Executive Summary

INTRODUCTION

The City of Flint Community and Economic Development Department is responsible for the preparation of the Consolidated Plan and Annual Action Plan and administers the funding for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program, HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME) Program, and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Programs. This is the second reporting year for the 2023/2024 – 2025/2026 Consolidated Plan that covers the 2024/2025 Program Year.

The Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER) details the City of Flint, Michigan's accomplishments during the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program Year (PY) 2024/2025 toward meeting the goals outlined in the City of Flint 2023/2024 – 2025/2026 Three-Year Consolidated Plan. The Program Year 2024/2025 Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER) describes Flint's program accomplishments for the period beginning July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025.

This report compares the actual performance measures with those projected in the 2024/2025 Annual Action Plan. The CAPER reports on activities funded by the Federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program, HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME) Program, and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Program as well as highlighting a range of locally funded programs.

For the 2024/2025 Program Year, Flint was allocated \$3,686,126 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds (as noted in line 02 of PR-26 Financial Summary Report), \$662,337.65 in HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME) funds, and \$353,277 in Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funds through a formula allocation from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). No additional program income or prior year funding were made available, as identified in the Annual Action Plan.

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic the City received a supplemental allocation of ESG and CDBG funds as authorized by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES), Public Law 116-136, known as CDBG-CV in the total amount of \$2,830,392 and ESG-CV in the amount of \$2,441,943. Since receiving this allocation, Flint has administered a number of activities that include Brennan Elm Park Senior Center rehabilitation, youth services and workforce development, Food Bank of Eastern Michigan mobile distribution, Hasselbring Community Center Improvements, and the establishment of a community-owned grocery store in an identified food desert within the City.

Detailed tables outlining the activities that were completed during the 2024/2025 CDBG Program Year are located throughout this CAPER report.

CR-05 Goals and Outcomes

PROGRESS THE JURISDICTION HAS MADE IN CARRYING OUT ITS STRATEGIC PLAN AND ITS ACTION PLAN. 91.520(A)

During the grant application cycle for the 2024/2025 Annual Action Plan, Flint gave preference to those complete funding applications for projects related to priority needs that were ranked as high, based upon the priority needs established in the 2023/2024 – 2025/2026 Consolidated Plan, and particularly to those that addressed the goals and statutory requirements identified in the Consolidated Plan. In the development of the use of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES), known as CDBG-CV and ESG-CV, grant funds consideration and prioritization were given to the needs of low and moderate-income persons and the development of partnerships with the private nonprofit sector.

As identified in this report, Flint addressed the housing, health, welfare, and homeless needs of our community during the 2024/2025 Program Year. The City is working diligently to meet the priority needs established in our Consolidated Plan in the expenditure of these federal funds. In addition, the City also seeks to meet other issues identified by involving our citizens in a variety of methods. Due to the lingering impacts of COVID-19, in-person and virtual public meetings were conducted within the County during the year to receive public input. Citizens may also seek information, ask questions, or contact City staff through an established website and e-mail account.

Flint is confident that its federally funded programs help address the priorities of the Consolidated Plan and the Annual Action Plan and meet the needs of low and moderate-income persons within the city.

ASSESS HOW THE JURISDICTION'S USE OF FUNDS, PARTICULARLY CDBG, ADDRESSES THE PRIORITIES AND SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES IDENTIFIED IN THE PLAN, GIVING SPECIAL ATTENTION TO THE HIGHEST PRIORITY ACTIVITIES IDENTIFIED.

During this program year, year two of the Three-Year Consolidated Plan, Flint worked to use its CDBG funds to undertake a variety of programs, projects and activities designed to address housing and community development needs throughout the City. High priority initiatives include affordable housing development, housing rehabilitation/emergency repair, public services such as workforce development and youth services, economic development and blight elimination, and community improvements through infrastructure projects and renovation of community services buildings. The accomplishments of the City were consistent with the Consolidated Plan’s high-priority community development, housing, social services, and homeless objectives, and are presented in this report within this program year.

In addition to 2024 program year activities, the following activities were undertaken from previous year funding:

2021 Asbury CDC - Sizzling Culture/Community Kitchen - Asbury Community Development Corporation used CDBG funding to conduct youth-led food workshops which included training related to cooking skills, cutlery skills and sanitation. Funds allowed for monthly sizzlers (food that makes hissing sounds from frying pans and/or skillets), and luncheons demonstrated and conducted by Flint youth. This program assisted 8 youth. \$25,000 drawn in 2024 program year.

2021 Legal Services of Eastern Michigan - Fair Housing Center - Legal Services of Eastern Michigan continues to complete fair housing tests within the City of Flint. To date, 65 beneficiaries have been assisted. \$1,219.78 were drawn in 2024 program year.

2019 CV-CDBG - 21-087 Asbury CDC - Sizzling Culture! Youth Services - Asbury conducted a variety of programs aimed at supporting Flint youth as they navigate changing economic environments as a result of COVID. To date, 8 beneficiaries have been assisted. \$9,606 was drawn in 2024 program year.

