC equity, Housing Trust Funds, subordinate loans from COF CNI, HOME, and Brownfield, additional CNI funds, the Flint Housing Commission, developer equity, and a COF ARPA allocation. The City received notice of its award from HUD on April 11, 2023. The attached Resolution will authorize the acceptance of the grant and authorize setting up the appropriate grant accounts in the Planning and Development Department.

#### **BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ACTION:**

The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 ("ARP") appropriated \$5 billion to communities across the U.S. to provide housing, services, and shelter to individuals experiencing homelessness and other vulnerable populations. These funds were allocated by formula to jurisdictions that qualified for funding through the HOME Investment Partnership Program (HOME Program) from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). This special round of funding is called the "HOME-ARP" program. The City was notified that it was eligible to apply for \$3,244.570 in HOME-ARP funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). These funds are available to the City address the housing needs of very specific qualifying populations (those experiencing or at risk of homelessness, those fleeing domestic violence or human trafficking, and other vulnerable populations with a high risk of housing instability. Eligible activities that may be funded with HOME-ARP include: (1) development and support of affordable housing; (2) tenant-based rental assistance; (3) provision of supportive services (such as housing counseling, homelessness prevention, child care, job training, legal services, case management, moving costs, rental applications, and rent assistance); and (4) acquisition and development of non-congregate shelter units.

The City, after completing all required elements, including outreach and data analysis and community engagement, submitted its HOME-ARP Allocation to HUD March 24, 2023. HUD approved the Plan on April 13, 2023 (#M21-MP260204). The attached Resolution will authorize the acceptance of the grant and authorize setting up the appropriate grant accounts in the Planning and Development Department. NOTE: The City previously accepted a portion of the HOME-ARP grant award in the amount of \$162,228.50 for the purposes of administering the HOME-ARP and planning costs of preparation, outreach and creating the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan (see attached Resolution 210591, approved December 8, 2021).

### **BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ACTION:**

The first Park Partnership Agreement was executed in 2014 for Genesee County Parks and Recreation Commission (the Commission) to maintain Max Brandon Park, Flint Park Lake Park, Thread Lake Park, and McKinley Park. Then the First Amendment to the Park Partnership Agreement, effectuated in 2016, gave the Commission authority and responsibility for seeking funds to construct and operate the Riverfront Restoration Project, which includes restoration to Chevy Commons, Riverbank Park, Vietnam Veteran's Park, Flint River Trail & Parkway, Lewis Street Park, West Boulevard Park, Riverside Park East, Riverside Forest Preserve, and Fabri and Hamilton Dams.

The second and third amendments to the Agreement utilized grant funding from the Charles Stewart Mott Foundation to ensure proper maintenance and staffing for the agreed parks.

The Park Partnership Agreement further expanded in 2021 to include waste pickup, removal, and small-scale general maintenance to ALL Community Parks within the City not previously covered under the partnership. This expanded agreement was intended to address inequity/disparity between parks in the City and provided for services that were not previously offered by the City for City parks due to budget constraints.

This resolution would expand upon this already robust cooperative agreement to include mowing services for all City of Flint parks, with the ultimate goal of providing a similar user experience across the City's park

system. This expansion would provide the following benefits: More frequent park mowing, consistent quality of mowing and greater accountability, centralizing maintenance within one organization which reduces time spent coordinating services, and stronger partnership with an organization that has the capacity and resource to tackle larger issues that may arise.



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An Ordinance to amend the Flint Code of Ordinances, Chapter 31, General Offenses.

### IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF FLINT:

Sec. 1. An Emergency Ordinance to amend the Flint City Code of Ordinances by amending Chapter 31, General Offenses, by adding Sections 31-41.1 Trespassing – Unlawful Occupancy, which shall read in its entirety as follows:

### §31-41.1 Trespassing — Unlawful Occupancy

- (a) No person in the City of Flint shall do any of the following:
  - 1. Except as authorized by a code official, enter or remain in a structure that has been condemned, found to be unsafe, and/or found to be unfit for human occupancy, pursuant to the International Property Maintenance Code as adopted.
  - 2. Except as authorized by a code official, deface or remove a placard or notice which has been posted by a code official pursuant to the International Property Maintenance Code, as adopted.
  - 3. Except as authorized by a fire code official, enter into or remain in a structure that has been found to be unsafe, and/or hazardous, and/or for which an evacuation has been ordered, pursuant to the International Fire Code, as adopted.
  - 4. Except as authorized by a fire code official, deface or remove a placard or notice posted which has been posted by a fire code official pursuant to the International Fire Code, as adopted.
- (b) Any person who violates this section of the Code is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 90 days or a fine of not more \$500.00, or both.

Sec. 2. The City Council finds that that the unauthorized act of entering into and/or remaining in a structure that has been condemned, and/or been found to be unsafe, and/or been found to be hazardous, and/or been found to be unfit for human occupancy, and/or for which an evacuation has been ordered, pursuant to the International Property Maintenance Code and/or the International Fire Code, constitutes a public emergency affecting the life, health, property, and the public peace of the people of the City of Flint in that persons who engage in such an act or acts, place themselves, their neighbors and the public in physical danger.
