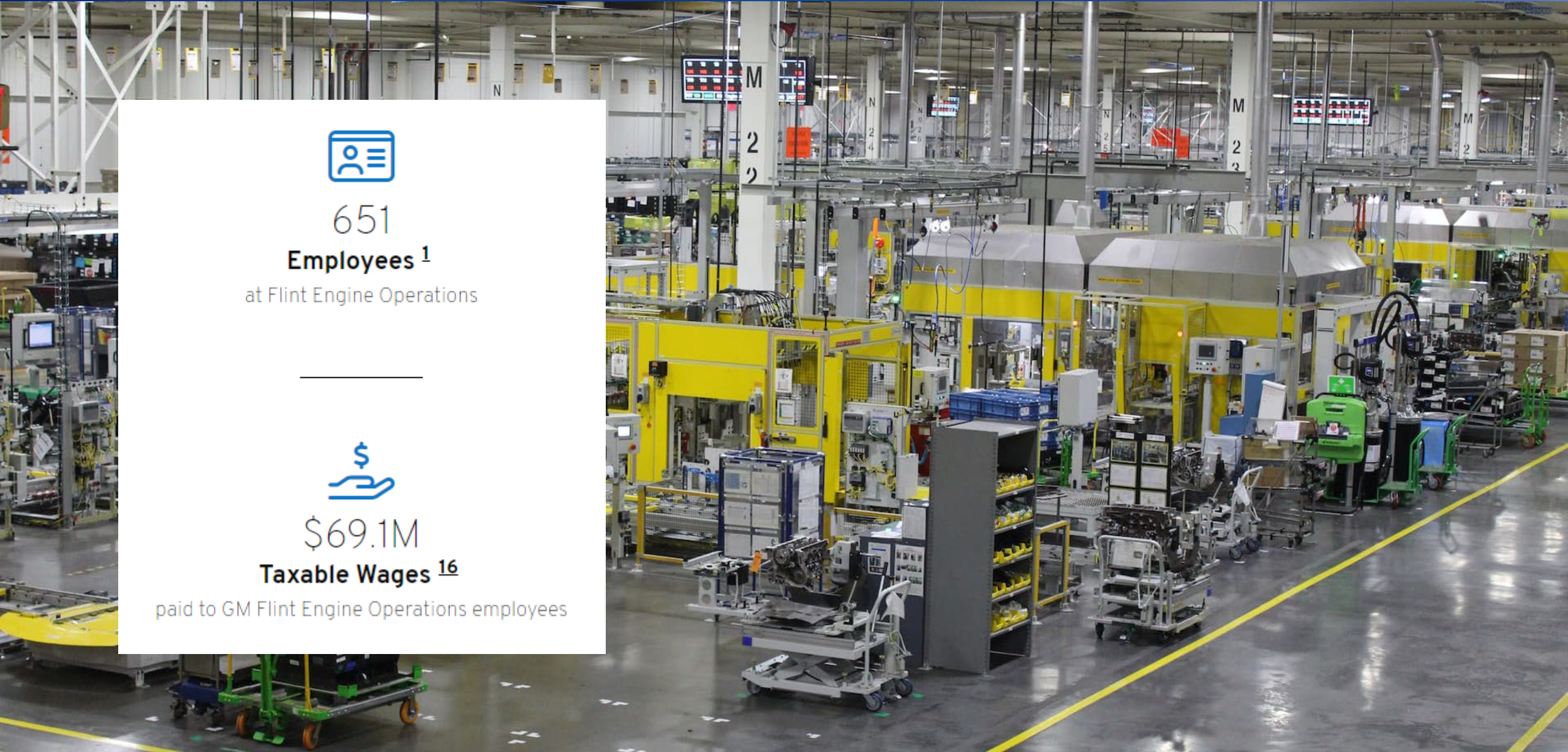

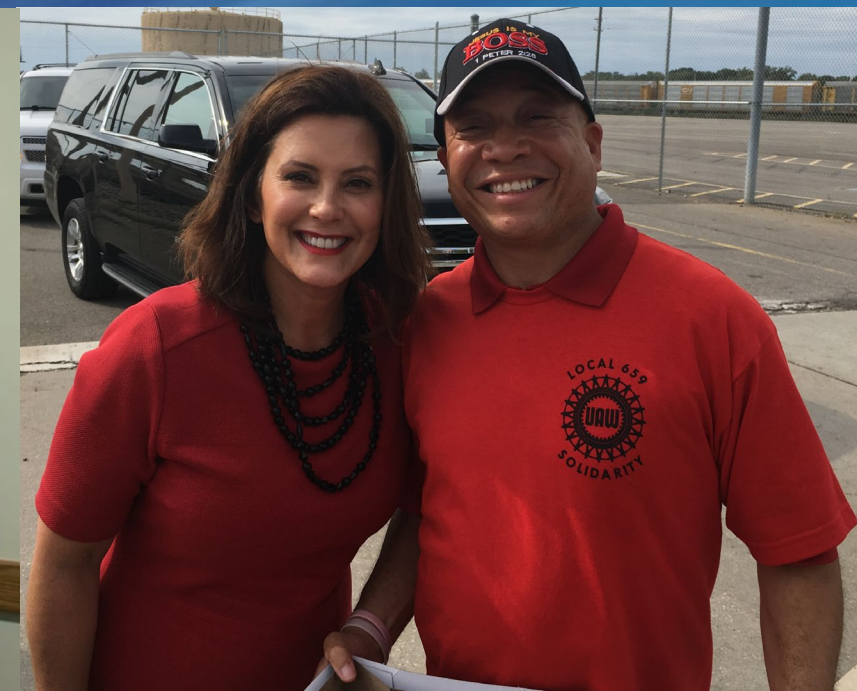

- In September 2023, we secured a \$170 million payment for Flint's pension system from the State of Michigan.