2019 CV-CDBG - 21-081 Food Bank of Eastern Michigan - Hunger Relief via Mobile Distribution - The Food Bank of Eastern Michigan provides mobile distributions throughout Census Tract locations in the City of Flint. The food available at every distribution include a mix of fresh produce, 2% milk, shelf table and protein product, with a total of over 100,000 pounds of food being distributed to individuals throughout the City of Flint. There were no obstacles involved during our processes of distributing food throughout the City of Flint. \$360,146 was drawn in 2024 program year.

2021 Blight Elimination - The Demolition Program benefits the community by improving sustainability of neighborhoods for low to moderate income persons living in the City of Flint. This program will complement other funding from State of Michigan, and the Genesee County Land Bank. 21 demolitions in progress. \$260,508 was drawn in 2024 program year.

2021 Housing Rehab & Construction/Emergency Repair - Completed 4 projects within 2024 program year.

2021 Housing Counseling/Financial Literacy - Provided homeownership counseling to 154 Low/Mod individuals in the city of Flint.

2022 Big Brothers Big Sisters has served 73 Flint youth, ages 6-18 in youth development activities and one-to-one mentoring relationships with CDBG funding. Youth served have developed healthy relationships resulting in increasing protective factors while minimizing risk factors. Matches have met for a minimum of four hours each month for a minimum of 12 months. Case management staff have provided monthly contacts supporting relationship development and opportunities for match activities. \$38,713 was drawn in 2024 program year.

2022 Asbury Community Development Corporation - Community Kitchen - Asbury CDC staff supervise, monitor, and engage with youth in weekly activities such as luncheons, harvesting & cultivating farm, preparation and distribution of meal kits, and sanitation. Youth are supervised in planning, coordinating, and executing events related to workshops and culinary classes. To date, 41 beneficiaries have been assisted. \$26,453 was drawn in 2024 program year.

2022 Tapology - Flintstone Movers - Tapology's outreach director continued working with the Flint S.T.O.N.E. Movers and administrating the program for all outreach program locations.

Students continued to learn fundamental and basic dance level techniques. To date, 10 beneficiaries have been assisted. \$401 was drawn in 2024 program year.

2022 Best Practices, MicroEnterprise Assistance – This activity provides financial aid of virtually any kind to an existing microenterprise or to assist in the establishment of a microenterprise. To date, 5 businesses have been assisted. \$32,813 was drawn in 2024 program year.

2023 YWCA Safe Center - The YWCA Sexual Assault Forensic Exam (SAFE) Center offered free 24-hour access to specially trained nurses called Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners (SANE), who provided comprehensive health care to adult and child survivors of sexual assault. YWCA also provided Victim Advocates which were dispatched 24 hours a day to address non-medical survivors often face after an assault. The program has assisted 67 individuals.

2023 CHEA - Post-Incarcerated Adult Education - This activity will utilize CDBG funding to provide adult literacy and financial literacy classes, in addition to supportive services for returning home citizens. This program has assisted 26 individuals. \$31,133 was drawn in 2024 program year.

2023 Blight Elimination - The Demolition Program benefits the community by improving sustainability of neighborhoods for low to moderate income persons living in the City of Flint. This program will complement other funding from State of Michigan, and the Genesee County Land Bank. \$57,203 was drawn in 2024 program year.

2023 St. Luke New Life Center – Roof - The St. Luke N.E.W. Life Center has provided basic needs support, workforce development, Adult Literacy and other essential services to residents of North Flint. Work was completed without interruption to services. This project has assisted 5,907 individuals. \$25,600 was drawn in 2024 program year.

2023 Neighborhood Engagement Hub - Neighborhood Engagement Hub provided a Community Toolshed program to fill gaps in public service capacity, provide community-based knowledge, and access to equipment regarding maintenance of vacant and blighted lots in Flint Communities. \$75,000 was drawn in 2024 program year.

2023 Big Brothers Big Sisters Community Mentoring - Big Brothers Big Sisters served 113 Flint youth, ages 6-18, in youth development activities and one-to-one mentoring relationships using CDBG funding. Youth served have developed healthier relationships resulting in increasing protective factors while minimizing risk factors. Matches have met for a minimum of four hours each month for a minimum of 12 months. Case management staff provided monthly contacts supporting relationship development and opportunities for match activities. \$50,530 was drawn in 2024 program year.

2023 YWCA Safe Center - CDBG-funded services assisted 39 individuals within program year 2024. Program is ongoing, and will conclude in program year 2025. \$8,333 was drawn in 2024 program year

2023 Best Practices Consulting - Flint Small Business Initiative- \$60,000 was drawn in 2024 program year.

2023 City of Flint Public Health - Healthy Homes Save Lives - Assisted residents with signing up for services for home repair and to prevent eviction and utility shut-off. Provided residents with resources to apply for Food Assistance and Healthcare coverage. Assisted residents who were homeless or facing homelessness with finding shelter. Attended Continuum of Care meeting and other community meetings to seek resources to share and aid in assisting people. Met with departments to assist with developing resources for residential home repair. Attended training to enhance knowledge and skills for working with the public. \$29,988.20 was drawn in 2024 program year and there were 42 beneficiaries.

