[NOTE: Youth Arts: Unlocked's (YAU) mission is twofold: to bring visual and performing arts to detained and court-involved youth in Flint and to bring their work to the public.]

#### 250097-T Reallocation of ARPA Funds/Water Rate Stabilization Fund

Resolution resolving that due to [water rate increases to the City of Flint by the Great Lakes Water Authority] and the economic hardship due to COVID-19, that the appropriate City officials are authorized to do all things necessary, including executing any necessary agreements, to appropriate funding from the funding source account #101-000.000-995.591 to the Water Rate Stabilization Fund, in an amount of \$2,000,000. [NOTE: City of Flint residents have not received a water rate increase since 2015. The Great Lakes Water Authority increases their rates to the City of Flint annually, and the upcoming fiscal years increase is set at 5.9%. In order for the City of Flint to not pass this increase onto its residents a water rate stabilization fund is necessary.]

# **250100-T** Reallocation of ARPA Funds/Youth Job Training/City of Flint Second Clean & Safe Summer Program

Resolution resolving that the appropriate City officials are authorized to do all things necessary, including executing any necessary agreements, to appropriate funding from the funding source account 101-728.018-801.000 to City of Flint Second Clean & Safe Summer Youth Job Training Program in the amount of \$225,000. Based on review and validation of the appropriate fund use by the City's compliance firm, implementation of these funds will be consistent and compliant with US Department of Treasury requirements and previously approved authorizations. [NOTE: The City Administration recommends reallocating \$225,000 of ARPA funds, previously obligated for revenue replacement, to provide funding to City of Flint Clean & Safe Summer Youth Job Training Program to provide a second round of summer jobs for youth ages 15-19 to eradicate the negative use of idle time and to keep them safe from crime. The program offers six (6) weeks of summer employment paid through the ARPA Youth Job Training category and for 5-7 non-profit organizations to serve as host sites.]

# **250107-T** AIS Construction Equipment/Repairs to a Paver/DPW/Street Maintenance

Resolution resolving that the Division of Purchases and Supplies, upon City Council's approval, is hereby authorized to issue a purchase order to AIS Construction Equipment for replacement of parts on a paver, in an amount NOT-TO-EXCEED \$91,907.57. [NOTE: The paver that is used to pave local streets was purchased in 2018 as a used demo (2016 model) and needs several repairs. This is a two-track paver, and both tracks need to be replaced this year because they are worn out. There is also a screed under the unit that needs to be replaced. This screed finishes the surface of the asphalt, that's what makes the road nice and smooth. If these replacements are not made, local roads will not be able to be paved this year. This paver is used continuously during the construction season and doing these replacements will extend the life of the paver since a new paver costs several million dollars. AIS Construction Equipment is the authorized dealer for the Vogele brand in this area.]

## **250108-T** Global Solutions Group, Inc./WPC Surveillance Improvements

Resolution resolving that the Proper City Officials are hereby authorized to do all things necessary to issue a Purchase Order to Global Solutions Group, Inc., 25900 Greenfield Road, Drive, Suite 220, Oak Park, MI 48237 for Water Pollution Control Surveillance System Improvements, in the NOT-TO-EXCEED FY 2025 amount of \$153,123.03. [NOTE: Water Pollution Control has a security surveillance system which is antiquated, analog, and failing. An improvement to this system is imperative in order to monitor the Water Pollution Control Facilities, entrances/exits, and other activities that will ensure that premises are secure.]

# **250109-T** AIS Construction Equipment/Purchase New Wirtgen W50 RI Cold Milling Machine/DPW/Street Maintenance

Resolution resolving that the Division of Purchases and Supplies, upon City Council's approval, is hereby authorized to issue a purchase order to AIS Construction Equipment for the purchase of a new Wirtgen W50 RI cold milling machine in an amount NOT-TO-EXCEED \$310,543.61. [NOTE: The Street Maintenance division owns a cold milling machine, but it is very old (bought in 2006) and needs to be replaced. The City received a quote for a 2024 Wirtgen W50 cold milling machine, which will save some money over the 2025 models but will have the same warranties.]

