### Section I: BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ACTION:

AAU TRAVEL BASKETBALL FUNDING PROPOSAL FLINT AFFILIATION Is a Flint based AAU Basketball  $\prime$ mentoring program. Founded over three decades ago (1992) by the Director of FA David Munerlyn, Flint Affiliation (FA) is still a staple in the Flint community. Since the Induction FA has been positively affecting the lives of youth in the City of Flint and Genesee County through AAU basketball. . According to the U.S. Census, 29% of youth are living in single parent households. Staffed with 21 coaches, mentors and trainers, their team will guide their youth and help them navigate school, sports and life. Typically their youth stay with their coaches and teammates as they grow in age and grade level, allowing coaches to be life coaches and mentors also creating friendships, experiences and bonds with their peers. Sports play a vital role in character development. Sports teaches and develops strategic thinking, analytical thinking, leadership skills, goal setting and risk taking. (htp://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov >pmc) According to stateofflintkids.com 29.8% of youth live below the poverty level in the city. Understanding that all youth basketball players will not make it to the NBA, they know that traveling to different states and cities will allow their youth to see new places, different cultures and qualities of life in a positive environment. According to contemporarypediatrics.com youth that are exposed to a positive experience in childhood have 72% lower odds of having depression or poor mental health as an adult. According to stacknj.com the benefits for youth playing sports is learning teamwork, discipline, work ethic, camaraderie and cardiovascular health. Their youth travel out of the city and state every weekend during the 6 month period of March to August. Approving this funding for Flint Affiliation will provide a way for FA to continue its well recognized work in the Flint community. With their coaches and mentors they have, can and will continue to change lives. The goal of affiliation is to provide a safe space for young men to learn life skills responsibility discipline accountability

### Section I: BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ACTION:

Motherly Intercession's mission is to empower children and foster a stronger community by preventing the cycle of intergenerational incarceration, their Reading and Counting to Success Plus (RACS+) program has three components: RACS+ Atierschool Tutorial, RACS+ Summer Day Camp, and N-Touch Ready 4 Real Life. With this grant opportunity they are looking to enhance their RACS+ programming to include Art workshops in partnership with Ms. Sharlene Howe of Youth Arts Unlocked and Robotics in partnership with Ketering University. This past summer Motherly Intercession had an opportunity to partner with Youth Art Unlocked and their students participated in a 4 week program to teach them about the different art techniques and experience working in art mediums. During this period, their students were able to express themselves in a way that provides a different form of healing from the barriers and stigma of being a child of an incarcerated parent. Incorporating art into their program model will help their students to continue to express themselves positively and combat the previous risk factors listed for having a parent who is incarcerated. In December 2022, Dr. Petros Gheresus, Ph.D. from Ketering University's First Robotics Community Center hosted an introduction to robotics workshop for RACS+ Middle schoolers. Where students were able to build, program, and complete an obstacle course. They want to continue their partnership with the First Robotics Community Center by having their middle and high school students complete a 3 month workshop alternating between Motherly Intercession and Kettering University. Also Dr. Gheresus will train a member of their staff about robotics so they can start their own robotics program that competes. Atier the first year, their middle and high school age youth will mentor the elementary age students in their robotics workshop in year 2. For the 3 years, the elementary students will become the mentors for the kindergarten participants in their robotics.

POSSIBLE BENEFIT TO THE CITY OF FLINT (RESIDENT'S AND/OR CITY OPERATIONS) INCLUDE PARTNERSHIPS AND COLLABORATIONS:

According to the Center of Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), COVID-19 cases are an average of 2.3 times higher in People of Color compared to White, Non-Hispanic persons. People of Color includes Black, Non-Hispanic person, American Indian or Alaska Native, NonHispanic person, Hispanic or Latino persons, and Asian, Non-Hispanic persons. COVID-19 hospitalizations are an average of 3.9 times higher in People of Color, and Covid-19 deaths are an average of 1.5 times higher. For their RACS+ program year of 2021-2022, of the 26 students served 92% identified as African American and 8% identified as White/Caucasian. 96% of students were from the city of Flint City, 58% of students were from North Flint, and 4% reside outside of the city of Flint. According to their 2021 enrollment data, 89% of the families served income was below \$30,001.

This fiscal year, there have been more heating issues, due to aging boilers and other unexpected issues. In January, there was a water main break at City Hall that cost over \$30,000 to fix.

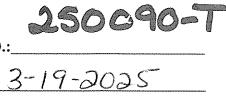

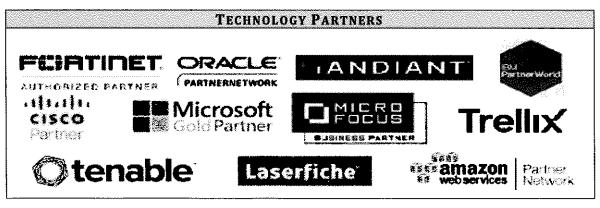

# 2.1 Relevant Experience

GSG has extensive experience in providing security cameras and has fulfilled multiple contracts for clients, including the following:

#### SUBURBAN MOBILITY AUTHORITY FOR REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION

GSG team implemented Video Surveillance Camera system for LETC Headquarter, and two remote Bus stop locations. Project consisted of thirty-two CCTV System for HQ and sixteen for each remote location. 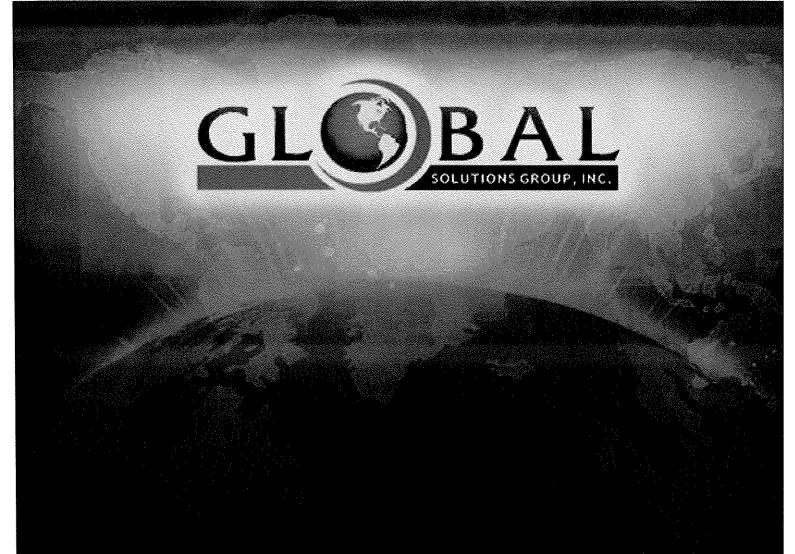