Clark Commons Phase 3 - Clark Commons III is new construction of affordable housing consisting of 98 multi-family units across 23 buildings. This project was funded with HOME funds and completed in 2024.

All local jurisdictions that receive CDBG, HOME, and ESG funding must maintain data on the extent to which each racial and ethnic group have applied for, participated in, or benefited from any program or activity funded with federal funds. Flint was able to collect this data by having all participants and sub-recipients report on income and racial/ethnic status. This tracking allows Flint to collect racial and ethnic information, household size and annual household income.

NARRATIVE

During the 2024/2025 Program Year, Flint assisted 6,743 individuals through multiple programs. Please see the above table for a breakdown by race and ethnicity. Additionally, there were 64 Hispanic-identifying people served.

CR-15 Resources and Investments

IDENTIFY THE RESOURCES MADE AVAILABLE.

Information in **Table 4** provides a detailed breakdown of resources that were made available through the CDBG, HOME, ESG but does not account for unspent prior year funds or outstanding project balances. In program year 2024/2025 Flint had \$3,686,126 available in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) resources, \$662,337.65 in HOME funds, and \$353,277 in ESG funds to award to sub-recipients carrying out the goals outlined in the City’s Consolidated Plan. No program income and carry-over funding from prior years was made available for the CDBG or HOME programs.

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic the County received a supplemental allocation of ESG and CDBG funds as authorized by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES), Public Law 116-136, known as CDBG-CV and ESG-CV. Those funds are not accounted for here.

Expenditures for the 2024/2025 program year:

- The CDBG program expended a total of \$3,022,133.23 during this program year, which included current-year program funds and prior year funds.
- The HOME program expended a total of \$2,381,744.00 during this program year, which included current-year program funds and prior year funds.
- The ESG program expended a total of \$208,978.78 during this program year, which included current-year program funds and prior year funds. The City also matched \$208,978.78 to support these services.

IDENTIFY THE GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION AND LOCATION OF INVESTMENTS.

Leveraging

The CDBG program does not require matching funds, but CDBG funds are leveraged by many other resources within the community. Many of these funding sources provided leverage from private and public sources for the CDBG projects undertaken in PY 2024/2025. Sub-recipients that received CDBG funding also received funding from federal, state, local, and other resources. The CDBG-CV and the ESG-CV programs also do not require match.

ESG funds were leveraged, in part, by selecting a sub-recipient that has established homeless services and has strong connections with various funding sources. ESG sub-recipients are required to match ESG funding with other cash and/or in-kind dollar-for-dollar match. ESG sub-recipients used other private or public grants not used previously to match another grant, the value of any donated materials or volunteer service time, the value of any leases on buildings, salaries paid to staff, and additional costs to carry out programs not paid for with ESG funding. The City match \$208,978 in ESG funds for 2024.

CR-20 Affordable Housing

During the 2024/2025 Program Year, Flint allocated funding for public service activities for low/moderate income benefit, rental unit construction, and HOME Activities. These projects would support rehabilitation of existing rental housing units and more. However, many of these projects were not started or completed this year, as the City is working to spend down on projects with outstanding prior year resources. Using prior year resources, the City completed 4 total homeowner-occupied rehabilitations and emergency repairs and constructed 98 affordable rental units through completion of Clark Commons.

DISCUSS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN GOALS AND OUTCOMES AND PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED IN MEETING THESE GOALS.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic nearly all Homeowner and Renter Rehabilitation and Replacement activities halted. Many of the residents did not want contractors in their home during this time; this trend has continued into the following years. Additionally, the City is still working to spend prior year resources.

DISCUSS HOW THESE OUTCOMES WILL IMPACT FUTURE ANNUAL ACTION PLANS.

The 2024 Program Year outcomes will have a significant impact on future annual action plans and the overall goals outlined in future Consolidated Plans. Due to COVID-19 homeowners are reluctant to have anyone in their home and this is expected to continue in the near future. Additionally, home sales prices have significantly increased in the last year impacting the ability for potential homeowners to qualify for a first mortgage. Flint has increased the eligible purchase price and the down payment assistance available for a household as a result. The City will continue to monitor the impact of the sales prices on the program in the future. The City will continue to focus on bringing more affordable housing to Flint through other incentives.

No homeowner or rental housing rehabilitation projects were completed with 2024/2025 CDBG or HOME funding.

CR-25 Homeless and Other Special Needs

EVALUATE THE JURISDICTION'S PROGRESS IN MEETING ITS SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES FOR REDUCING AND ENDING HOMELESSNESS THROUGH: REACHING OUT TO HOMELESS PERSONS (ESPECIALLY UNSHELTERED PERSONS) AND ASSESSING THEIR INDIVIDUAL NEEDS

In August of 2018, The Flint/Genesee Continuum of Care (CoC) updated its 10-Year Plan to End Homelessness. Though the CoC is a county-wide collaborative, Metro Community Development is the lead agency. The Genesee Homeless Awareness Task Force is responsible for collecting homeless data, conducting homeless needs assessments, Point in Time Counts, and developing community supported homeless strategies to end homelessness in the Flint/Genesee County area.

