250082-T Reallocation of ARPA Funds/Flint Freedom Schools Collaborative

Resolution resolving that the appropriate City Officials are authorized to do all things necessary, including executing any necessary agreements, to appropriate funding from the funding source account #101-612.008-801.000 to Flint Freedom Schools Collaborative in the amount of \$40,000.00. [NOTE: The goal of this project is to engage K-12 grade scholars in a multicultural Integrated Reading Curriculum that supports them and their families through five essential components: High-quality academic enrichment; Parent and family development; Civic engagement and social action; Intergenerational servant leadership development; and Nutrition; health, and mental health.]

250111.1-T Amended/Rehmann Robson, LLC/Additional Outstanding Charges/City of Flint's FY2023 Audit

Resolution resolving that the appropriate City Officials are authorized to do all things necessary to make payment to Rehmann Robson, LLC for additional outstanding charges for auditing services rendered for the City of Flint's FY2022-2023 Audit, in the amount of \$104,000.00, for a revised total contract amount of \$401,500.00. Funds will come from the General Fund Balance Line Item. [NOTE: Rehmann Robson, LLC has presented the City of Flint with an additional invoice for professional services rendered for the FY2023 Audit, due to "significant delays due to errors in the City's initial accounting record and reconciliations", with approximately 820 additional auditing hours being expended by Rehmann in order to address these issues.] [NOTE: this resolution was amended to reflect a Final Progress Billing on the City's June 30, 2023 year end audit, in the amount of \$29,000.00.]

250118-T Charitable Gaming License/Uncle Phil's Adventures in Philanthropy

Resolution resolving that Uncle Phil's Adventures in Philanthropy is recognized as a non-profit organization operating in the city of Flint for the purpose of obtaining charitable gaming licenses, as issued by the State of Michigan, Bureau of State Lottery, Charitable Gaming Division, relative to conducting charity and fundraising events, as allowed by Act 382 of Public Acts of 1972, as amended.
