**BY THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR:**

**Whereas**, in 2022 and 2023, the City of Flint received funds pursuant to the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA), which could be used by the City for specific and defined purposes. In 2023, the City of Flint obligated all of the ARPA funding received, of which approximately \$40 million was obligated as "revenue replacement" on December 20, 2023; and

**Whereas**, Flint Freedom Schools Collaborative seeks funding for "Experiential Learning" project; and

**Whereas**, The goal of this project is to engage K-12 grade scholars in a multicultural Integrated Reading Curriculum that supports them and their families through five essential components: High-quality academic enrichment; Parent and family development; Civic engagement and social action; Intergenerational servant leadership development; and Nutrition, health, and mental health; and

**Whereas**, Flint Freedom Schools Collaborative serves a diverse population of youth with most being minorities (89% of youth participants are African American), and/or face increased economic and social barriers; and

**Whereas**, City Administration recommends reallocating \$40,000 in ARPA funds, originally intended for revenue replacement to Flint Freedom Schools Collaborative; and

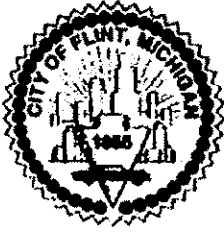

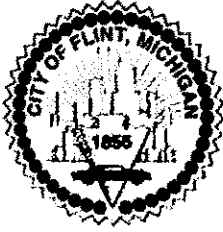

**AMENDED RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PAYMENT TO REHMANN ROBSON, LLC  
FOR ADDITIONAL OUTSTANDING CHARGES FOR AUDITING SERVICES  
FOR THE CITY OF FLINT'S FY2023 AUDIT**

**BY THE FLINT CITY COUNCIL:**

On May 22, 2023, the Flint City Council adopted Resolution No. 230150 to enter into an agreement with Rehmann Robson, LLC for Auditing Services for the City of Flint's FY2022/2023 Audit, for a total contract amount of \$259,000.00, plus out-of-pocket expenses not-to-exceed \$10,000.00; and

On August 12, 2024, the Flint City Council adopted Resolution No. 240349.1, which authorized payment to Rehmann Robson, LLC for outstanding charges for auditing services for the City of Flint's FY2023 Audit, in the amount of \$38,5000, for a total revised contract amount of \$297,500.00; and

Rehmann Robson, LLC has presented the City of Flint with an additional invoices for professional services rendered for the FY2023 Audit, in the form of a Change Order Billing, in the amount of \$75,000.00, due to "significant delays due to errors in the City's initial accounting record and reconciliations" (with approximately 820 additional auditing hours being expended by Rehmann in order to address these issues), as well as a Final Progress Billing on the City's June 30, 2023 year end audit, in the amount of \$29,000.00; and

All additional fees have been mutually agreed upon by the City and Rehmann in the original agreement.

**IT IS RESOLVED**, that the appropriate City Officials are authorized to do all things necessary to make payment to Rehmann Robson, LLC for additional outstanding charges for auditing services rendered for the City of Flint's FY2022-2023 Audit, in the amount of \$104,000.00, for a revised total contract amount of \$401,500.00. CHANGE ORDER BILLING: 164,000.00

During the 2023 audit, we encountered significant delays due to errors in the City's initial accounting records and reconciliations. Historically, the audit has required an average of 1,280 hours to complete. However, for the 2023 audit, we expended over 2,100 hours addressing these issues. The additional fee has been calculated based on the excess hours at a blended rate of \$200 per hour. As we value our relationship with the City, we have applied a 25% discount to this fee.

- Less previously approved change order for audit delays 38,850.00-
- Less previously approved change order for Single Audit 8,500.00-

We believe it is our responsibility to exceed the City's expectations. This Change Order is being prepared because performance by us of the above project and/or additional service efforts were not anticipated in our original agreement dated August 2, 2023. The fees for the above project have been mutually agreed upon by the City and Rehmann.