The Continuum of Care has several committees that work together on projects designed to end homelessness in Flint/Genesee County. In addition to the Genesee County Homeless Awareness Task Force, there is the Committee Concerned with Housing as well as the Project Homeless Connect Planning Committee. The City has used funds to support and expand the supply of affordable housing options to assist low-income households retain their homes and provide emergency, transitional and permanent supportive housing units for homeless and/or at-risk individuals, families, veterans, children and youth.

ADDRESSING THE EMERGENCY SHELTER AND TRANSITIONAL HOUSING NEEDS OF HOMELESS PERSONS

The Flint/Genesee Continuum of Care (CoC) is the primary method for addressing emergency shelter and transitional needs of homeless individuals and families in the City of Flint. The CoC is a collaborative effort designed to identify existing resources in the community, eliminate duplication, develop seamless housing/homeless related services, insure leveraging of mainstream and private sector resources, and maximize community partnerships.

The 10-year plan referenced above defines the scope of the problem using national and local data and research based upon how people are impacted, systemic contributions to homelessness, infrastructure issues, historical response, and lack of coordination and resources. The approach is threefold: to promote community change related to the consciousness and perception of homelessness; to provide safe, secure, accessible and affordable housing to all persons in Genesee County regardless of age, race, gender, sexual preference, disability, or familial status; and to organize a comprehensive and interconnected network of advocacy, no wrong door, and wrap around services aimed at eliminated the

cycle of homelessness. In recent years, the CoC has also adopted a coordinated entry process to further eliminate duplication of services.

HELPING LOW-INCOME INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES AVOID BECOMING HOMELESS, ESPECIALLY EXTREMELY LOW-INCOME INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES AND THOSE WHO ARE: LIKELY TO BECOME HOMELESS AFTER BEING DISCHARGED FROM PUBLICLY FUNDED INSTITUTIONS AND SYSTEMS OF CARE (SUCH AS HEALTH CARE FACILITIES, MENTAL HEALTH FACILITIES, FOSTER CARE AND OTHER YOUTH FACILITIES, AND CORRECTIONS PROGRAMS AND INSTITUTIONS); AND, RECEIVING ASSISTANCE FROM PUBLIC OR PRIVATE AGENCIES THAT ADDRESS HOUSING, HEALTH, SOCIAL SERVICES, EMPLOYMENT, EDUCATION, OR YOUTH NEEDS.

Earning a living wage is instrumental in preventing homelessness. This coupled with a lack of affordable permanent housing and discrimination in rent and lending practices puts the minority population in a particularly precarious situation with regard to the threat of becoming homeless.

For extremely low-income renters with children, supportive services such as quality affordable housing, funds for rent/utility arrearages, life skills, employment training and placement services, childcare, and transportation are critical to their ability to stay in permanent housing and to avoid becoming homeless. The City of Flint will support the CoC in homeless prevention through Asset Building. The CoC aims to empower and encourage families to acquire and preserve assets, including a safe, decent, and affordable home, and achieve long-term financial success.

This will be done through three specific goals:

- Educate families about housing choices.
- Empower families to access their housing choices.
- Preserve and expand quality, affordable housing opportunities.

The City of Flint is working cooperatively with area homeless services providers to address needs and take necessary actions to assist homeless persons and families. The CoC provide both transitional and permanent supportive housing services to homeless and at-risk persons and families as they work towards independent living. Three sources of Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing funds granted to the City of Flint, Genesee County, and MSHDA assist individuals and families who are at-risk of becoming homeless. In addition, several agencies in the City of Flint, working through the Continuum

of Care were awarded Shelter Plus Care funds and Supportive Housing Program funds for activities to assist the homeless population in Flint and Genesee County.

HELPING HOMELESS PERSONS (ESPECIALLY CHRONICALLY HOMELESS INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES, FAMILIES WITH CHILDREN, VETERANS AND THEIR FAMILIES, AND UNACCOMPANIED YOUTH) MAKE THE TRANSITION TO PERMANENT HOUSING AND INDEPENDENT LIVING, INCLUDING SHORTENING THE PERIOD OF TIME THAT INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES EXPERIENCE HOMELESSNESS, FACILITATING ACCESS FOR HOMELESS INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING UNITS, AND PREVENTING INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES WHO WERE RECENTLY HOMELESS FROM BECOMING HOMELESS AGAIN

The goal of ending chronic homelessness has been approached through the dual strategy of affordable housing and supportive services. The Flint/Genesee County Continuum of Care has several sources of permanent housing placement for the homeless in the Flint/Genesee County area. Permanent Housing for homeless persons or families is long-term and safe, decent, and affordable. It is generally community based, private market housing designed to enable the homeless person or family to live as independently as possible in a permanent setting.