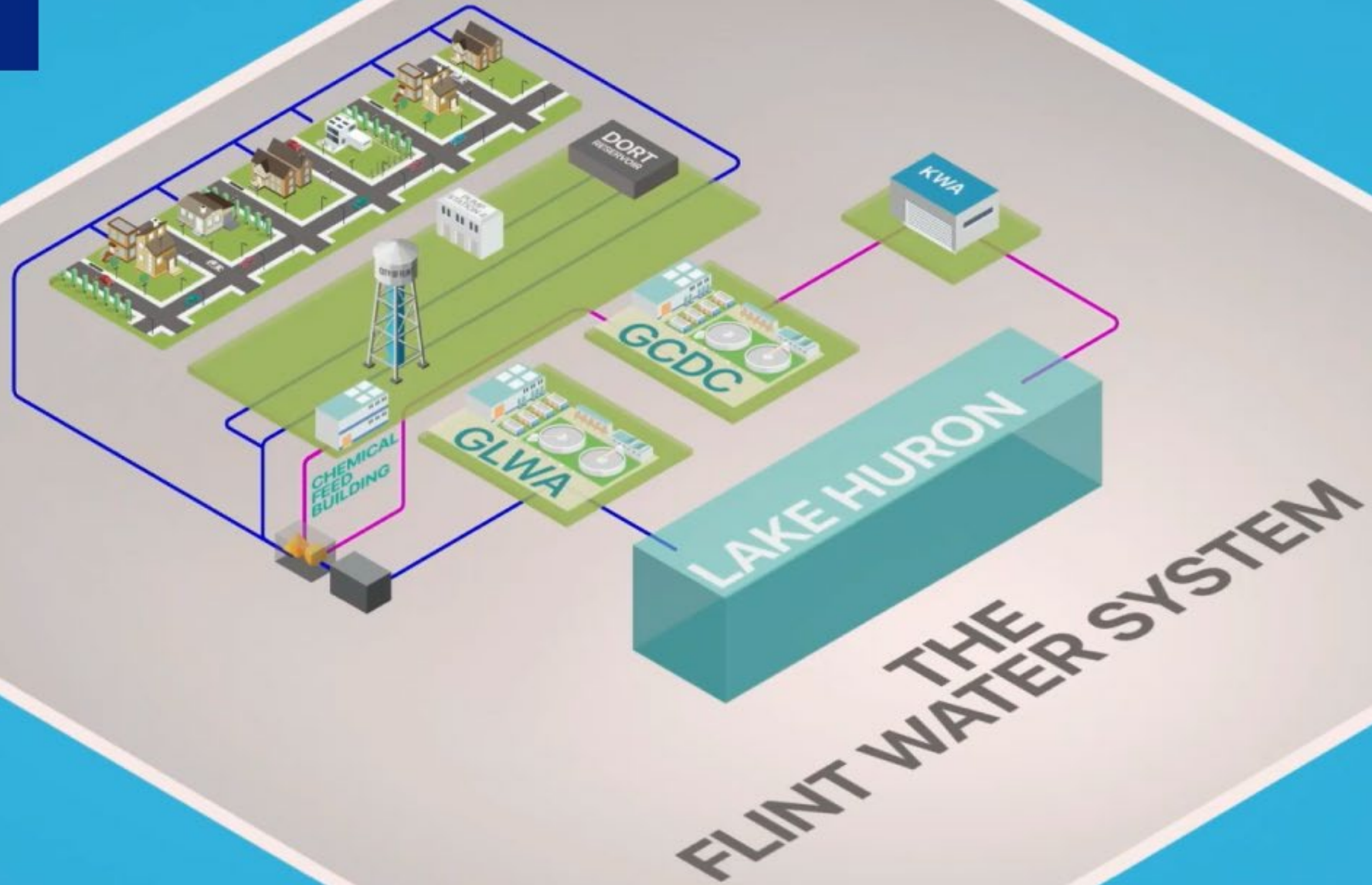

