REQUEST FOR AGENDA CHANGES/ADDITIONS

PUBLIC COMMENT

Members of the public who wish to address the City Council or its committees must register before the meeting begins. A box will be placed at the entrance to the Council Chambers for collection of registrations. No additional speakers or slips will be accepted after the meeting begins.

Members of the public shall have no more than three (3) minutes per speaker during public comment, with only one speaking opportunity per speaker.

COUNCIL RESPONSE

Councilmembers may respond once to all public speakers only after all public speakers have spoken. An individual Councilmember's response shall be limited to two (2) minutes.

CONSENT AGENDA

Per the amended Rules Governing Meetings of the Flint City Council (as adopted by the City Council on Monday, April 22, 2024), the Chair may request the adoption of a "Consent Agenda". After a motion to adopt a Consent Agenda is made and seconded, the Chair shall ask for separations. Any agenda item on a Consent Agenda shall be separated at the request of any Councilmember. After any separations, there is no debate on approving the Consent Agenda – it shall be voted on or adopted without objection.

RESOLUTION MARKING THE 5^{TH} SOMBER ANNIVERSARY OF GEORGE FLOYD'S DEATH BY RENEWING SUPPORT FOR ADOPTING NATIONAL POLICE REFORMS

WHEREAS, in May 2020, the world watched in horrific disbelief the senseless murder of George Floyd by Minnesota police officers; and

WHEREAS, the video that captured Mr. Floyd's brutal death led to global protests and an outcry for law enforcement reform; and

WHEREAS, the United States House of Representatives introduced the "George Floyd Justice in Policing Act of 2021" ("George Floyd Act") which would mandate more oversight of police officers, create transparency and require accountability related to law enforcement practices; and

WHEREAS, under the "George Floyd Act," law enforcement agencies would be required to abide by federal rules such as reporting the use of excessive force, establishing duty requirements for officers to intervene when excessive force is used, banning no-knock warrants and chokeholds, and mandating training on racial profiling and implicit bias; and

WHEREAS, the Flint Police Department ("FPD") has already adopted many of these practices and orders all police officers to attend racial sensitivity classes; and

WHEREAS, since Mr. Floyd's death, the nonprofit group "Mapping Police Violence" has documented 1,226 victims of police killings in 2024; and

WHEREAS, despite this appalling statistic, little progress has been made to pass the George Floyd Act or other federal measures; and

WHEREAS, as 2025 marks the five-year somber anniversary of Mr. Floyd's death, the Flint City Council is calling for Congress to recognize the importance of adopting federal legislation such as the George Floyd Act to require uniform policing guidelines to prevent avoidable deaths and to hold law enforcement accountable if they commit unlawful acts.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Flint City Council endorses passing federal legislation such as the "George Floyd Justice in Policing Act of 2021" to deter the use of excessive force, prevent racial profiling and mandate national reporting of police misconduct.

RESOLUTION URGING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A SPECIAL POLICE UNIT DEDICATED TO ENFORCING LOITERNG AND OTHER NUISANCE ORDINANCES

WHEREAS, Flint citizens have expressed increasing concern about large groups congregating before and after community events following the senseless shooting death of 18-year-old Jayla Keel, an innocent victim, during the annual 810 day; and

WHEREAS, residents have also voiced their fear about patronizing local businesses where crowds of people loiter in parking lots during and after the businesses have closed; and

WHEREAS, the City of Flint has local ordinances that prohibit these unlawful behaviors; and

WHEREAS, the residential and business communities want enforcement of loitering and nuisance ordinances as well as zoning code restrictions to prevent violence and foster safer neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, the Flint City Council is calling for the Flint Police Department ("FPD") to create a special unit dedicated to ticketing violators of loitering and nuisance ordinances, and to provide crowd control officers when necessary for community gatherings; and

WHEREAS, this special unit shall be organized within thirty (30) days.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Flint City Council is petitioning the Flint Police Department to do all things necessary to establish a special law enforcement unit dedicated to enforcing local ordinances that prohibit loitering, nuisances and zoning violations within the City of Flint.