However, it may include projects specifically developed for homeless individuals and families. This includes housing units available to the broader community and may or may not be subsidized. Such housing may be combined with the provision of supportive services provided by the organization managing the housing or coordinated by the applicant and provided by other public or private service agencies.

When services are combined with housing, the project is referred to as permanent supportive housing, which is generally provided to homeless persons with disabilities, primarily serving individuals and members of their household who have serious mental illnesses, chronic substance abuse problems, physical disabilities, or AIDS and related diseases. Supportive services are provided on site or coordinated through partnering agencies. Rental subsidies are encouraged but not always available. Rent is generally based on a percentage of the household income. Permanent supportive housing enables special needs populations to live as independently as possible in a permanent setting and can be

provided in multi-family structures or scattered site apartments. When possible, the City of Flint continued to support organizations that provide permanent housing to homeless persons and families.

CR-30 Public Housing

ACTIONS TAKEN TO ADDRESS THE NEEDS OF PUBLIC HOUSING.

The mission of the FHC is to provide the Flint community with quality, affordable housing that is decent, well maintained, and free from drugs and violent crime. The mission is supported by key objectives that include: building livable communities composed of a diverse range of incomes; creating an environment that will nurture and support strong parental roles that demonstrate increased self-sufficiency and lead to economic gains for families. Through the Choice Neighborhoods (CN) Implementation program, the City has been partnering with the Flint Housing Commission (FHC) in developing and implementing phase I of the CN program. This action supports the residents of the Flint Housing Commission Atherton East development in meeting the objectives identified above. As the process continues to move forward, the City will work in partnership with Atherton East staff, residents, and the developer (Norstar Development, USA) on Phase I of this project. Construction began in August of 2019, and Phase II of the project broke ground in early 2022.

ACTIONS TAKEN TO ENCOURAGE PUBLIC HOUSING RESIDENTS TO BECOME MORE INVOLVED IN MANAGEMENT AND PARTICIPATE IN HOMEOWNERSHIP.

As a part of the Choice Neighborhoods Implementation process, an informed draft relocation plan was established with the direct involvement of the 100 residents and families residing in Atherton East. As the project moves forward, community outreach and consultations with residents continues to be a core component of this effort.

ACTIONS TAKEN TO PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO TROUBLED PHAS.

The most recent assessment of the Flint Housing Commission (2016) resulted in an upgraded status through the HUD Public Housing Assessment System. FHC's status changed from "troubled" to "substandard management", which means it received a failing score in its management assessment but, overall, a passing score. The City continues its support of the Flint Housing Commission, particularly through the Choice Neighborhoods Program. With Atherton East receiving one of the lowest inspection scores of the Flint Housing Properties, the relocation of residents to the newly constructed development should only help to improve the status of the FHC. When opportunities become available to coordinate resources, enhance neighborhood safety, and provide technical assistance to the FHC, the City is willing to partner with this community resource.

CR-35 Other Actions

ACTIONS TAKEN TO REMOVE OR AMELIORATE THE NEGATIVE EFFECTS OF PUBLIC POLICIES THAT SERVE AS BARRIERS TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING SUCH AS LAND USE CONTROLS, TAX POLICIES AFFECTING LAND, ZONING ORDINANCES, BUILDING CODES, FEES AND CHARGES, GROWTH LIMITATIONS, AND POLICIES AFFECTING THE RETURN ON RESIDENTIAL INVESTMENT.

In 2018 the City of Flint's Community and Economic Development division created and adopted a housing investment strategy meant to guide the investment of the City of Flint's limited funds for housing (from HOME and CDBG) to incentivize projects that would leverage other similar investments both by nonprofit and for-profit developers. This housing investment strategy encompasses many of the goals listed in the Housing and Neighborhoods Implementation Matrix located within the City of Flint Master Plan, and within priorities outlined in the Consolidated Plan. It primarily focuses on allocating federal resources for affordable housing development, but also incorporates strategies and programs that support residents remaining in their homes, as well as assisting low-and-moderate income households achieve homeownership through the establishment of an affordable housing revolving loan fund that can be used for acquisition and renovation financing. These strategies, along with other City initiatives, will help to eliminate barriers to affordable housing.

ACTIONS TAKEN TO ADDRESS OBSTACLES TO MEETING UNDERSERVED NEEDS.

Priorities for funding in the Consolidated Plan were determined by many sources of public input. One of the primary sources was the Imagine Flint Master Plan which convened over 5,000 people over a period of two years and culminated in the development of a comprehensive place-based plan addressing far more than land use.

The City continues to seek additional funding to address the significant gap in available resources. In 2018, the City of Flint was awarded a \$30 million grant from HUD in order to address substandard housing at one of Flint's largest public housing complexes. The creation of these new affordable housing units, along with being better situated near community resources, will help address the needs of this underserved population.