**250110-T** Reallocation of ARPA Funds/Consumers Energy/Citywide Streetlight Upgrade/Energy-Efficient LED Bulbs/Reduce Utility Costs

Resolution resolving that the appropriate City Officials are hereby authorized to do all things necessary including budget adjustments to enter into contract with Consumers Energy, to complete the replacement of streetlights throughout the city of Flint, for a total contract NOT-TO-EXCEED \$2,800,000.00. [NOTE: City Administration recommends allocating \$2,800,000 in ARPA funds for a contract with Consumers Energy to replace over 3,000 streetlight bulbs across the city with energy-efficient LED bulbs. This upgrade will enhance the effectiveness of the city's existing grid, improving public safety while also reducing monthly utility costs. The savings generated can be reinvested in installing new streetlights, particularly in high-crime areas identified through data from the Flint Police Department.]

## Section I: BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ACTION:

To restore and/or improve quality of life for Flint youth, FIM seeks funding to expand our current Hocus Focus program offerings to include more schools, youth-serving institutions, and to utilize Hocus Focus Analytics throughout Greater Flint.

Designed to support the learning of students with varying degrees of educational challenges and abilities (autistic, cognitively delayed, learning disabled, etc.), Hocus Focus consists of 45-minute customizable interactive activities developed in alignment with Common Core Standards that combine education with the art of magic to help students improve their abilities in planning, sequencing, organization, concentration, memory, and communication – key factors to academic success.

Dr. Kevin Spencer, creator of Hocus Focus, is a world-renowned illusionist, teaching artist, researcher, and faculty in the Special Education program at Carlow University, teaching the intersection of the arts for special populations.

Arts-integrated interventions, like Hocus Focus, encourage youth with special needs to embrace their uniqueness, using simple magic tricks to enhance successes and shiti the way other-abled students see themselves. When integrated into core curriculum, it can provide significant advancements in critical thinking, problem solving, and self-confidence — the primary component to dedication. To master anything, including education, you must first believe that you can.

Serving 500 students annually, leveraging Dr. Spencer's relationship with the Marion Crouse Instructional Center, and FIM's relationships with more than two dozen local schools and youth-serving organizations, FIM hopes to advance the use of Hocus Focus Analytics over a three-year timeline to help 2/3 of engaged youth to:

#### Section III.

POSSIBLE BENEFIT TO THE CITY OF FLINT (RESIDENTS AND/OR CITY OPERATIONS) INCLUDE PARTNERSHIPS AND COLLABORATIONS:

In the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, concern for our youth has spiked. Forced isolation, compromised school districts and curriculum, have exacerbated an already volatile situation, and exhausted already limited resources to serve special populations. Without sufficient resources to provide in-school remediation, the percentage of youth in need of special education services has continued to increase year-over-year, going from 13.8% prior to the pandemic, to 14.8% during the 2020 school year, to 15.1%today, with 9000 registered Special Education students in Genesee County. Hocus Focus is a creative instructional approach to support the learning of students with varying degrees of educational challenges and abilities including autistic, cognitively delayed, and learning-disabled students. The activities are motivational, promote positive self-expression, and reinforce many key skills needed for student success.

### Section 1: BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ACTION:

Youth Arts: Unlocked's (YAU) mission is twofold: to bring visual and performing arts to detained and court-involved youth in Flint and to bring their work to the public. YAU introduces artistic concepts and techniques as a means of connecting, expressing, learning, and empowering. YAU advances its mission by conducting weekly multi-disciplinary visual, performing and healing arts workshops for youth in detention at the Genesee County Juvenile Justice Center (GCJJC) and youth on probation at the Learning Co-Op and by exhibiting the youths' work both in community exhibits and online. In the visual arts workshops, the boys and girls at both the GCJJC and the Learning Co-Op work on projects that allow them to express themselves, learn new ideas and techniques, connect with each other and the instructors, and discover that they can create and succeed. Works created by the youth are displayed at GCJJC and featured in exhibits throughout Flint. Programming for boys at GCJJC also includes theatre and yoga workshops. In the theatre workshops, teaching artists use structured improvisational games and story lines to create a safe space in which the youth can learn new ways to express themselves verbally and through body language. Girls programming consists of weekly HERSTORY: UNLOCKED workshops which enable girls and LGBTQIA youth to find their own voices, become the tellers of their own stories, and take ownership of their futures through the mediums of dance, spoken word poetry and yoga. In the dance workshops, students learn movements in the styles of a diverse group of women dancers and then apply what was learned by collectively creating a dance that tells their own stories. Engaging in dance builds confidence, strength and emotional resilience. A similar approach is taken in the Spoken Word workshops where the youth explore various avenues of verbal expression through the introduction of women authors. Both their girls and boys yoga programs use a trauma informed curriculum for at-risk youth. Emphasis is placed on developing an individual practice, breathing and meditation in order to manage stress, anxiety, and to improve physical and mental health