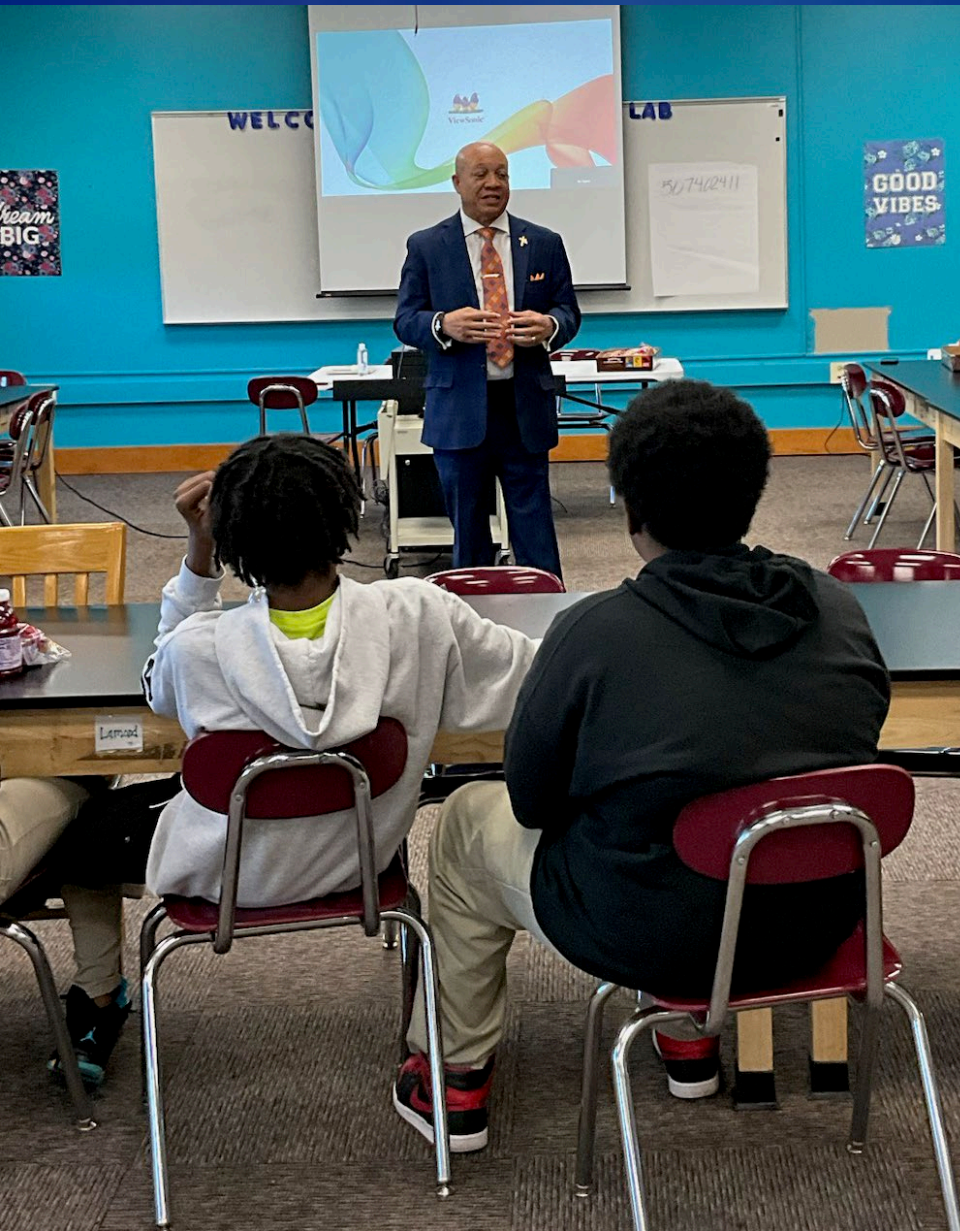