It continues to be critical for the City of Flint to receive additional financial support to mitigate the impact of the Flint Water Crisis. Funds are still needed to not only replace damaged public and private

infrastructure, but also to assist Flint youth who may experience developmental impacts due to lead exposure.

The identified obstacles to meeting underserved needs are lack of resources and lack of affordable poverty level rental units for families. These continue to be obstacles and the City of Flint is committed to finding the means to overcome these obstacles. In addition to seeking methods to address these obstacles, the City of Flint is reviewing needs and potential obstacles to identify additional issues and concerns.

ACTIONS TAKEN TO REDUCE LEAD-BASED PAINT HAZARDS.

The City of Flint ensures that all its federally funded housing programs are in full compliance with the lead-based paint hazard regulations (24 CFR Part 35). This includes directing low- and moderate-income households to the appropriate resources for lead paint inspection, testing, and abatement of lead-based hazards; primarily, this has been the State of Michigan HHS Lead Free Home Program. Entitlement funding continues to be used to provide lead abatement and mitigation services to help eliminate and prevent exposure to lead hazards.

ACTIONS TAKEN TO REDUCE THE NUMBER OF POVERTY-LEVEL FAMILIES.

Most CDBG program funds address the economic needs of low- and moderate-income persons. Many of those programs also address issues such as self-sufficiency, life skill development, and other similar programs that indirectly reduce the number of persons living below the poverty level.

The City of Flint acknowledges the need to address poverty throughout the community. The City strives to reduce the number of families that are below the poverty line, and continues to utilize the following strategies to reduce the number of poverty level families:

- Provide financial support to organizations offering necessary services, such as food, senior services, and counseling programs for extremely low-income persons.
- Continue to provide assistance to extremely low-income households in the improvement of their residences through the City's CDBG-funded Housing Rehabilitation.
- Provide homeownership programs to support homeownership and the accumulation of equity.
- Lead-based paint abatement to address child lead poisoning, which can affect future employment and earning capabilities.

- Fund infrastructure improvements (street, water main, sidewalk, etc.) to enhance neighborhoods and increase property values, while raising the pride of the residents as well as encouraging the introduction of economic development into distressed and impoverished areas.
- Provide financial support to organizations, which provide referrals to special needs persons, such as the Community Action Agency.
- Continue to work with the State of Michigan in the replacement of lead water leads that have caused a higher level of lead within drinking water.
- Economic development programs aimed at developing job training and employability skills.
- Support youth and childcare programs, which provide mentoring and role models for children, and additionally helps parents secure and keep employment.

ACTIONS TAKEN TO DEVELOP INSTITUTIONAL STRUCTURE.

The City of Flint’s institutional structure includes private firms, nonprofit agencies, and local and state agencies. The lead agency is the City of Flint Planning and Development Department – Division of Community and Economic Development (DCED). DCED, acting as the lead agency, met with various City departments and outside agencies to gain input on the annual needs, enhance coordination of services, prevent duplication of service, and resolve issues within the interagency institutional structure.

These divisions and departments carry out objectives related to housing and community development. Additionally, there are multiple nonprofit organizations that provide a range of public services including programs to reduce homelessness and for non-homeless special needs populations. The Flint/Genesee County Continuum of Care (CoC) is a federally mandated body of homelessness service providers. The CoC works in partnership with the Michigan State Housing Development Authority (MSHDA) and the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) towards the common goal of ending homelessness in the United States within 10 years. Each year the Flint/Genesee County CoC applies for funding to support local efforts to prevent and end homelessness.

The Flint Housing Commission, the local Public Housing Authority, will continue to provide assistance to renter households through its public housing and Section 8 programs. Additionally, the Housing Commission provides necessary support services to renters including elderly renters, when available. The Michigan State Housing Development Agency (MSHDA) provides an important support vehicle through both funding and direct technical assistance. Genesee County government is another important partner. The County provides a number of services through the Genesee County Metropolitan Planning

Commission, Genesee County Land Bank, Genesee County Department of Human Services, Genesee County Community Mental Health Department, and Genesee County Youth Corporation.

ACTIONS TAKEN TO ENHANCE COORDINATION BETWEEN PUBLIC AND PRIVATE HOUSING AND SOCIAL SERVICE AGENCIES.

The City of Flint works with many agencies to enhance coordination including local, state, and federal stakeholders. A primary example is the City’s collaboration with the Flint Housing Commission in winning a HUD Implementation Grant for the Choice Neighborhoods program.