The Project serves incarcerated youth at GCCJC and youth who are currently on probation and attend the Learning Co-Op located on Ballenger Hwy in Flint, an alternative high school jointly run by the 7th Circuit Family Court and Peckham. GCJJC houses youth (male & female) ages 10-18 who are ordered into secure detention by the courts and who are awaiting trial or placement in a residential setting. Offenses for which the youth are detained range from misdemeanors to murder. The vast majority of the youth live within the most impoverished areas of the city of Flint. A significant majority of the youth come from single parent homes that have incomes below the poverty level. Statistics for the latest fiscal year indicate that minority youth, in particular Black youth, are disproportionately impacted by the justice system in Genesee County. For example, while "minority" youth comprised only 33% of the county population of that age group, they accounted for 60% of the youth who were detained. Flint youth have had to contend with the chaos generated by the city's water crisis, the effects of which have compounded the hardships already experienced by their families and neighbors. The effects of the COVID-19 pandemic have only exacerbated already existing problems as it further disrupted education and completely eradicated in person extra curricular and enrichment activities for several years. The absence of in-person schooling and risk prevention programming has caused many of these youth to become further marginalized, come into contact with the law and become locked-up at GCIJC. The majority of justice-impacted youth have struggled in traditional educational settings; many function well below their grade level and recently more

Motherly Intercession's mission is to empower children and foster a stronger community by preventing the cycle of intergenerational incarceration. their Reading and Counting to Success Plus (RACS+) program has three components: RACS+ Atierschool Tutorial, RACS+ Summer Day Camp, and N-Touch Ready 4 Real Life. With this grant opportunity they are looking to enhance their RACS+ programming to include Art workshops in partnership with Ms. Sharlene Howe of Youth Arts Unlocked and Robotics in partnership with Ketering University. This past summer Motherly Intercession had an opportunity to partner with Youth Art Unlocked and their students participated in a 4 week program to teach them about the different art techniques and experience working in art mediums. During this period, their students were able to express themselves in a way that provides a different form of healing from the barriers and stigma of being a child of an incarcerated parent. Incorporating art into their program model will help their students to continue to express themselves positively and combat the previous risk factors listed for having a parent who is incarcerated. In December 2022, Dr. Petros Gheresus, Ph.D. from Ketering University's First Robotics Community Center hosted an introduction to robotics workshop for RACS+ Middle schoolers. Where students were able to build, program, and complete an obstacle course. They want to continue their partnership with the First Robotics Community Center by having their middle and high school students complete a 3 month workshop alternating between Motherly Intercession and Kettering University. Also Dr. Gheresus will train a member of their staff about robotics so they can start their own robotics program that competes. Atier the first year, their middle and high school age youth will mentor the elementary age students in their robotics workshop in year 2. For the 3 years, the elementary students will become the mentors for the kindergarten participants in their robotics.

According to the Center of Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), COVID-19 cases are an average of 2.3 times higher in People of Color compared to White, Non-Hispanic persons. People of Color includes Black, Non-Hispanic person, American Indian or Alaska Native, NonHispanic person, Hispanic or Latino persons, and Asian, Non-Hispanic persons. COVID-19 hospitalizations are an average of 3.9 times higher in People of Color, and Covid-19 deaths are an average of 1.5 times higher. For their RACS+ program year of 2021-2022, of the 26 students served 92% identified as African American and 8% identified as White/Caucasian. 96% of students were from the city of Flint City, 58% of students were from North Flint, and 4% reside outside of the city of Flint. According to their 2021 enrollment data, 89% of the families served income was below \$30,001.

#### RESOLUTION TO TRIO PAINT FOR GENERAL CONTRACTOR SERVICES- CHANGE ORDER #4

WHEREAS, The City of Flint Division of Purchases & Supplies solicited proposals for General Contractor services for FY23-FY25 on behalf of the Facilities Maintenance Division. Trio Paint was the sole qualified and awarded bidder for this 3-year contract.

