# REQUEST FOR AGENDA CHANGES/ADDITIONS

#### **PUBLIC COMMENT**

Members of the public who wish to address the City Council or its committees must register before the meeting begins. A box will be placed at the entrance to the Council Chambers for collection of registrations. No additional speakers or slips will be accepted after the meeting begins.

Members of the public shall have no more than three (3) minutes per speaker during public comment, with only one speaking opportunity per speaker.

#### **COUNCIL RESPONSE**

Councilmembers may respond once to all public speakers only after all public speakers have spoken. An individual Councilmember's response shall be limited to two (2) minutes.

#### **CONSENT AGENDA**

Per the amended Rules Governing Meetings of the Flint City Council (as adopted by the City Council on Monday, April 22, 2024), the Chair may request the adoption of a "Consent Agenda". After a motion to adopt a Consent Agenda is made and seconded, the Chair shall ask for separations. Any agenda item on a Consent Agenda shall be separated at the request of any Councilmember. After any separations, there is no debate on approving the Consent Agenda – it shall be voted on or adopted without objection.

# RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING NOVEMBER 2025 AS FAMILY COURT AWARENESS MONTH (FCAM)

#### BY THE CITY COUNCIL:

WHEREAS, the mission of Family Court Awareness Month (FCAM) is to highlight the need to prioritize child safety in family court, as 1 in 3 families in Michigan are exposed to domestic abuse; and

WHEREAS, an estimated 58,000 children in the U.S. are ordered into unsupervised contact with abusive parents each year, resulting in almost 1000 children in the United States murdered during visitation with an abusive parent since 2008. In Michigan, 39 children have been murdered by a parent since 2008 during divorce or custody disputes, including 6-year-old Rowan Morey-Pols of Caledonia, Michigan in 2024 and 3-year-old Dylan Thebo of Kent County in 2021; and

WHEREAS, Rowan's and Dylan's families have been working to increase awareness of child safety issues by promoting Family Court Awareness Month and have been honoring their children's legacy by introducing legislation to improve the safety of missing children in Michigan and helping improve Kent County's response to domestic violence; and

WHEREAS, Rowan's Act was introduced in the Michigan House of Representatives this year by Angela Rigas who represents portions of Allegan, Kent, and Barry counties. This amendment would allow a faster response for Amber Alerts to be issued if Police believe a missing child to be in danger; and

WHEREAS, Kent County, Michigan recognized the need for a specialized Domestic Violence Court, following six domestic violence-related homicides within three months in 2021. This court, staffed by individuals knowledgeable about the intricacies of domestic violence, aims to support victims and families, hold offenders accountable, and prevent further homicides; and

WHEREAS, Washtenaw County hopes to improve safety and outcomes for families exposed to domestic violence by having law enforcement change the way it responds to domestic violence calls by using 'Lethality Assessments' in all domestic violence cases; and

WHEREAS, the mission of Family Court Awareness Month (FCAM) is to promote judicial education that would include training on domestic violence, child abuse, childhood

trauma, coercive control, and post-separation abuse for all professionals involved in family court cases; and

WHEREAS, Family Court Awareness Month recognizes the need to incorporate evidence-based research into the court's decisions. This includes the Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) Study. This research highlights long term effects of exposure to abuse in childhood and emphasizes the need for research-informed and impartial decision-making to protect children's well-being; and

WHEREAS, Family Court Awareness Month aims to encourage collaboration among legislators, advocates, professionals, and the community to improve family court practices, ensuring they are guided by evidence-based research and prioritize the safety and best interests of children.

**IT IS RESOLVED**, that the Flint City Council declares the month of November 2025 as Family Court Awareness Month in the city of Flint, Michigan.

Resolution Approving Issuance of Public Notice Requesting Public Comments or Objections to Proposed Modifications to City of Flint's Sewer Use Ordinance for the Industrial Pretreatment Program

The City of Flint (the "City") has submitted proposed modifications to the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy ("EGLE") regarding the City's Sewer Use Ordinance and its previously approved and currently implemented Industrial Pretreatment Program found in the City's Code of Ordinances at Chapter 46, Utilities.

EGLE has reviewed the City's request and determined that it is a substantial program modification as defined in Section 403.18, Modification of Publicly Owned Treatment Works Pretreatment Programs, of Title 40, Protection of Environment, of the Code of Federal Regulations, and Rule 9 of the Part 23 Rules, Mich Admin Code R 323.2309, et seq.

Because it is a substantial program modification, the City of Flint, in conjunction with EGLE, must issue a joint public notice, and related publication, in accordance with Rule 8 of the Part 23, Pretreatment, administrative rules promulgated pursuant to Part 31, Water Resources Protection, of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended, Mich Admin Code, R 323.2308, et seq. (Part 23 Rules). The joint public notice requests from the public comments or objections to the proposed modifications within 30 days from the date of the notice.

Substantive changes are being proposed to Sections 46-149 (Sampling, Analyses and Test), 46-150 (Reporting and Notices), and Table 46-146(c) (Pollutant Concentration Limits) (adding Pollutant Concentration Limits for Total Hexane-Extractable Material and PFOS), along with related definitions and ancillary provisions.

The Flint City Council is required to approve the issuance by the City of the public notice and related publication.