The City of Flint has many initiatives underway to continue the positive momentum gained with the adoption of the long overdue Imagine Flint Master Plan. Over the course of the next year, the Department will continue to work with our residents, as well as other local, state, and federal partners to maximize efforts towards inclusion, equity, justice, and transparency. Below is a list of current partners: State of Michigan; Michigan State Housing Development Authority (MSHDA); Economic Development Corporation (EDC); City of Flint Departments and agencies; HUD Field Office, Detroit, Michigan; Flint Housing Commission; Genesee County; Metropolitan Planning Commission; Land Bank; Department of Human Services; Community Mental Health Department; Continuum of Care; Hurley Medical Center; Flint Area Association of Realtors; Genesee Landlords Association; Private developers, builders, appraisers and other real-estate professionals; Non-Profit Institutions; Legal Services of Eastern Michigan; Disability Network; University of Michigan-Flint; Mott Community College; Metro Community Development; Shelter of Flint; Flint River Corridor Alliance; YWCA of Greater Flint; Uptown Reinvestment Corporation; Community Foundation of Greater Flint; United Way; Career Alliance, Inc.; Valley Area Agency on Aging My Brother’s Keeper; REACH; Ennis Center; Genesee County Habitat for Humanity; Court Street Village Housing Corporation; C. S. Mott Foundation; and, Ruth Mott Foundation.

IDENTIFY ACTIONS TAKEN TO OVERCOME THE EFFECTS OF ANY IMPEDIMENTS IDENTIFIED IN THE JURISDICTIONS ANALYSIS OF IMPEDIMENTS TO FAIR HOUSING CHOICE.

Genesee County still one of the most segregated areas in the country, and the most segregated in Michigan. In addition, segregation based upon disability is emerging as a fairness issue as well. In the previous program year, the City awarded funding to Legal Services of Eastern Michigan to provide housing discrimination testing services to residents in the City. The City also awarded funding to LSEM for its education advocacy program, which focuses on youth with disabilities which in some cases are

tied to the Flint Water Crisis. In 2021, the City partnered with both the County and the Flint Housing Commission on a regional Assessment of Fair Housing (AFH) to raise awareness of fair housing rights and illegal discrimination and increase low-income residents' access to safe decent and stable housing.

The City of Flint adopted a fair chance housing ordinance, which prohibits landlords from asking about or considering applicants' conviction history during rental screening (with limited exceptions). This is intended to reduce discrimination against people with criminal records and help justice-involved individuals access stable housing.

The City continues to support the Legal Services of Eastern Michigan - Fair Housing Enforcement Initiative which screens low/mod households for potential Fair Housing Act violations. LSEM will also completes community legal education presentations and conduct fair housing testing and enforcement activities as needed.

CR-40 Monitoring

City staff are responsible for monitoring Federal requirements including Davis-Bacon, Contract Work Hours, Section 3, Minority Business Enterprise, etc. on an ongoing basis. In addition, programmatic and fiscal requirements are monitored and reviewed by staff. Staff monitors all internal expenditures/programs and subrecipient organizations. Compliance is documented through reimbursement requests, informal communication, formal communication, monthly progress reports, quarterly demographic reports, and on-site or virtual formal monitoring visits. Written agreements are prepared and executed for all HUD-funded activities.

Through the development of the CAPER and Annual Action Plan, City of Flint staff can evaluate its progress in meeting the goals and strategies of the Consolidated Plan on an annual basis.

The City of Flint has adopted policies and procedures in HOME, CDBG and ESG, through the ESG Primer, to address programmatic specifications. In addition to providing agencies with Standard Operating Procedures, Policies and Procedures, and detailed subrecipient agreements, the City of Flint will also

continue to provide on-going technical assistance to agencies. CED staff monitors compliance by way of desk monitoring on a monthly basis, or with on-site monitoring, whichever is deemed necessary based on agency capacity and risk assessment. The City requires subrecipients to solicit bids in a newspaper of general circulation. The notification itself encourages minority and women owned businesses to apply. The State of Michigan Disadvantaged Business Enterprise list is used as a reference in identifying businesses that may meet the requirements of MBE/WBE in the bid or quote solicitation process.

DESCRIPTION OF THE EFFORTS TO PROVIDE CITIZENS WITH REASONABLE NOTICE AND AN OPPORTUNITY TO COMMENT ON PERFORMANCE REPORTS.

The City publicly advertised that the CAPER was available for review and comment on February 14, 2026, in the Flint Journal. The draft report was placed at the City of Flint Department of Community and Economic Development, City of Flint Office of the City Clerk, Genesee County Metropolitan Planning Commission, Flint Housing Commission, and the main branch of the Flint Public Library. It was also made available on the City of Flint website for 15 days (February 14, 2026 – March 1, 2026). One public hearing was conducted on February 19, 2026 to discuss the performance report and open the agenda item for any additional public comment.

The City remains committed to leveraging its grant dollars in strategic areas to continue to assist in the recovery of the City of Flint. In an effort to meet commitment, expenditure, and timeliness deadlines, the City will also prioritize shovel ready projects and activities that are in the implementation phase. This focus will continue to be on mixed income housing, economic development activities and public services that address the needs of our population as Flint continues to recover both from the water crisis and the economic crisis that preceded it. There is no program income for Section 108 loan activities during this program year.

DOES THIS JURISDICTION HAVE ANY OPEN BROWNFIELDS ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE(BEDI) GRANTS?

The BEDI, in the amount of \$780,000 is being used as a debt service reserve for the Riviera Section 108

project, which was the construction of a neighborhood office building. The building is currently leased by the Social Security Administration to provide services to one of Flint's low-income communities.