WHEREAS, Trio Paint has completed various projects within city-owned facilities. The most recent change order for the contract was Change order #3 for additional Council Chamber improvements approved by City Council on August 28,2023 via the adoption of Resolution #230297.

WHEREAS, Facilities Maintenance is requesting an additional \$108,190.00 for quotes for additional work for the remainder of FY2024. These projects include but are not limited to City Hall lobby rehabilitation, Legal department renovations, asbestos remediation, celling tile replacements, painting and other services.

WHEREAS, Flint City Council adopted Resolution #220347 on August 22, 2022 allocating \$150,000.00 of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding towards each Brennan and Hasselbring Senior Centers. Trio has provided a quote for Brennan Center kitchen upgrades, handrail replacement and bathroom renovations totaling \$73,135.43 of ARPA funding. (Because this has been previously allocated, no additional ARPA-related allocation is needed.)

WHEREAS, Hasselbring Senior Center is requesting similar upgrades to be completed by Trio Paint using the quoted amount of \$70,479.90 of CS Mott grant funding and \$34,497.10 of ARPA funding to include bathroom renovations and kitchen upgrades and ballroom floor rehabilitation. (Because this has been previously allocated, no additional ARPA-related allocation is needed.) The overall total for Hasselbring Senior Center upgrades is not-to-exceed \$105,435.00.

City of Flint Clean & Safe Summer Program – is a program created by Mayor Sheldon Neeley for the purpose of controlling youth crime activities during the summer months of June – July 2025. This initiative is part of a larger crime fighting platform that is funded through the Department of Justice CVIPI grant in partnership with the City of Flint Police and Fire departments. CVIPI has funded several organizations that focus on crime reduction and gun violence including Peacekeepers, Mans Movement, WOW Outreach, and Hurley Trauma Recovery Center.

#### 2024 Recap: Building Skills Through Service

Latrese Brown Reported, throughout the summer, seven local organizations collaborated with the program, offering diverse job opportunities tailored to help youth gain practical experience while contributing positively to their community:

- Latinx Technology and Community Center Community clean-up projects
- North Flint Neighborhood Action Council Community clean-up projects
- Cathedral of Faith Childcare services
- Department of Public Works (DPW) Various city jobs
- McCree Theatre Plays and stagecraft
- Flint Community Water Laboratory Water testing and science projects
- Faith Foundation Various tasks and acted as the program's fiduciary

The program focused on professional development over profit, emphasizing the cultivation of essential skills like social interaction, interpersonal workplace communication, office culture, and community engagement. Youth participants earned \$11/hour while working 29 hours per week in a structured, supportive environment designed to promote learning and growth rather than

productivity alone. The program went so well that some organizations like McCree Theater and Flint NAC asked to have an additional week of participation.

The Department of Public Works utilized their youth in various ways to improve the viability of fire hydrogens in neighborhoods by painting them the different color codes while learning the importance of what each color fire hydrogen means to a community.

The McCree Theater gave youth an insight into theater and the various career opportunities that a field such as the Arts can offer. They participated in plays, costume design, and stage presence to get an idea of what it takes to produce community story telling.

Latinx provided cultural experiences that combined clean-up projects with diverse groups, discussion sessions, and neighborhood diversity.

NAC provided history with their cleanup projects around the significance of the SBEV building and original use and the street names and significance.

Flint Community Water Lab youth learned about science and career opportunities that it produces. They learned about water testing and the Flint Water Crisis, community support, and importance of clean air and water.

Faith Foundation placed their youth in various businesses to learn job skills, business etiquette, and a variety of employment types.

Cathedral of Faith taught the importance of Faith and confidence when navigating through life experiences through cleanup and mentorship.

The 2025 Second City of Flint Clean & Safe Summer Youth Job Training Program will provide summer jobs, business learning experiences, and a fantastic opportunity for flint youth to formulate career goals and to build a brighter future for our youth. The program will serve youth ages 15-19 in efforts to make use of idle time and keep them safe from crime. The program will offer 6-weeks of summer employment, paid through the ARPA Youth Job Training category, for 5-7 non-profit organizations to serve as host sites for 10 youth participants. Each organization will be awarded up to a maximum of \$30,000 for administrative reporting, materials, swag, and program costs. The youth participants will be paid \$11.00 per hour for 29 hours each week beginning June 20, 2025 and ending on July 18, 2025.

