PUBLIC COMMENT

Members of the public who wish to address the City Council or its committees must register before the meeting begins. A box will be placed at the entrance to the Council Chambers for collection of registrations. No additional speakers or slips will be accepted after the meeting begins.

Members of the public shall have no more than three (3) minutes per speaker during public comment, with only one speaking opportunity per speaker.

COUNCIL RESPONSE

Councilmembers may respond once to all public speakers only after all public speakers have spoken. An individual Councilmember's response shall be limited to two (2) minutes.

CONSENT AGENDA

Per the amended Rules Governing Meetings of the Flint City Council (as adopted by the City Council on Monday, April 22, 2024), the Chair may request the adoption of a "Consent Agenda". After a motion to adopt a Consent Agenda is made and seconded, the Chair shall ask for separations. Any agenda item on a Consent Agenda shall be separated at the request of any Councilmember. After any separations, there is no debate on approving the Consent Agenda – it shall be voted on or adopted without objection.

ORDINANCE NO. _____

An Ordinance to amend the Flint City Code of Ordinances by amending Chapter 18 (Taxation; Funds; Purchasing), Article IV (Purchasing), Section 18-21.4(9) (Competitive Sealed Proposals – Approval Thresholds).

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF FLINT:

Sec. 1. That An Ordinance to amend the Flint City Code of Ordinances by amending Chapter 18 (Taxation; Funds; Purchasing), Article IV (Purchasing), §18-21.4 (Competitive Sealed Proposals – Approval Thresholds), be adopted as follows:

§18-21.4 COMPETITIVE SEALED PROPOSALS

(9) APPROVAL THRESHOLDS. ~~The Purchasing Director, in consultation with the department head, shall evaluate the proposals and recommend award of the contract under this section. If the recommended award is for less than \$20,000, the decision of the Purchasing Director shall be final. If the recommended award is in excess of \$20,000, it shall also be approved by the Finance Director; if in excess of \$30,000, it shall also be approved by the City Administrator; and, if in excess of \$50,000, it shall also be approved by the Mayor. Any recommended award in excess of \$75,000 shall also be approved by the City Council.~~ ALL SUPPLIES AND CONTRACTUAL SERVICES IN EXCESS OF \$10,000.00, EXCEPT AS PROVIDED OTHERWISE HEREIN, SHALL NOT BE MADE BY ANY DEPARTMENT HEAD, THE PURCHASING DIRECTOR/MANAGER, THE FINANCE DIRECTOR (CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER), THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR, OR THE MAYOR EXCEPT UPON APPROVAL OF THE CITY COUNCIL.