Flint provided its Building and Safety Inspection Division the listing of properties requiring inspections. Inspections were conducted and completed in April 2024. It is unknown what date inspections were completed during the 2024 Program Year; however, it is expected that Flint will be compliant.

- Shelter of Flint: 1700 Delaware, 1706 Delaware, 2601 Burns- There have been no inspections or income data received on these properties since 2015. Shelter of Flint staff is wanting out of the rental property business and has requested to sell properties to another non-profit. The affordability period for the Shelter of Flint homes expired and the homes were then sold/gifted to the tenants. They will no longer be tracked by the City going forward.
- Metawaneenee Hills: 1546 Garland, 1521 Garland, 1501 MLK, and 109 Wood. No inspections data available.
- 603 W Court: 603 W Court West and 603 W Court East. Inspections completed on 4/17/2024 and 4/30/2024, respectively.
- Coolidge Park Apartments: 3701 Van Buren, Units 2303, 2402, 1103, and 1201. Inspections completed on 4/18/2024.
- Flint Marketplace: 310 E Third, Units 211 and 311. No inspections data available.
- Berridge Place, LLC: 421 Garland, Apts. 102, 106, 201, 202, 203, 205, 302, 303, 304, 305- Inspected on 3/4/2020 by the Building Safety Inspections division.
- Genesee County Land Bank: 616 W University and 618 W University- Property was fully compliant in 2016. Staff are working with new staffing at the Land Bank to get property inspected and income reported to the City.
- Swayze Court Apartments- 313 W Court (several units). No inspections data available.

- Avon Park: 1210 Lapeer Road- Property inspected and complied on 6/28/2019.
- Shiloh Commons: 3209 Buick Street (several units). Property inspected and complied 4/18/2024. The affordability period for Shiloh Commons has expired and those units are no longer tracked by the City beginning with this CAPER.
- Sylvan Court: 315 Sylvan Court, units A, B, D, E. Inspections completed 4/18/2024.

Clark Commons housing development has been completed. Initial unit inspections were received by the City and will be reported in the 2025 CAPER and each of the next 20 years until the end of the affordability period.

The City is now using NSPIRE property standards for the inspection of HOME-assisted units.



There are four ESG performance standards the City of Flint will focus on, they are as follows: At least 80% of people exiting ESG funded emergency shelter will exit to a known destination, At least 50% of people exiting ESG funded emergency shelter will do so to a "positive" housing, At least 10% of adults exiting ESG funded emergency shelter will have increased their income, No more than 20% of those receiving ESG Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing funds will return to homelessness within 12mos of program exit.

Based on the information from the Action Plan response previously provided to HUD:

1. Briefly describe how you met the performance standards identified in A-90 this program year. *If they are not measurable as written type in N/A as the answer.*

In 2024 the City of Flint used Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funds to assist homeless individuals within the City of Flint borders, partnering with shelters and other organizations within the Continuum of Care (CoC) to put an end to homelessness. Based on performance measures, individuals who meet HUD's homeless definition and exited shelter to a known destination was 100.00%, an increase from 2023. The average length of stay in emergency shelters of chronically homeless individuals was 43.75 days, which decreased from 2023. Most individuals did not stay the HUD approved 90 days within the shelters. In April 2016, MDHHS, MSHDA and MCAH issued an important update to the SPDAT which outlines the VI-SPDAT and SPDAT requirements. For the past two years, SPDAT has brought Michigan closer to its goal of redesigning systems by providing every community with a standardized evidence-based tool to support coordinated entry, while taking Housing First practices to scale statewide. Since the implementation of the VI-SPDAT, the Alliance has reported that the tool helps them gauge the progression of client self-sufficiency as it relates to housing. Because the full VI-SPDAT is used during every follow-up meeting completed with active ESG clients assisted, it is instrumental in practicing progressive engagement with clients to ensure not only that basic needs are being fulfilled, but that linkage to other resources is also being made. Of the 100.00% that exited shelters to a known destination, approximately 72% went into a permanent housing situation, an increase from 2023. Those able to exit to positive housing was 66.5%, an increase from 2023. Adults exiting with cash income was 41.75%, an increase from 2023 and those employed at exit was 13.18%, an increase from 2023. A small percentage of 6.63%, a decrease from 2023, of adults were able to increase income during program enrollment. The average length of time to move into housing was 39.25%, an increase from 2023. With all these accomplishments the CoC and other agencies have made during the year, we are pleased to say the recidivism to shelter was 3.82%, a decrease from 2023 by 15.3%. These numbers have definitely improved and continue to move in the right direction.

The City's contracts with organizations include performance benchmarks that identify when services will be provided, where they will be provided and how many individuals/families will be assisted. These are broken down into quarterly measurements. Contract performance is assessed monthly during desk monitoring to determine if the agency is performing satisfactorily towards meeting their performance benchmarks. Staff provide ongoing technical assistance to agencies to help them meet these goals.