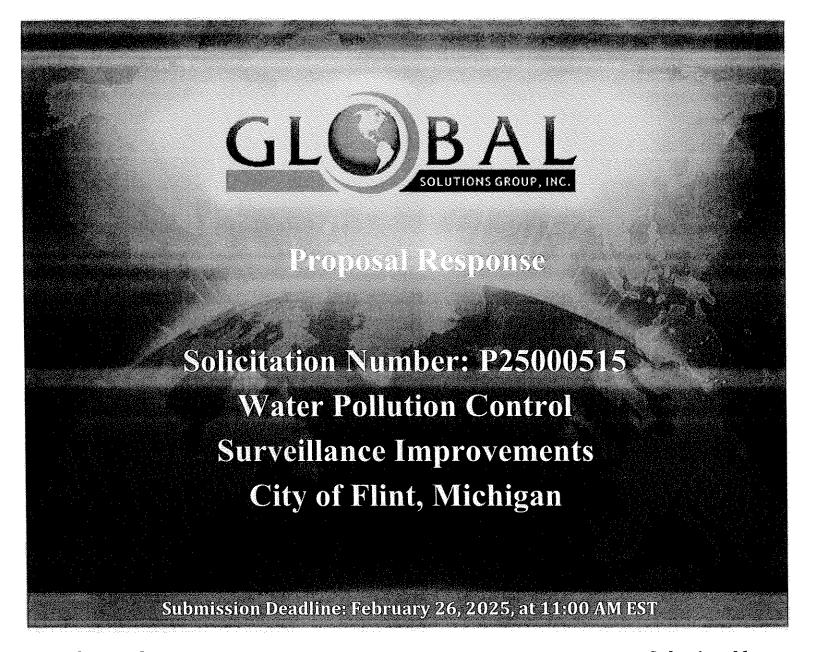

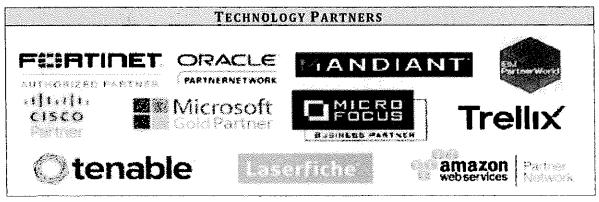

#### 2.1 **Relevant Experience**

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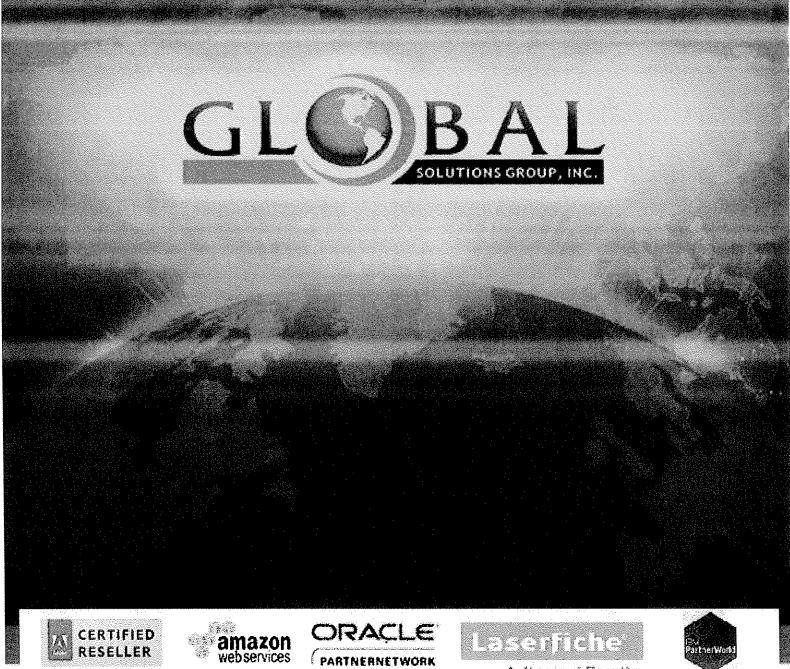

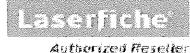
