The City approved entering into a contract with FNIPP in Resolution# 070463.1 to complete rental rehabilitation activity and amended the agreement on June 30, 2009 to extend the timeframe.

An audit conducted by the Office of Inspector General on the city's HOME program revealed that the contract lacked acceptable Affordability, address and project specific language.

In order for the housing development to be in compliance with HOME regulations, the City needs to revise the agreement to amend the Affordability, address and project specific language and include all relevant HOME regulations instituted since the execution of Subrecipient Agreement 07-077 dated July 10, 2007 and amended on July 30, 2009.

IT IS RESOLVED, that the Emergency Manager authorizes the appropriate City of Flint officials to do all things necessary to enter into Change Order Number Two to amend the Flint Neighborhood Improvement and Preservation Project, Inc. Subrecipient Agreement Number 07-077 dated July 10, 2007 and amended on July 30, 2009 to include Affordability language, the address 626 Begole Street, project specific information, and current HOME regulations.
